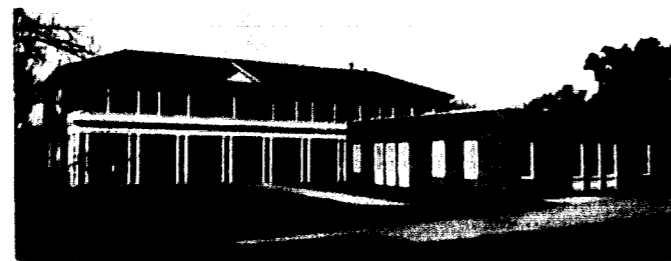
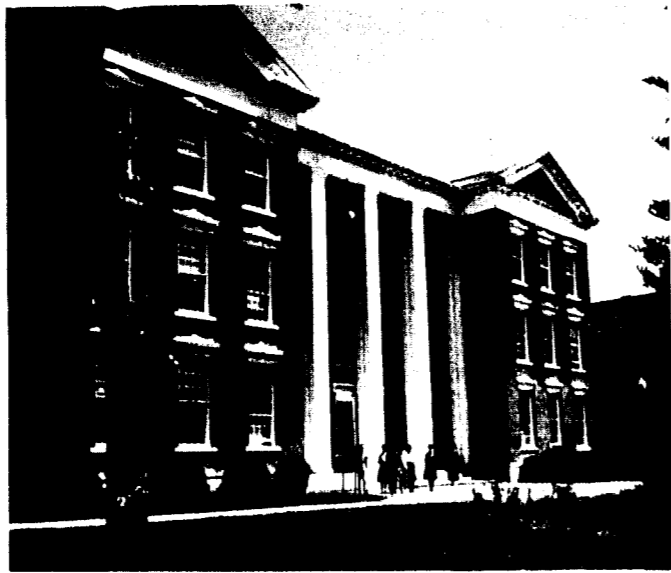

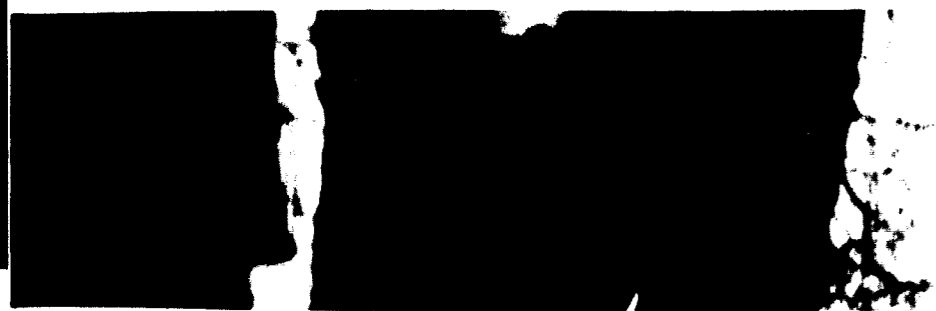
For a brief time these buildings were nothing more than impersonal structures to which we were being directed for one reason or another. They were part of the incomprehensible four-year whirlwind which had engulfed us. In spite of the initial confusion, these fleeting college years of our lives imbed unerasable impressions which are brought forth by the very mention of William Jewell College.

A passing glimpse of Jewell Hall brings to mind the religion pops at 7:45, writer's cramp from the hour-long lecture or the English theme, frustration from the first language lab when every sound was as meaningless as nonsense syllables, the abrupt ringing of that bell at the end of the hour when we were only half through the test, the third floor drinking fountain where couples met after their 1:15.

From the opening convocation to Commencement the chapel represented something more than a gathering place for 1,000 students. It was a sanctuary for Wednesday morning worship services, an auditorium for the inauguration of a new college president, a music hall for recitalists, a theatre for aspiring actors and actresses. Here many challenging ideas mingled with ours to be eventually assimilated or rejected.



After chapel time and at 2:10 the college union was buzzing with activity even more than usual. If we could afford a study break, or even if we couldn't, we pulled up a chair in the Cage, the center of student chatter, coffee drinking, and relaxation. The subject matter for conversation ranged from the last chemistry test to the coming football game. Our thoughts were occasionally interrupted by a resounding "Albert, main desk, please."



Between classes we could review in the library or prepare for music courses in the record listening room. We learned the secret of arriving a bit before chapel time on Monday, Tuesday, and Thursday to find an empty chair and to arrive promptly at 6:45 P.M. in the evening if we wanted a private table in the stacks. There were times when we felt like permanent residents here, especially when that paper or research project was due.





In the dorm if a coed didn't want to be the fourth in the bridge game, she could listen to stereo or FM, or get in on a discussion in the dorm, not to mention studying. Sometimes those long afternoon gatherings had some significant ideas for those participating, and those times we were forced to probe qualities about ourselves that puzzled us led to further self-understanding. The "bull sessions" in men's dorms and fraternity houses were enough to make a guy wake up to the fact that he shared his outlook with several others whom he had never met. Then there was learning to respect that "oddball's" right to an opinion, that long, slow, painful process that made men of "goof-offs." The exchange of ideas resulted in valuable friendships which had begun as passing acquaintances.



There are those aspects of life at WJC that illuminate our images time and again. When Jewellites gather spontaneously to send the Cards on to victory, or gather anywhere, there is communication through the campus lingo. Who could communicate without hearing or injecting "I'm hurtin'," "I can't believe it," or "That's cool." Even when dulled by time these expressions will have a special meaning.



When we think of William Jewell College, we think of people. Some are attractive beyond the ordinary; some are exceptionally athletic; some are brilliant; some are capable of generating warmth and enthusiasm. Each is vital to a student body.

Where there are people there are emotions, varying in kind, as the people themselves. A wisp of melody, a glimpse of held hands, distant laughter, a yearning for something without form or name—all these bring sudden loneliness, not explainable, not lasting. A moment later our perspective glows with the optimism of youth, the awareness of limitless horizons, the impulsive surge of motivation.

Interspersed among our moods and routines are occasions like academic processions, formal convocations, unforgettable classroom lectures. The observant interpret these significant times as pageantry or novelty; the perceptive, as encounter with dignity and true greatness. The vividness of these memories, the sharpness of the impression will remain in our minds.



The Jewell campus is no different from any other college in the world in a few respects. The first few days of registration and orientation are rigid tests of patience and stamina. Standing in line accounts for a large portion of a day's time, whether it be a line for car registration, paying fees, purchasing books, planning courses, or eating lunch. The first few days left us feeling like one in a crowd, an insignificant hunk of humanity, a patch of fog in the haziness of it all. Fortunately it didn't take long for the friendly atmosphere to lift the fog and transform the crowd into distinct personalities. From a jumbled maze evolved a somewhat understandable pattern stamped on the pages of experience.



All individuals could pool their enthusiasm and release that spirit backing the Cardinals in any sport. A tied score brought the crowd to its feet as school spirit exploded with all its might. Successful athletic teams heighten the peak of school spirit and student participation.



Long before snow flurries hit the windy hill, flurries of projects, campus events, and elections descended upon us. Every available wall, door, or column is converted to poster space in short time. In the midst of these surroundings a typical Jewell student can be spotted wandering through his daily routine wondering whether his goals will be reached and whether he is measuring up to his potential. On the quadrangle, in the dorm or house, in the classroom he knows that most of those daylight hours and very often the long night hours must be spent in solving equations, preparing speeches, memorizing dates, planning meetings, and in every way pushing toward that goal he may not have yet formulated. Gallons of coffee are consumed to offset the frantic frazzling of patience and energy as long-term projects near completion. Each setback is magnified as defeat momentarily in the mind of the conscientious scholar. This phase of college life is strenuous, challenging, serious, and ultimately most rewarding.

The habits formed here, the tastes cultivated, the aims established, and the attainments sought remain indelible impressions on our personalities.

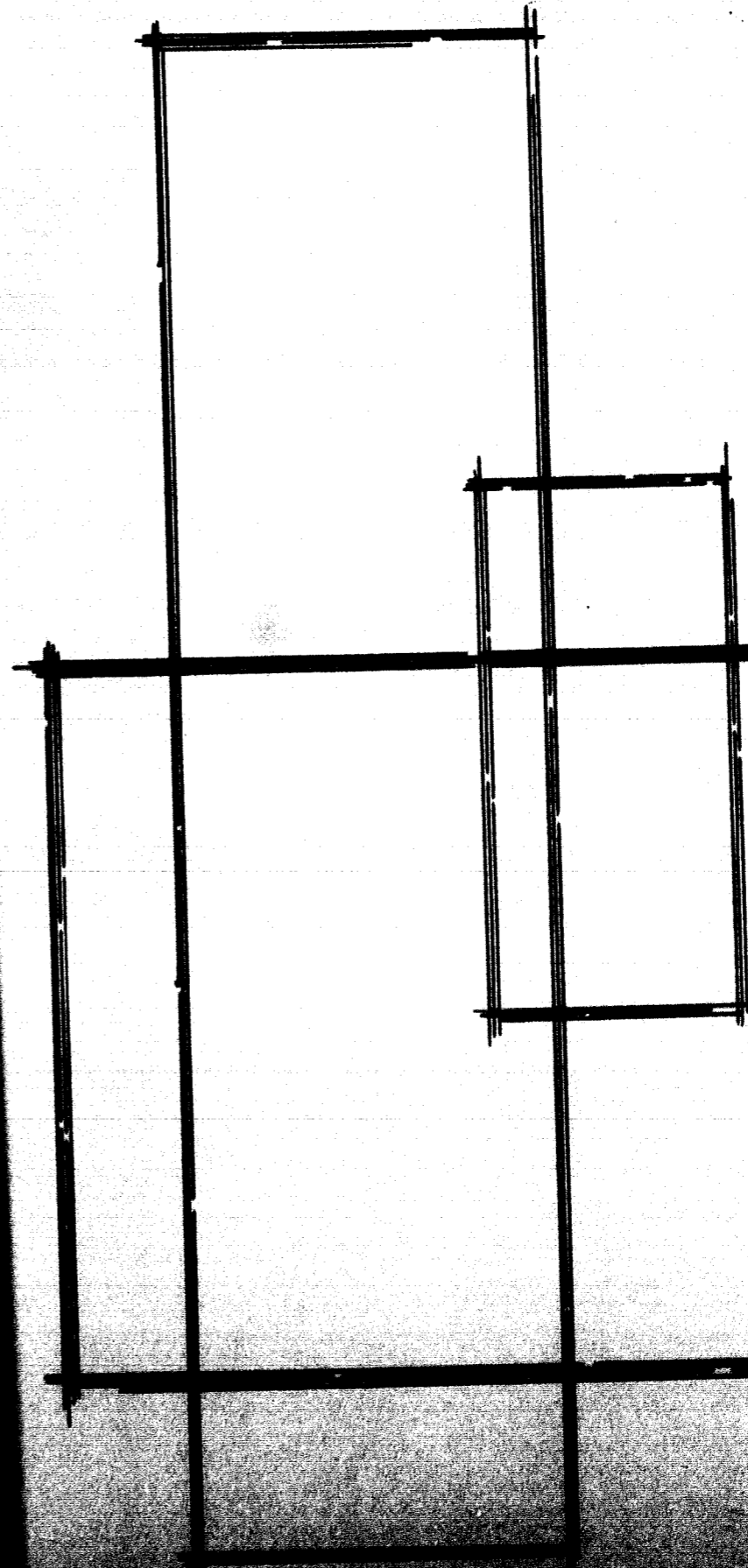

From our first glimpse of Jewell Hall to the hush of corridors in examination time, this campus was our home in a special way. We were a busy lot trying to fit homework, frat parties, conference games, labs and part-time jobs into a full-time life. But it can be done, for most of us did it. It was a happily hectic time.

These impressions were a part of the sights, chosen for memory's file by the crazy reasoning of the heart—impressions of 1962-63.

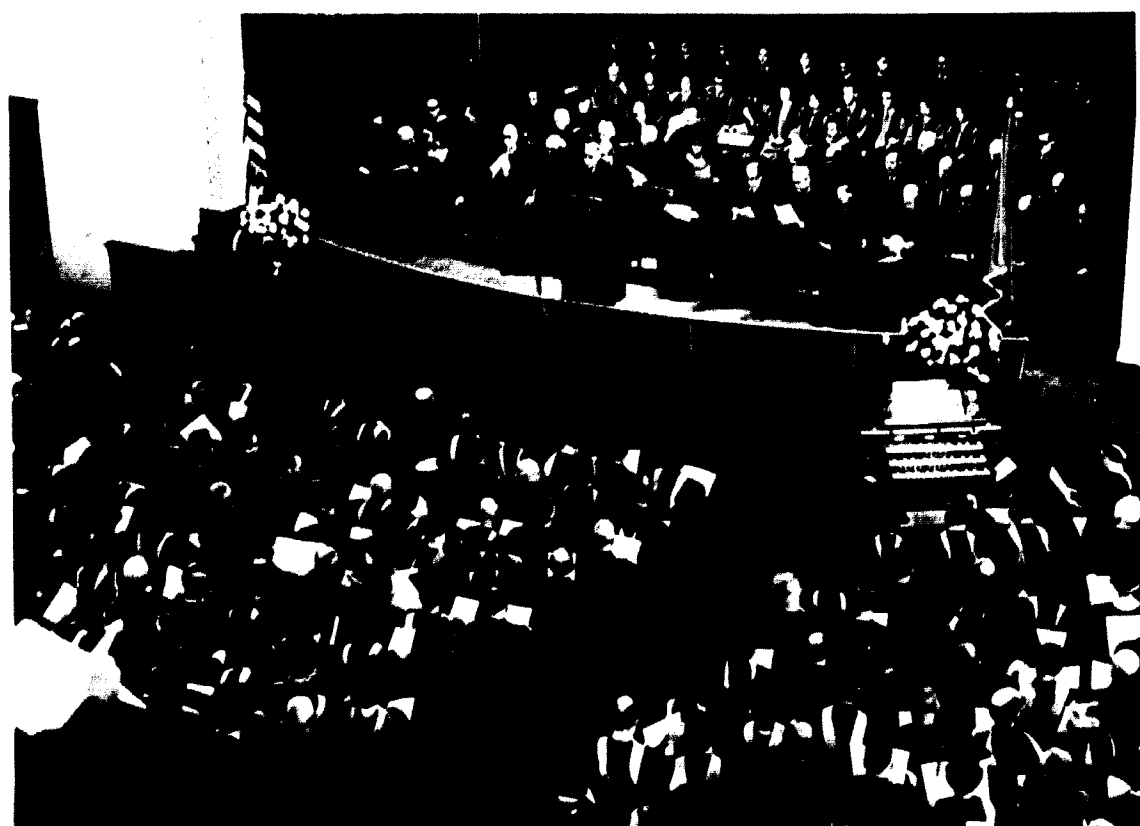

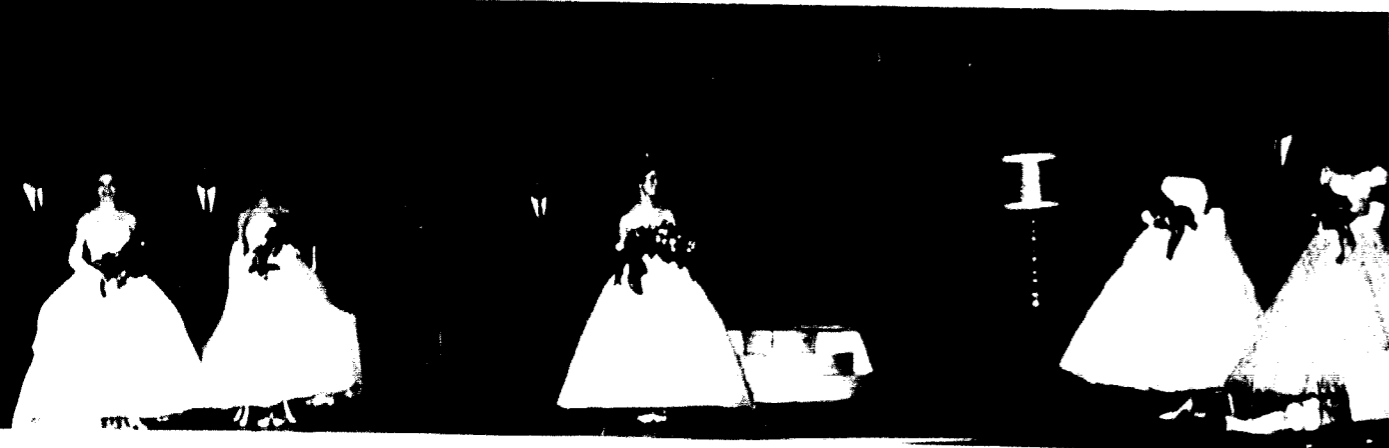

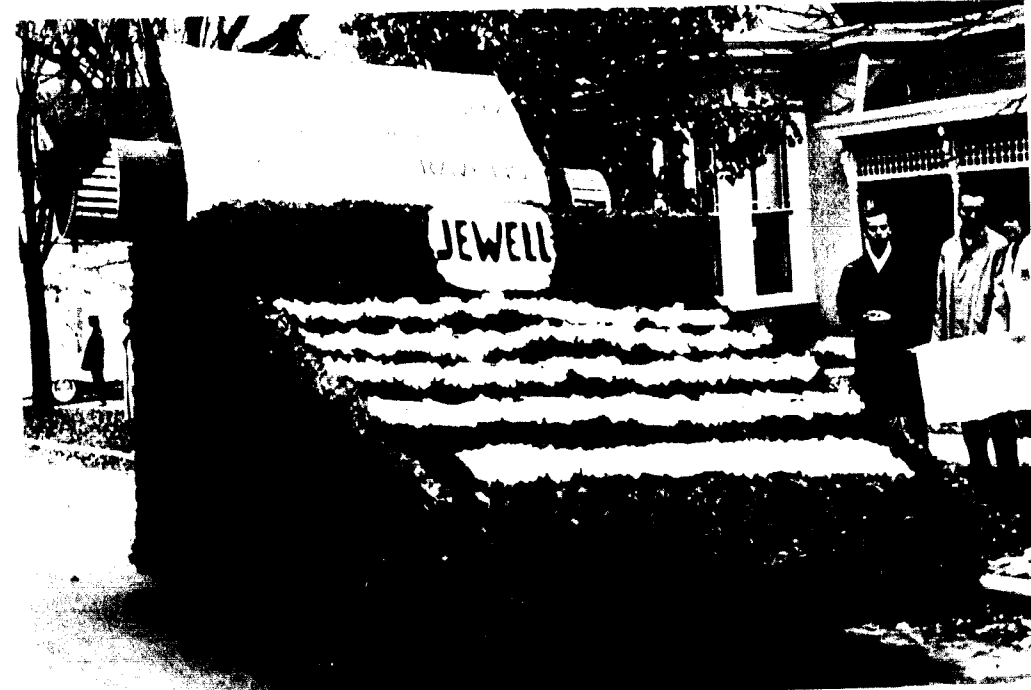

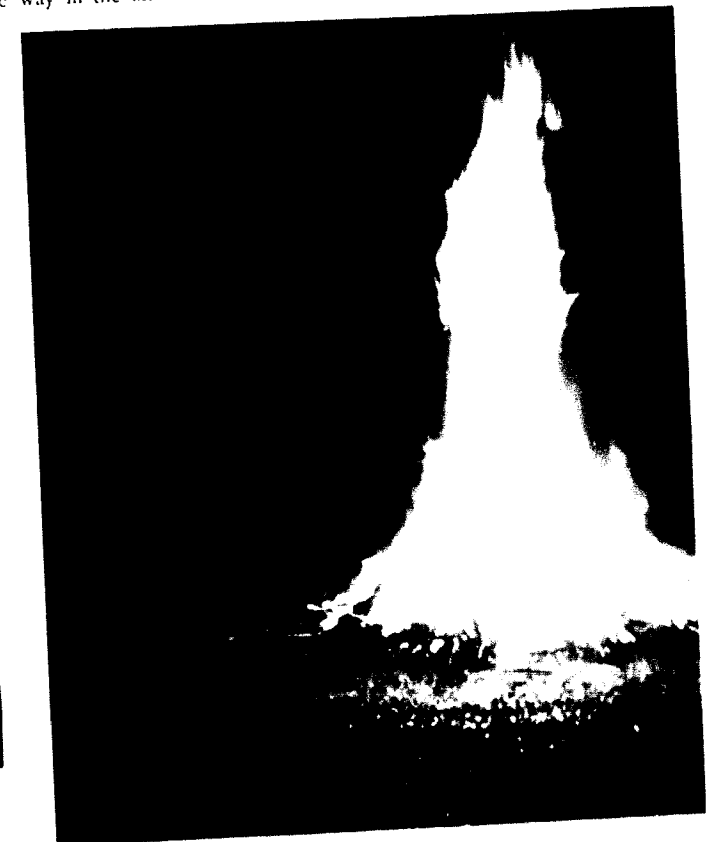

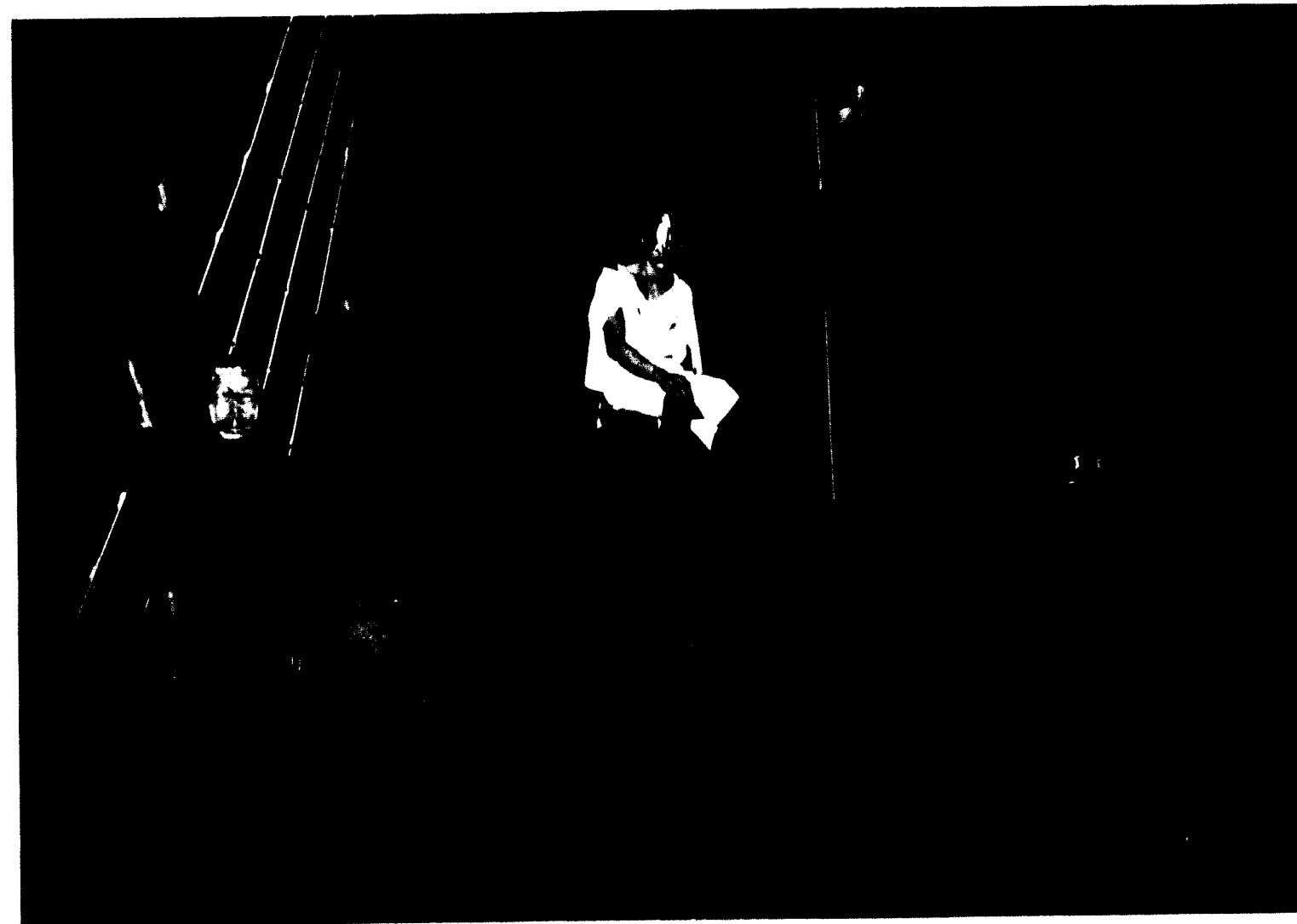
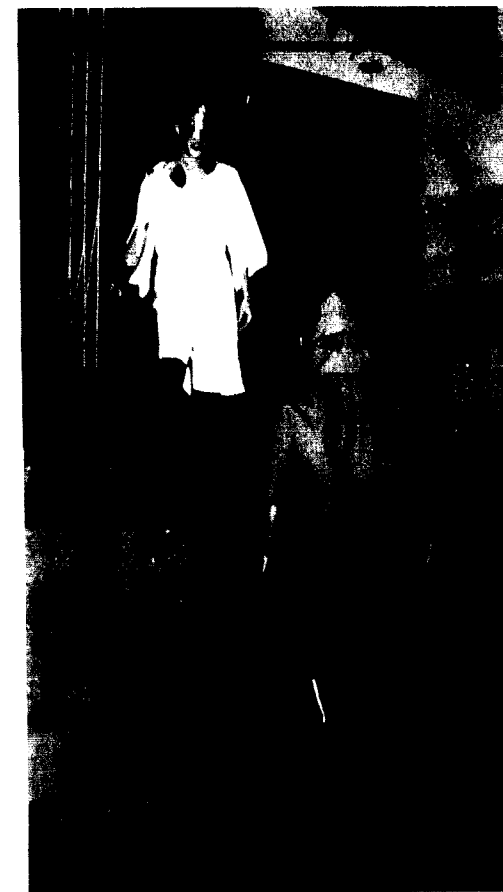


The book of Job is a product of the Wisdom-literature and deals with the problem of human life. The problem with which it deals is this: Why do the righteous suffer? and its principal aim is to controvert the dominant theory of the time that suffering is a sign of the Divine displeasure, and presupposes sin on the part of the sufferer. 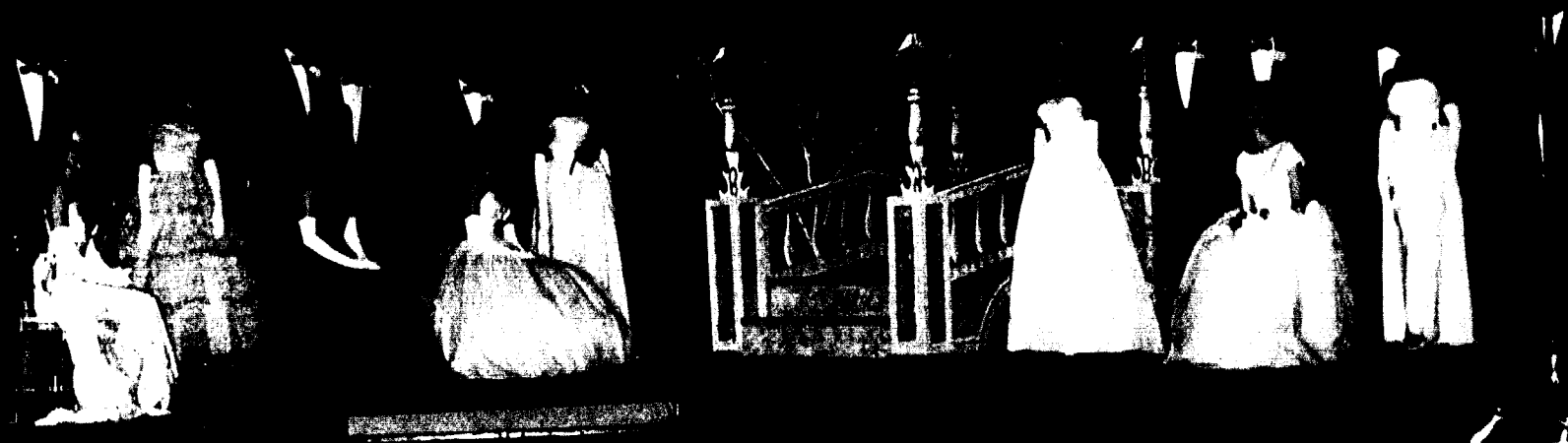

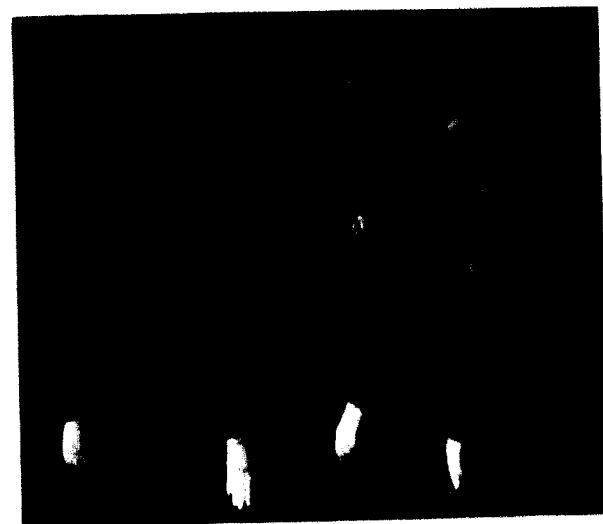

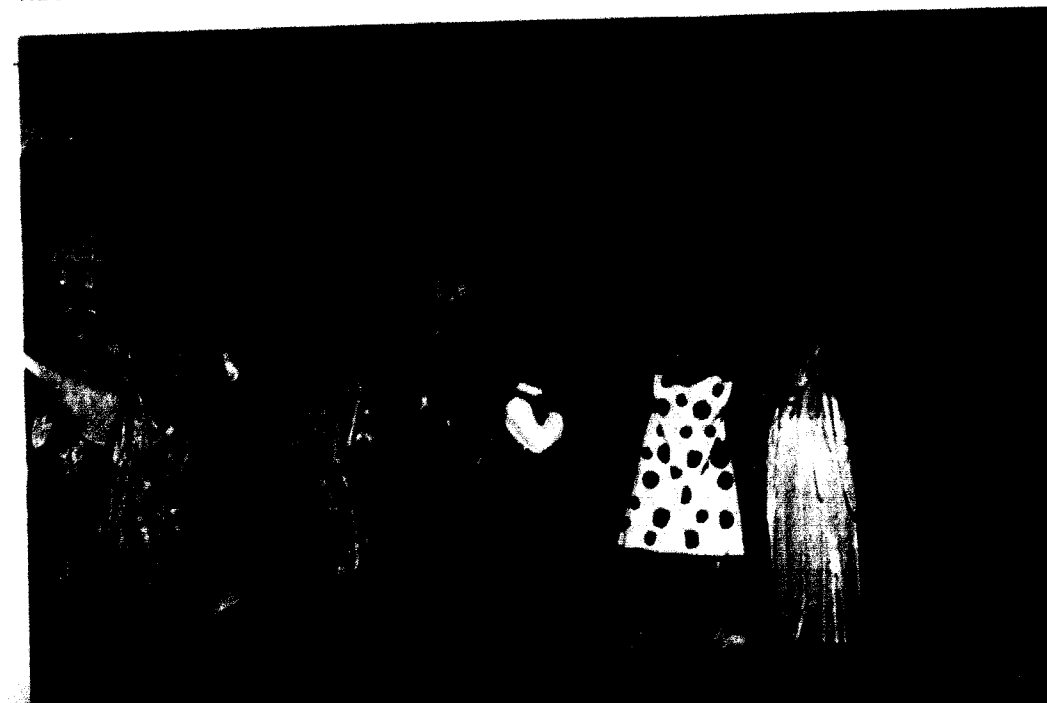

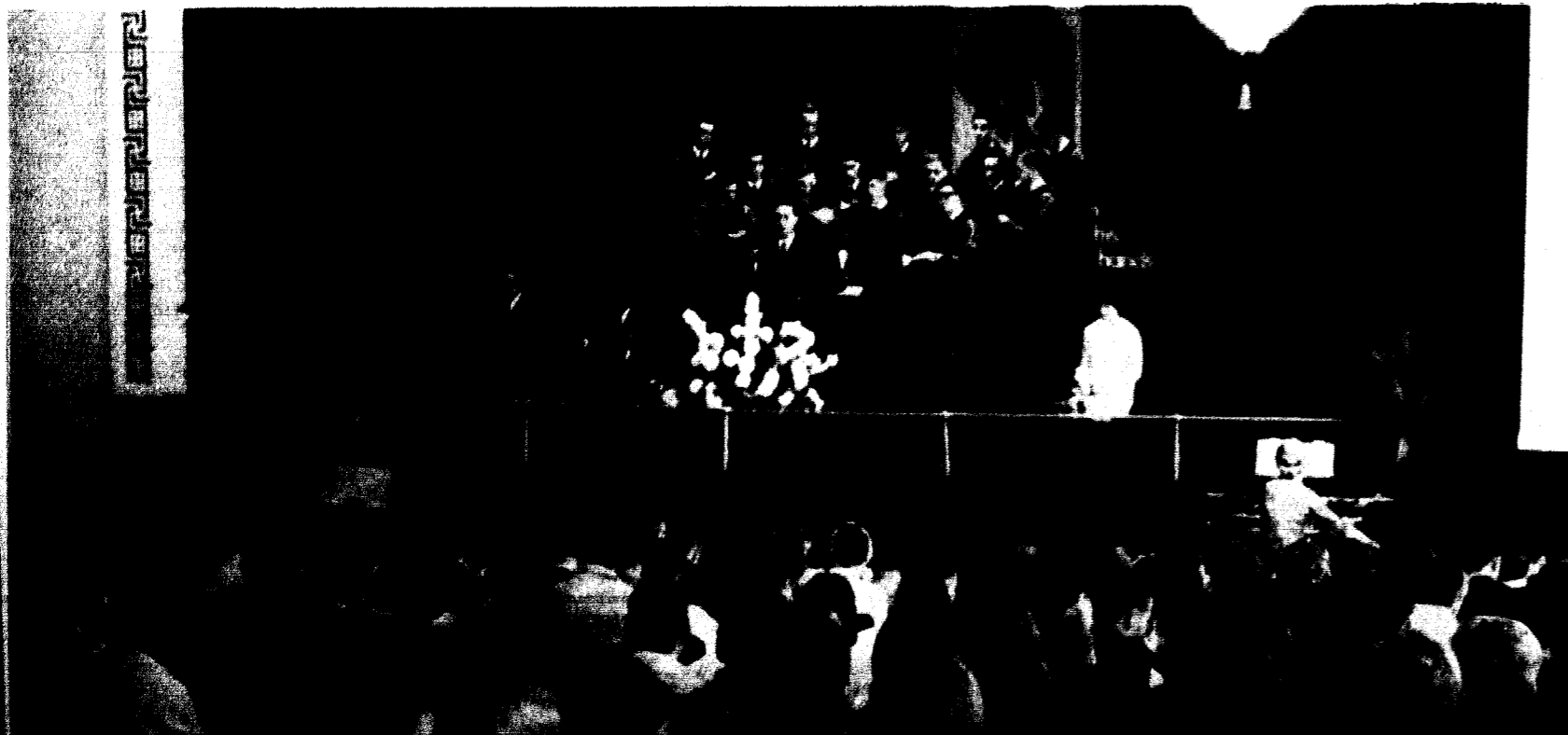

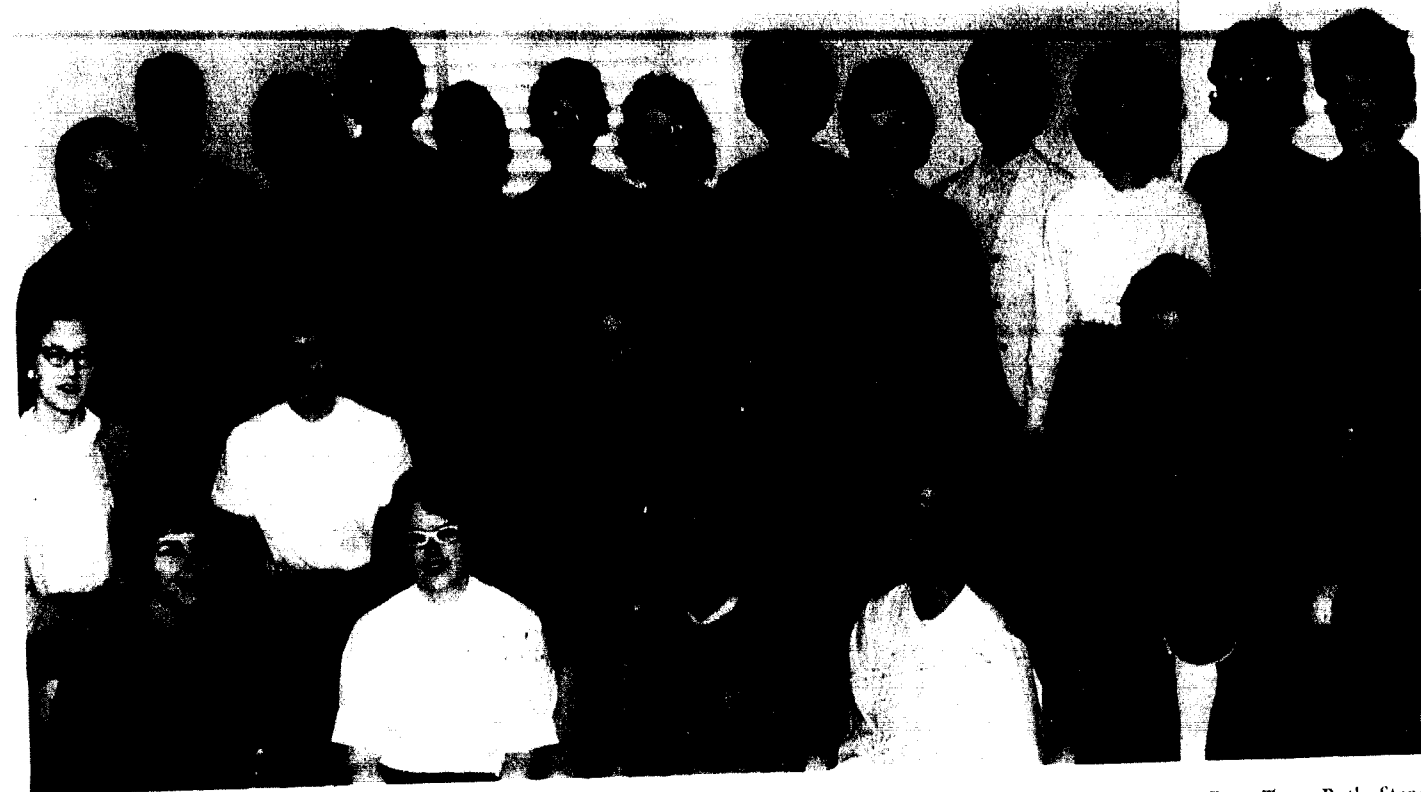
The Baptist Student Union helps to provide for the spiritual side of college life. It is the connecting link between the college and the local church.

The Young Women's Auxiliary is composed of a group of girls who are interested in the study of missions and the promotion of missionary work.

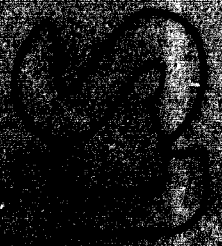
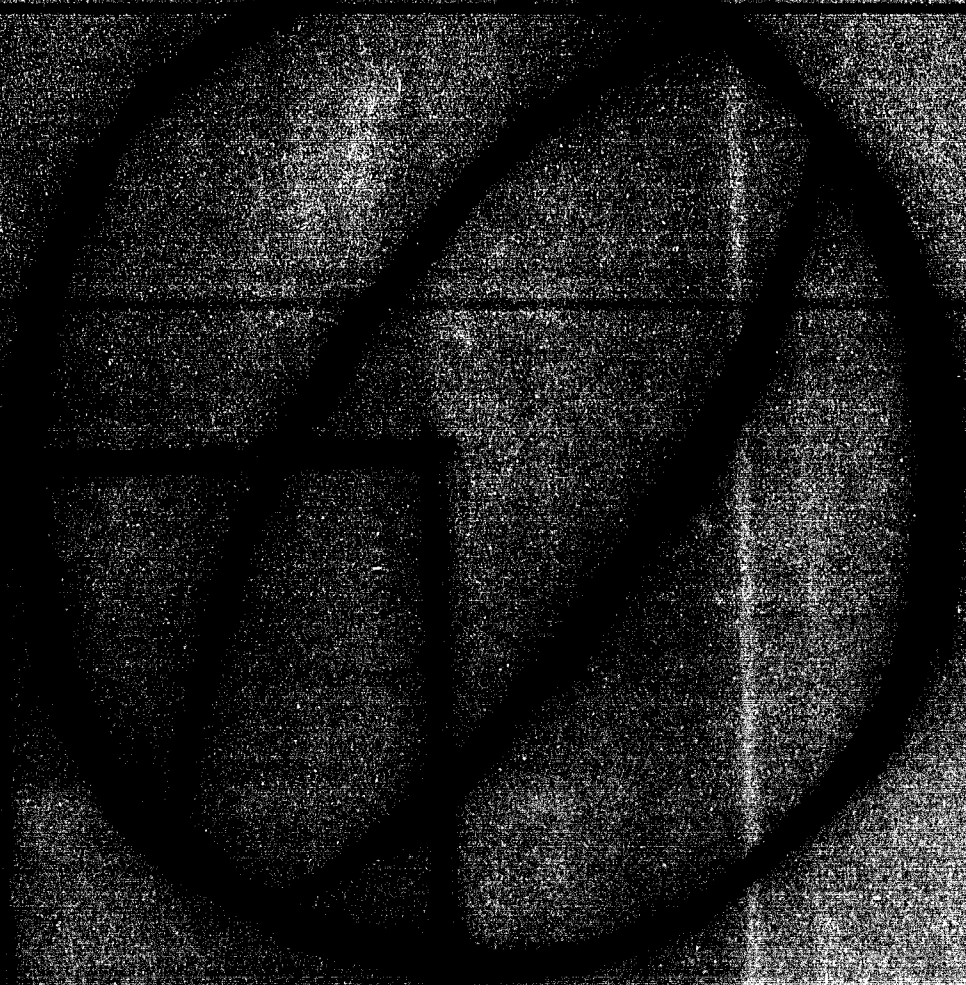
One outstanding service of the YWA group is its trips to Hilltop House to help the girls with their lessons and offer

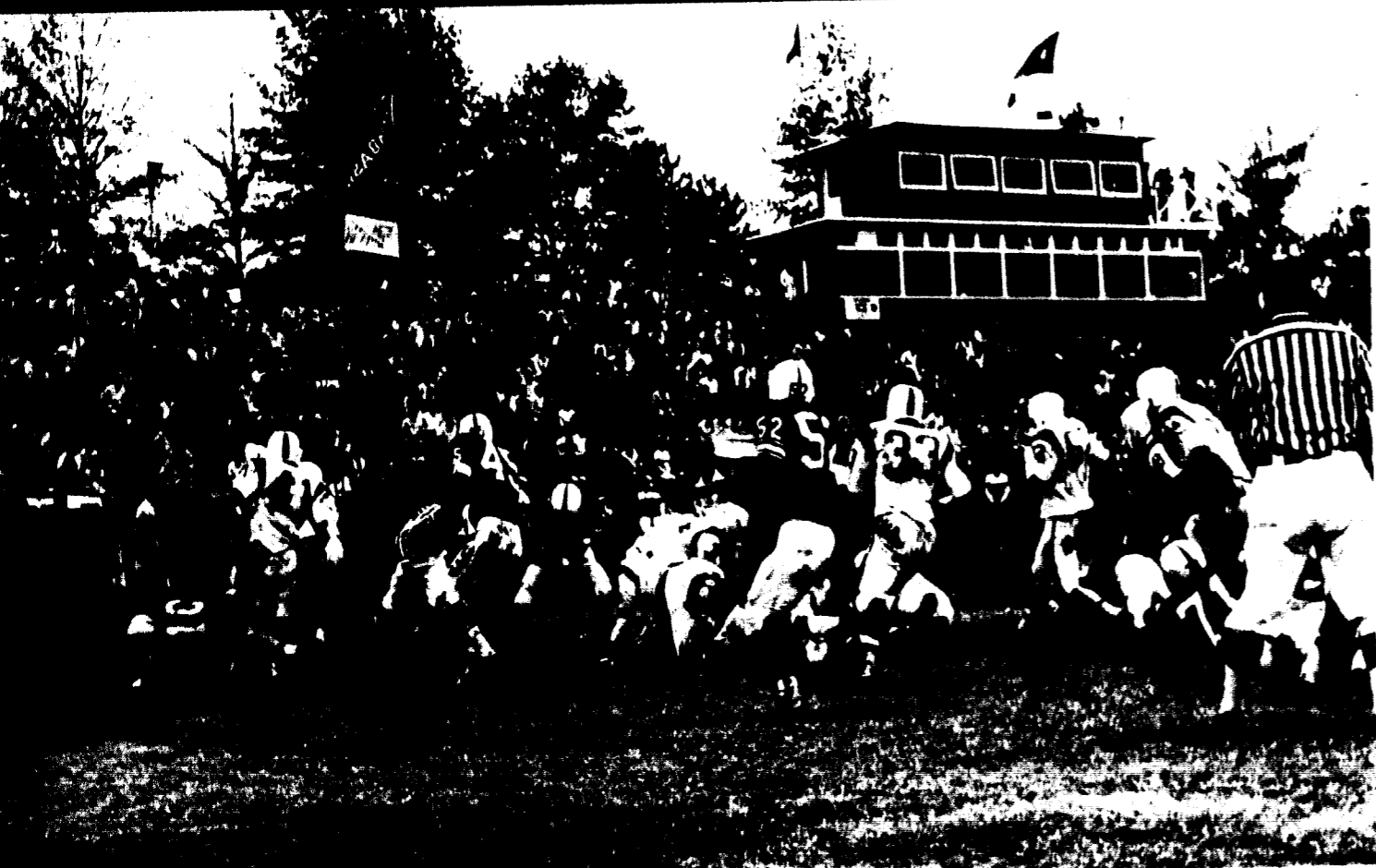
guidance and fellowship for them.

Under the excellent leadership of head coach Norris Patterson, line coach James Nelson and end coach Darrell Gourley, the William Jewell Cardinals became the top team in the Missouri Collegiate Athletic Union Conference by winning all of their conference games. Patterson has led William Jewell in over 130 victories, maintaining Jewell's reputation as a football power.

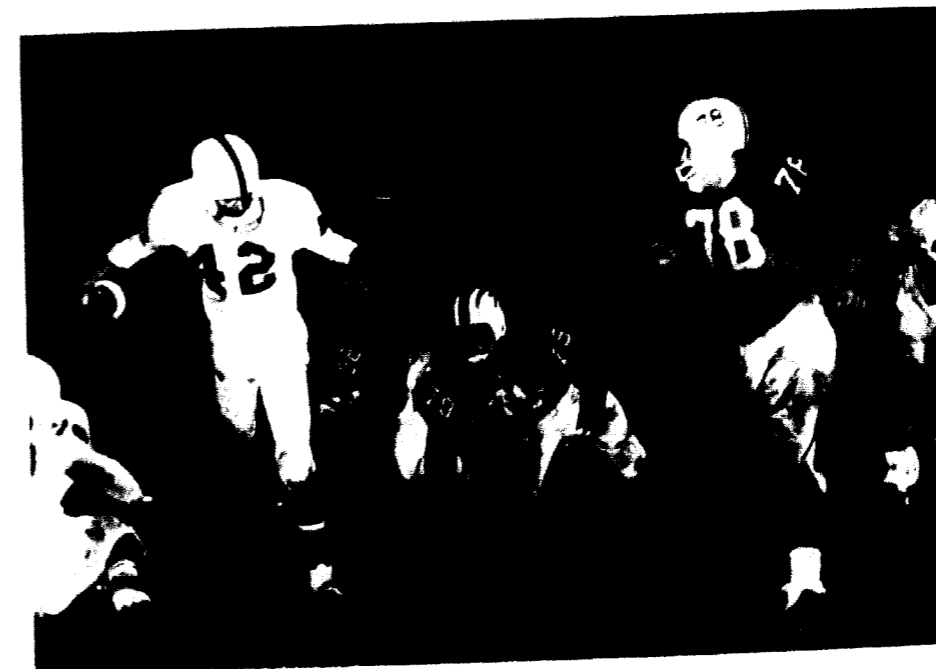

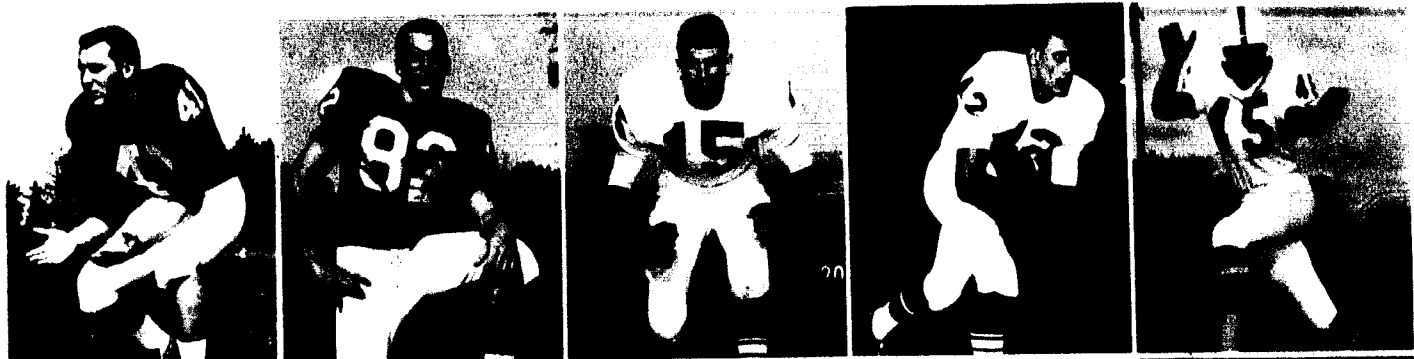

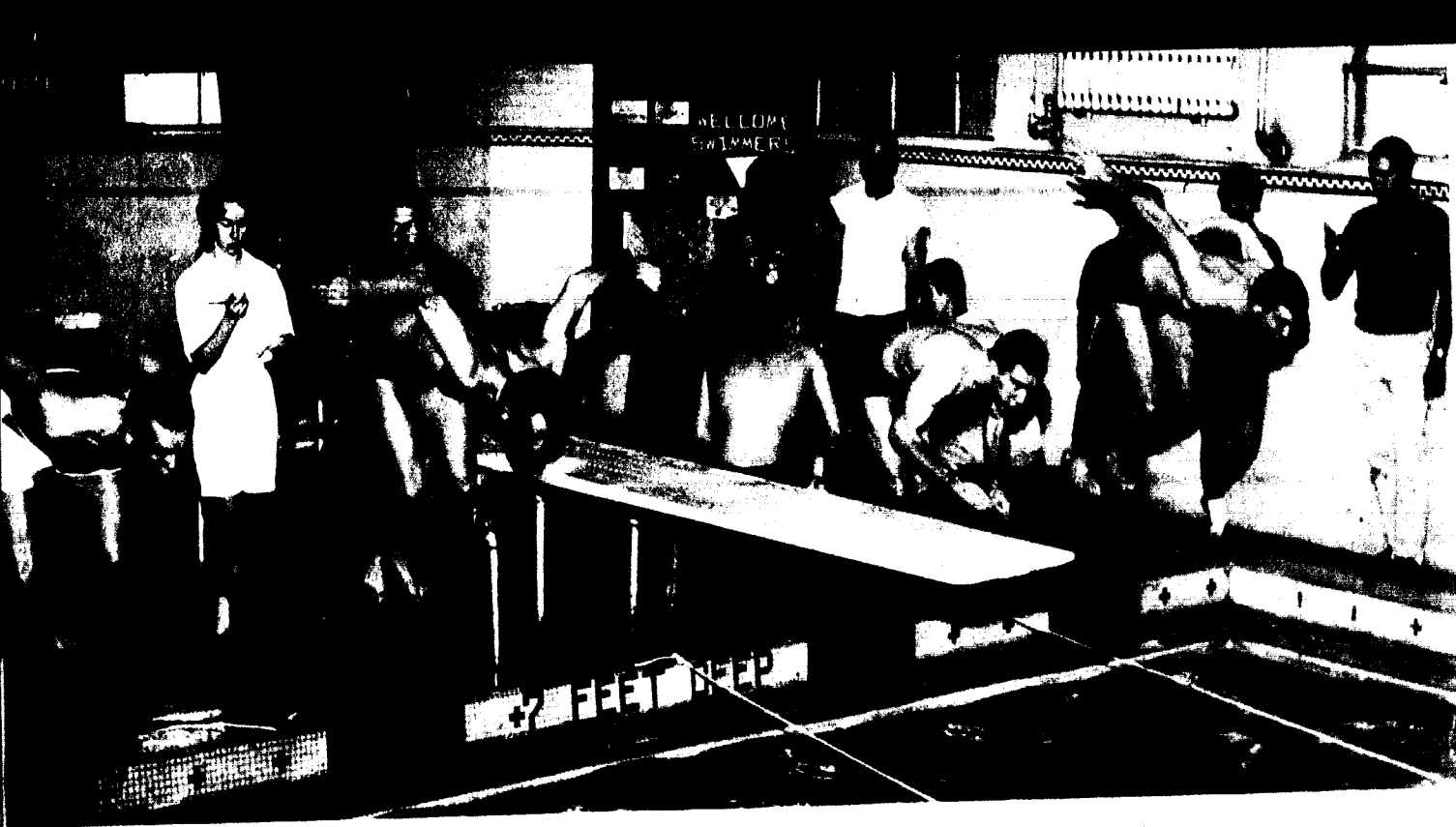

affairs.

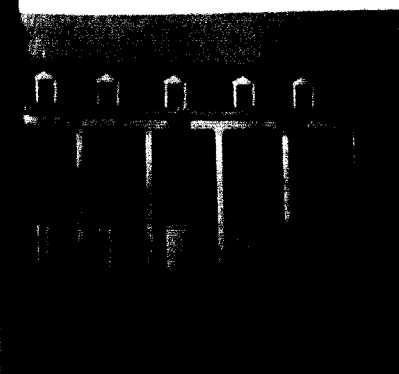

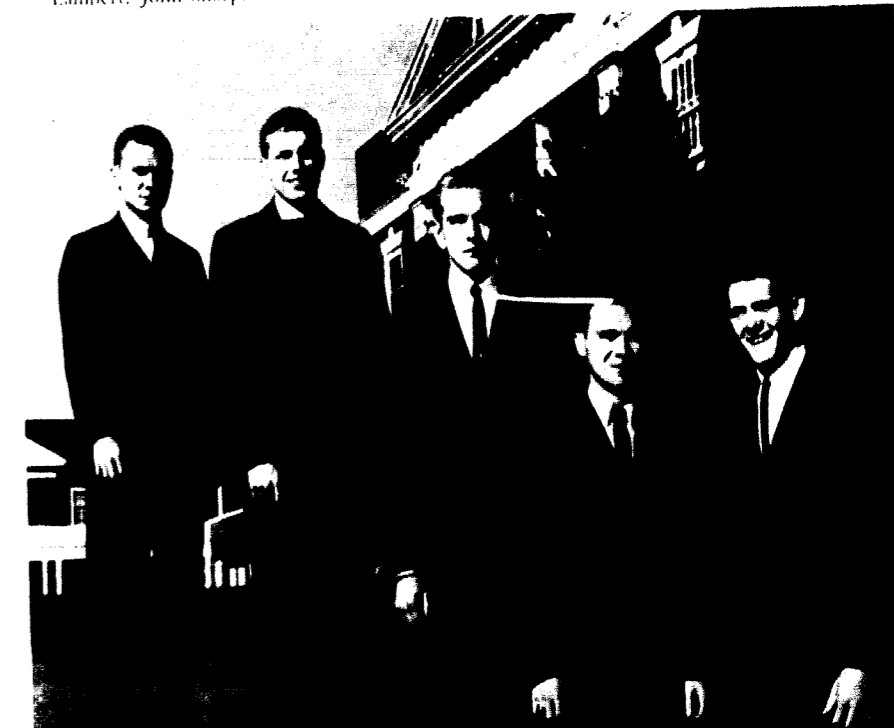
