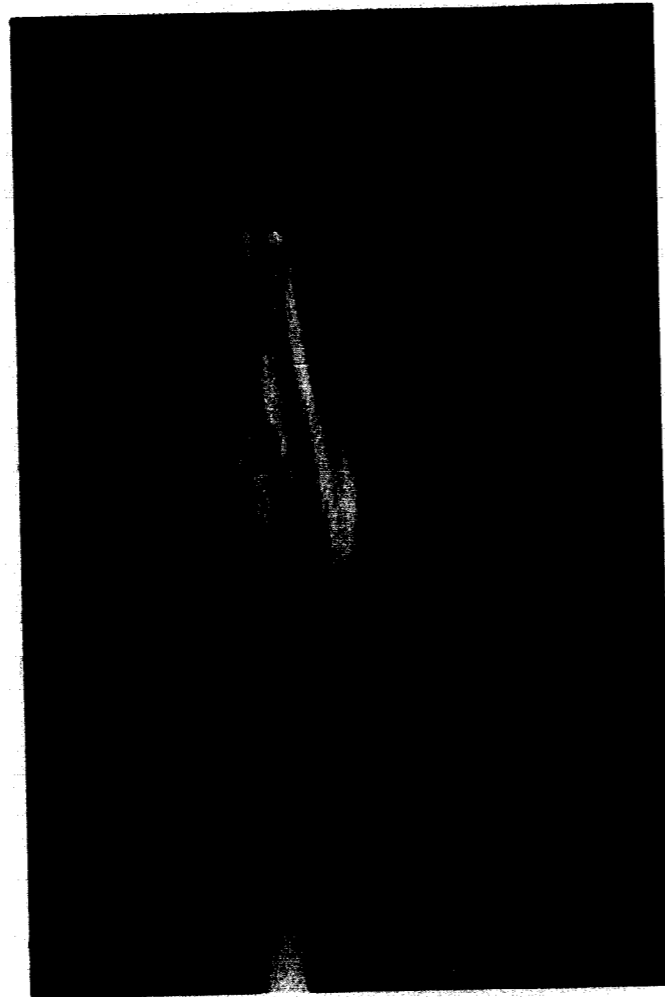


Homecoming with an atmosphere of fantasy

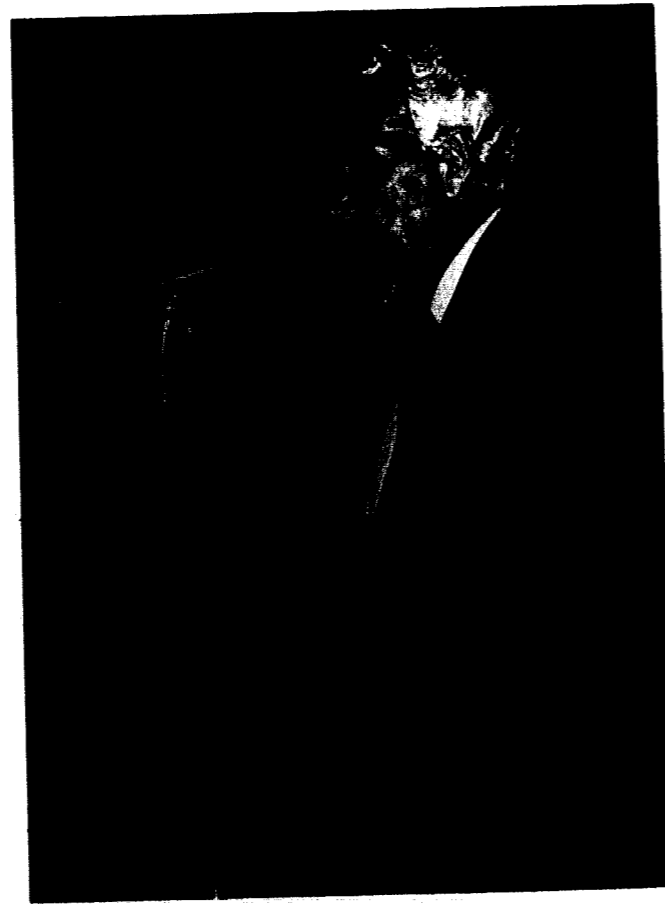

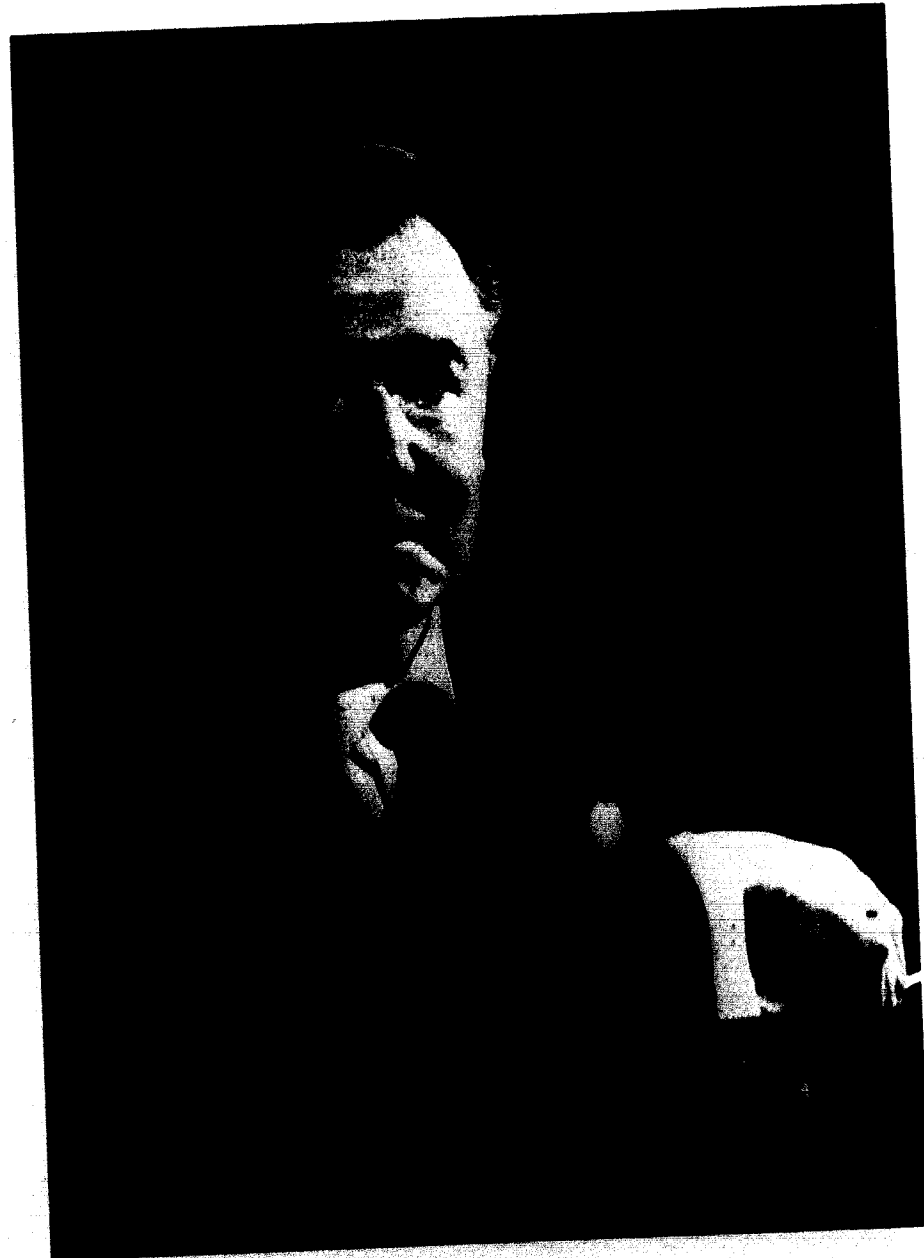

Construction of a new Fine Arts Complex also began last Winter as part of the president's ten-year development program.

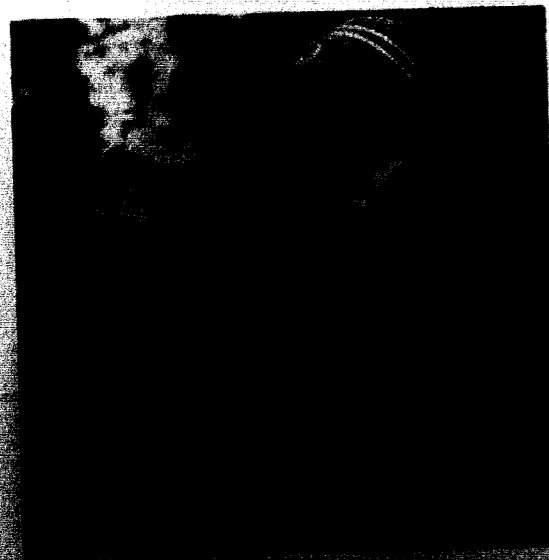

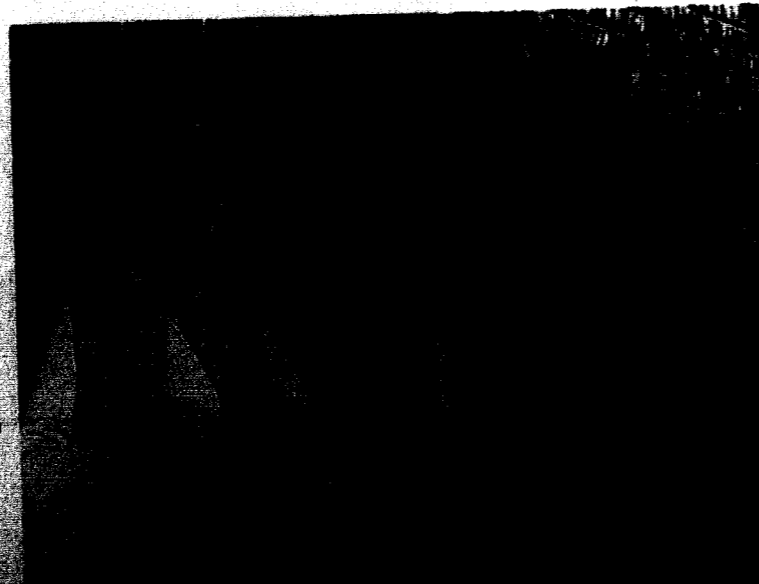

In memory of Mr. Lon G. Amick, Assistant to the President, whose love of William Jewell and selfless contributions to the college in less than two short years have been matched by few men.

His unflagging enthusiasm and energy, his warmth and sensitivity for his fellow man, made him a unique human being as well as a fine administrator.

On Founders Day, February 24, 1972, Mr. Amick delivered a memorable address to the student body in Gano Chapel. He praised the men who have made William Jewell College great; and we may apply those words to him:

"William Jewell College is grounded in abiding faith that Providence holds a special love for this school; and the college has always attracted to its administration and faculty those silent witnesses to God's Grace that bridge into successive generations the spirit of the American frontier, and serve to perpetuate the highest gifts of the American Dream . . . self-reliance and service to God."

Chemistry

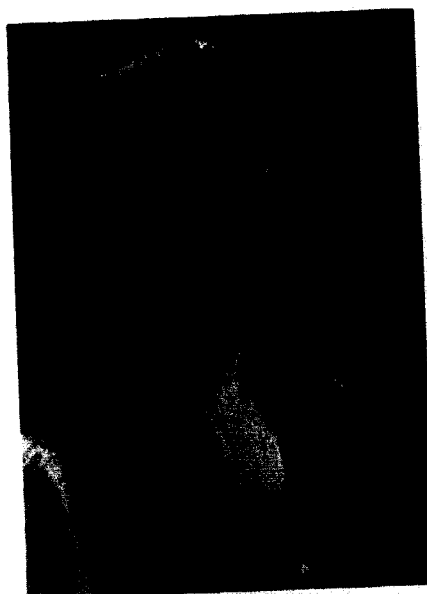
Chemistry is exploding with a record enrollment of ninety-two in general chemistry. Along with the many new faces, a new machine has been added to the department. Heavily funded by the American Chemical Society's alumni, a \$11,000 NMR spectrometer was purchased for use by the advanced organic, instrumental methods of analysis classes, and research. The machine is a 600 pound magnet which studies the structure of proton containing structures.

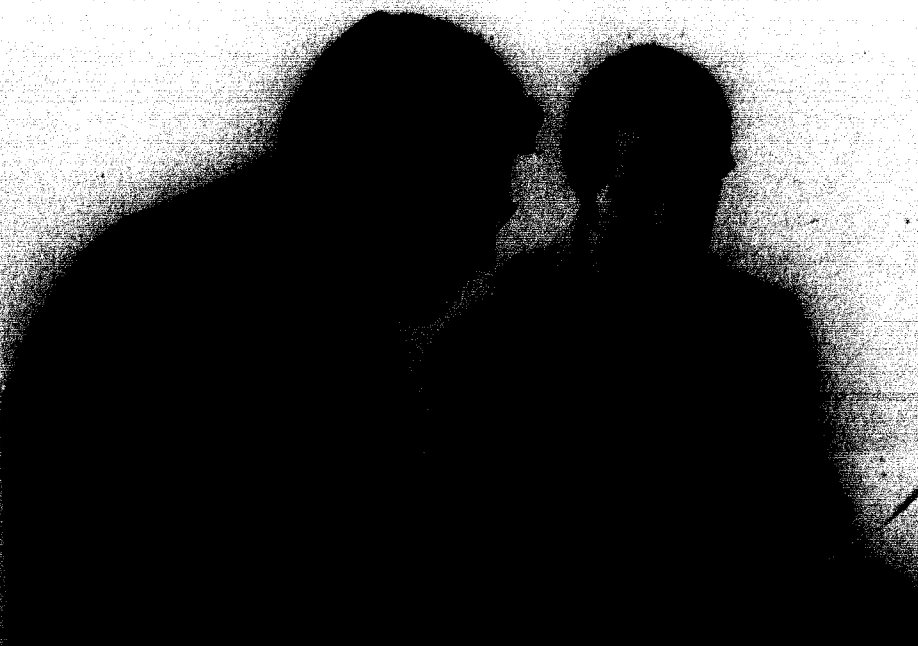

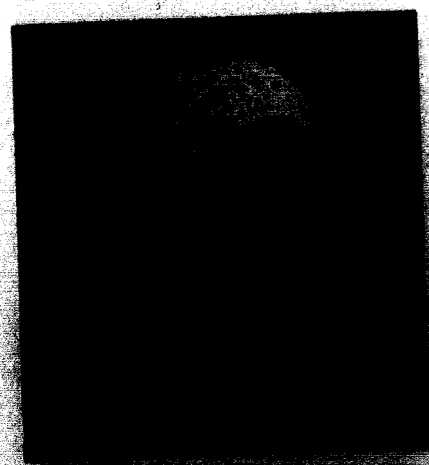

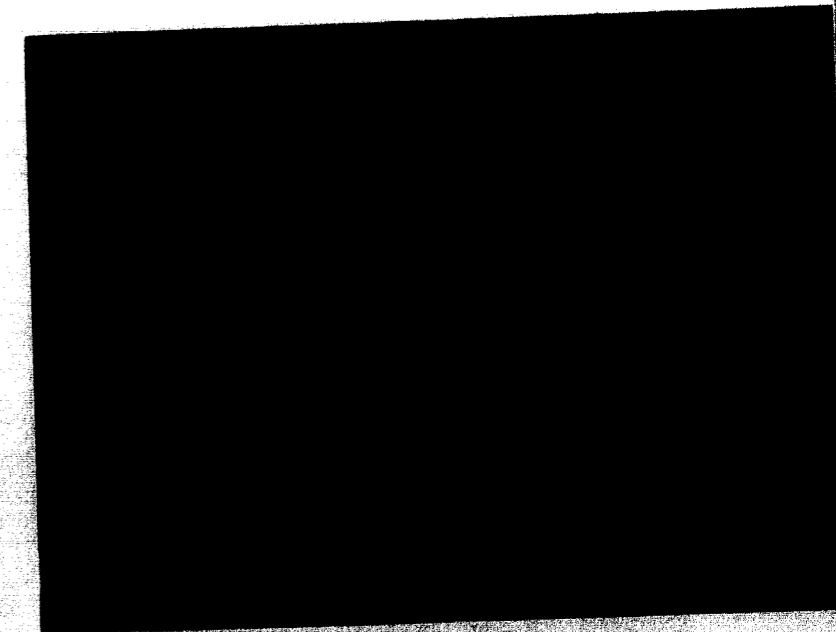

The history department co-sponsored the Central Slavic Conference with the Political Science Department. The theme of the conference was "The Dissident Movement in the Soviet Union."

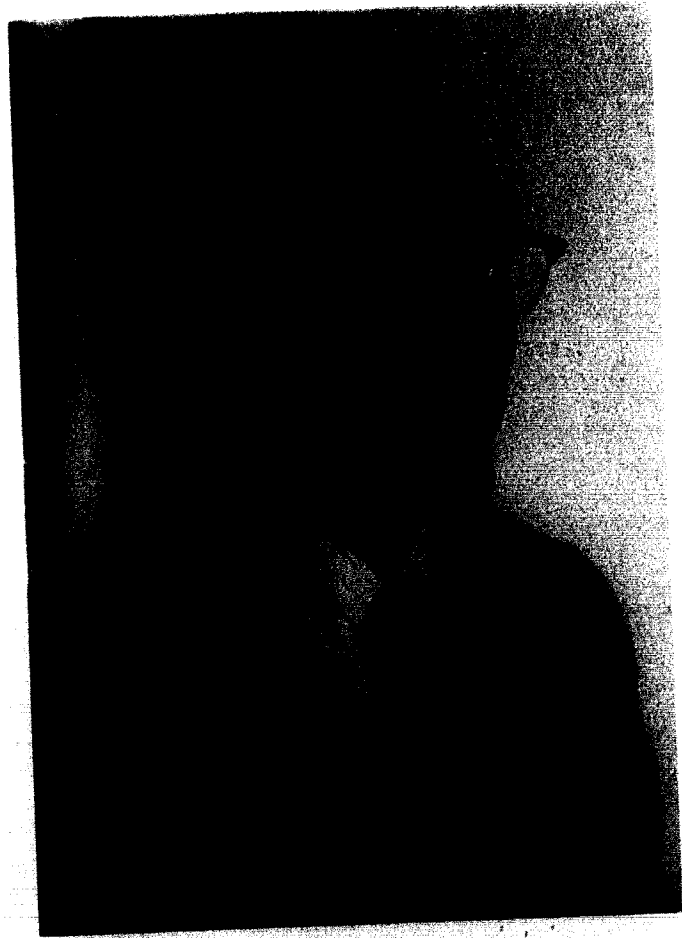
Dr. Cuthbertson spent three weeks in Russia in January to observe the Soviets as they live and attempt to make Communist institutions work.

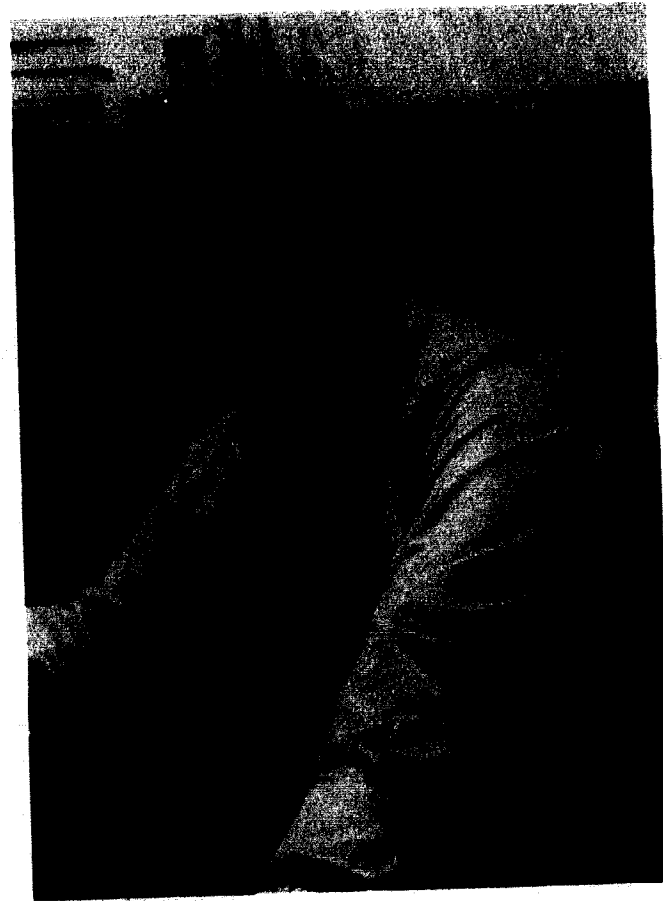

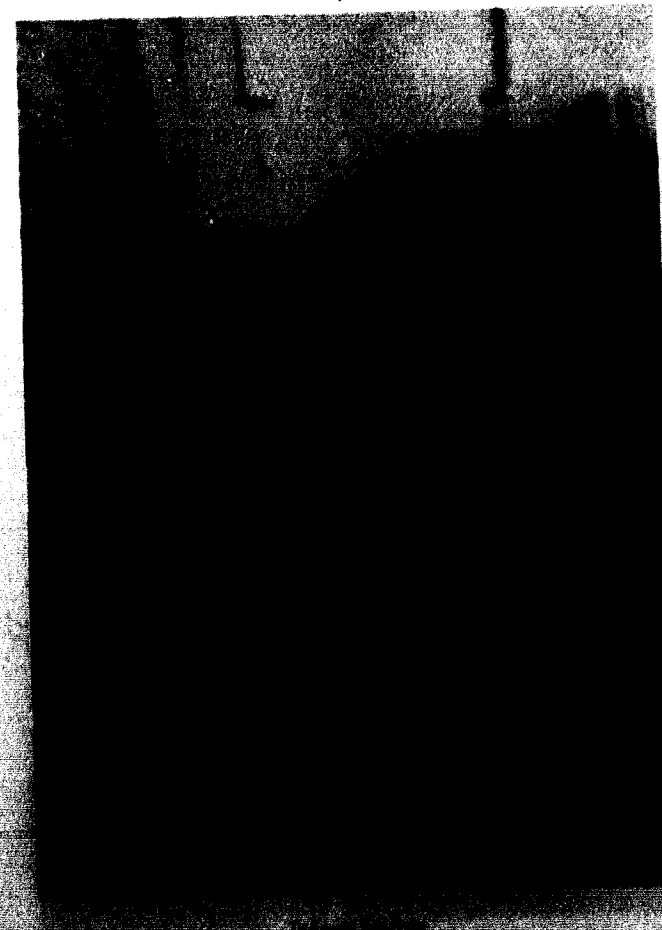

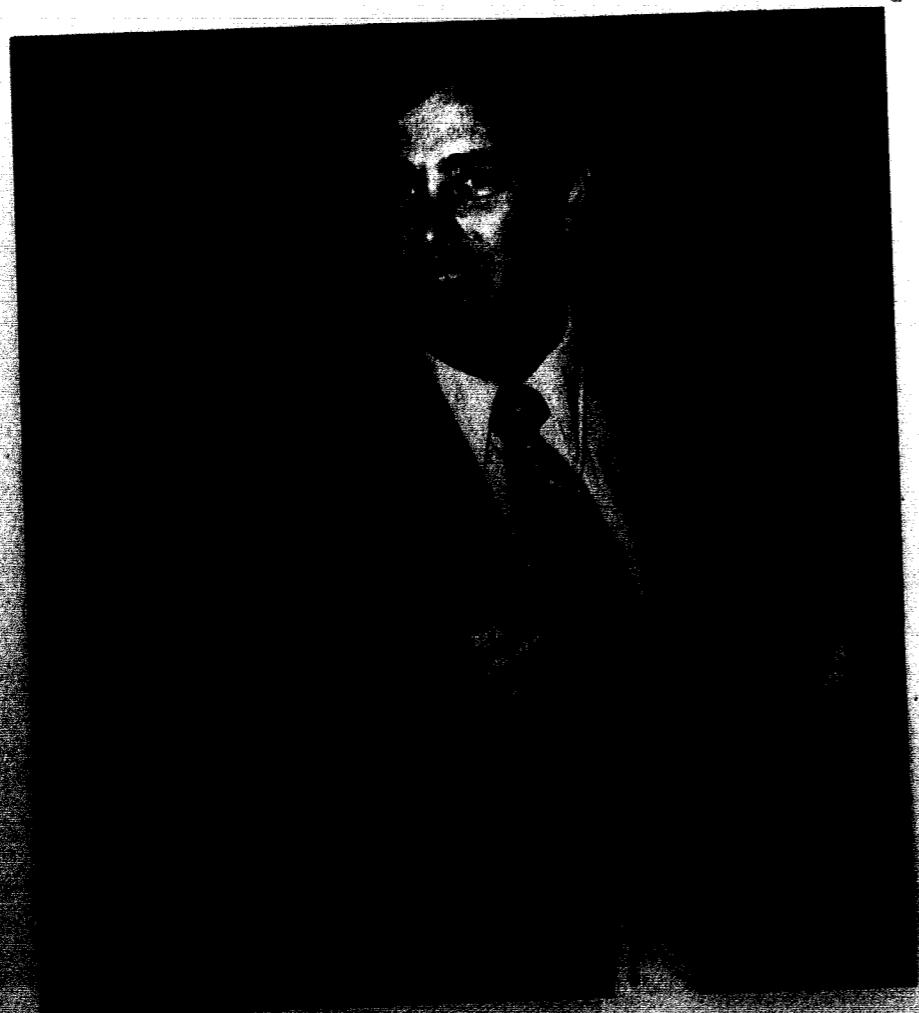

Music and Art

The Music Department welcomed a new professor of organ, Dr. Pauline Riddle. Among the programs of the Music Department were an opera presented in January, "The Marriage of Figaro," and a concert at the Nelson Art Gallery by the College Community Orchestra. The Concert Choir prepared a work by Jean Berger to be premiered at the Southern Baptist Convention in Portland in June, and took a trip to Canada over spring break. The band toured in November to Lexington, Booneville, Columbia, and St. Louis. They featured a clinic held at Parkway School District in St. Louis to provide individual instruction by our students and faculty.

Reorganization of the curriculum allowed for special problems to be introduced in the Art Department. Edie Mangun came over from Kansas University to teach non-loom weaving macrame, and loom weaving. The department worked with CUA chairman of art shows, Shirley Frankoviak, in providing a full schedule of art shows in the student union.

Nursing

The Department of Nursing Education in its third year had approximately 35 freshmen, 27 sophomores, and 19 juniors. The junior students took their courses at Baptist Memorial Hospital this year and took most of their clinical experience there as well.

The nursing program had a new director, Carolyn Brose. There were also several new faculty members: Evelyn Hutchison in pediatric nursing, Sue Popkes in medical-surgical nursing, Janet Vincent in medical-surgical nursing, Sheila Hollowell, Lynda Clyne in vocational nursing, and Jeanne Johnson in maternal-child nursing.

Philosophy

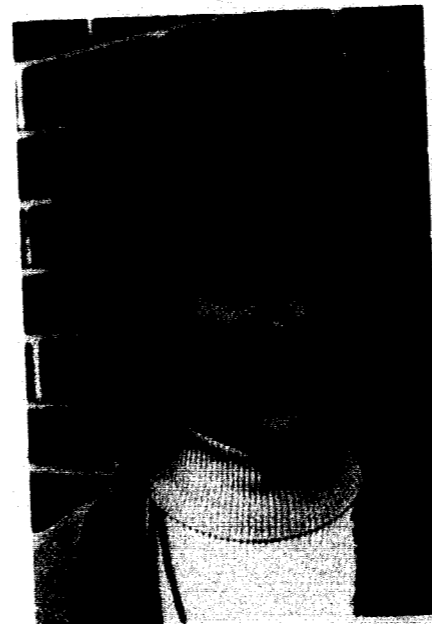

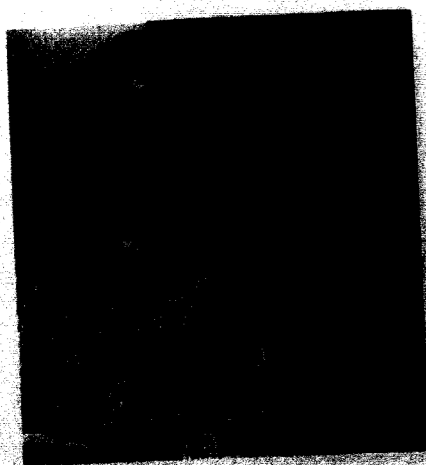
Physics

The department also sponsored it's annual Physics Night. During this night many demonstrations are set up for viewing by other college and high school students, and teachers.



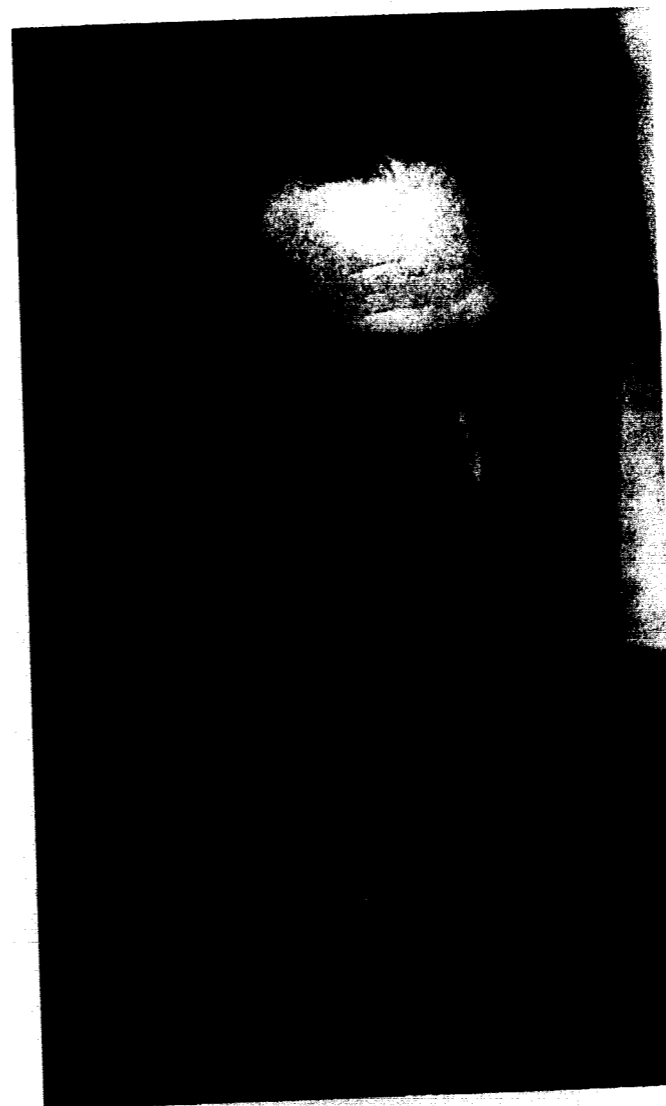

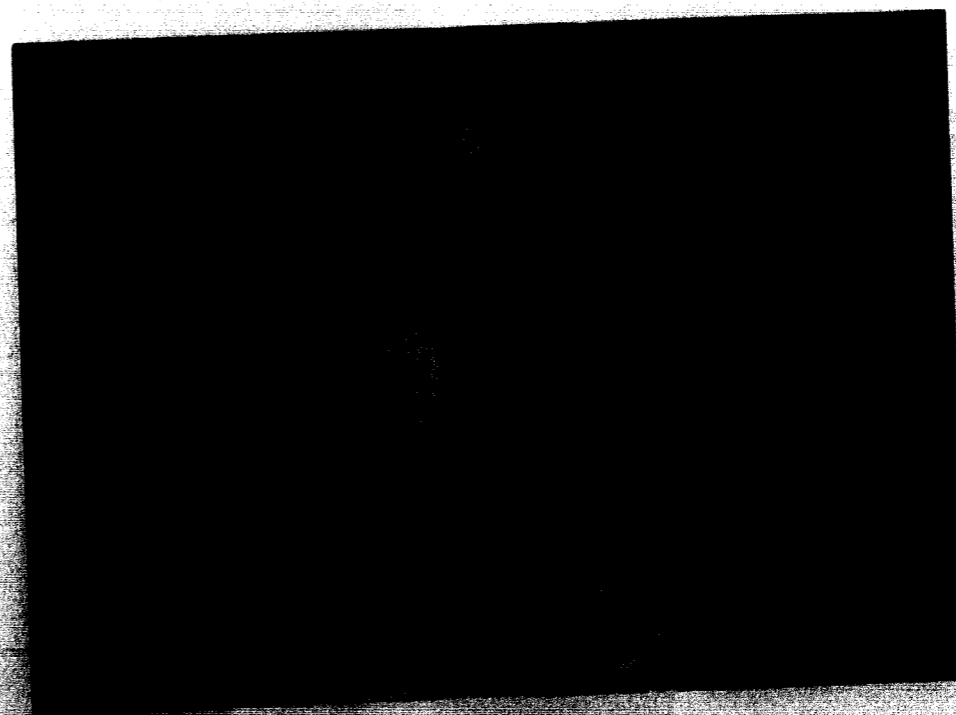

Political Science

The Political Science and History Departments hosted the Central Slavic Conference on our campus Nov. 17-18. The program covered Russian and Soviet history, arts, literature, society, and politics. Also, beginning with the October issue, the Political Science department published the BULLETIN ON CURRENT RESEARCH IN SOVIET AND EAST EUROPEAN LAW at William Jewell.

The department this year continued its practice beginning in 1960 of requiring each student in introductory political science courses and in the advanced course in American Politics to participate in the election campaigns with the party or candidate of his choice.

Religion

This program brings students who intend to enter church-related vocations together with churches which need workers. There the student puts into practice what he has learned in his academic studies. Each student has a supervisor within the church who submits regular reports concerning the student and his involvement in the program. Dr. Oscar Brooks was on sabbatical leave in the fall at Oxford. He also went on a archaeological expedition to the Holy Land.

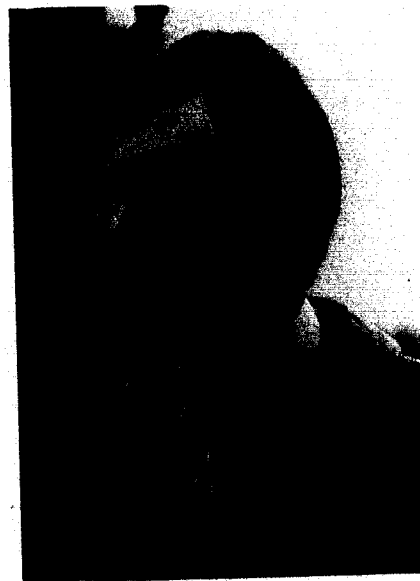

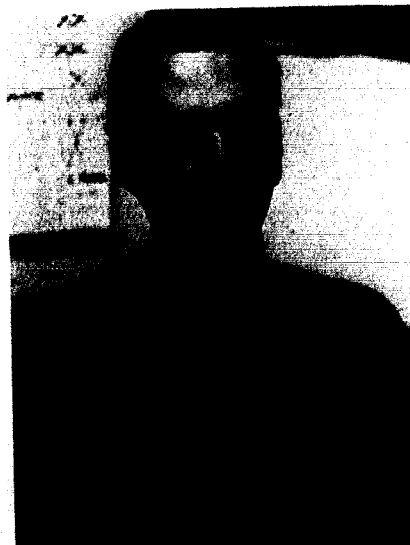

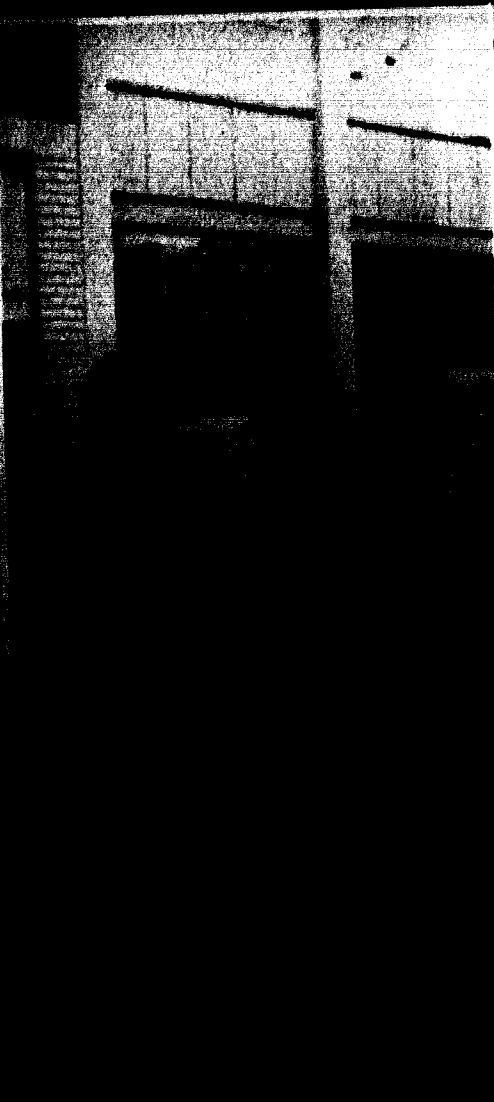
Sociology and Psychology

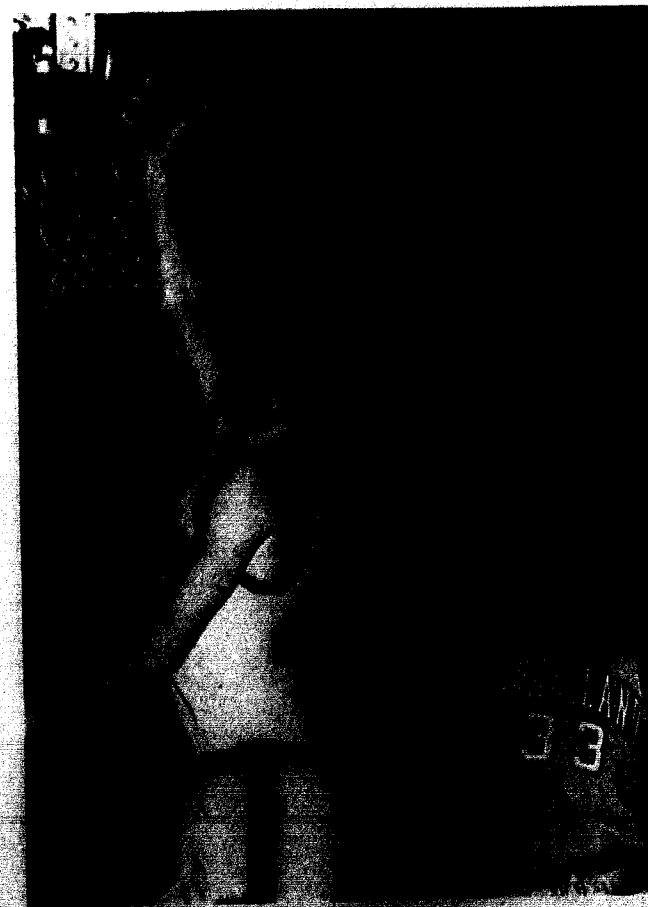
