## WILLIAM JEWELL 41 — CULVER-STOCKTON 6

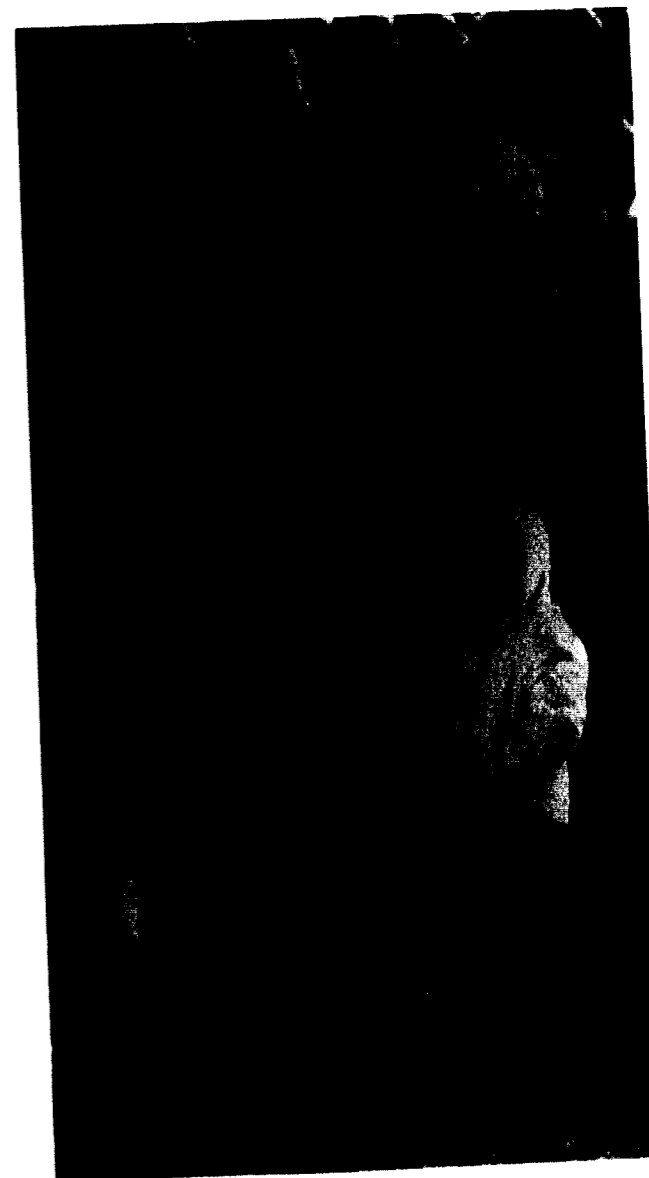
Jewell offense clicked as Cardinals scored a smooth victory over Culver-Stockton.

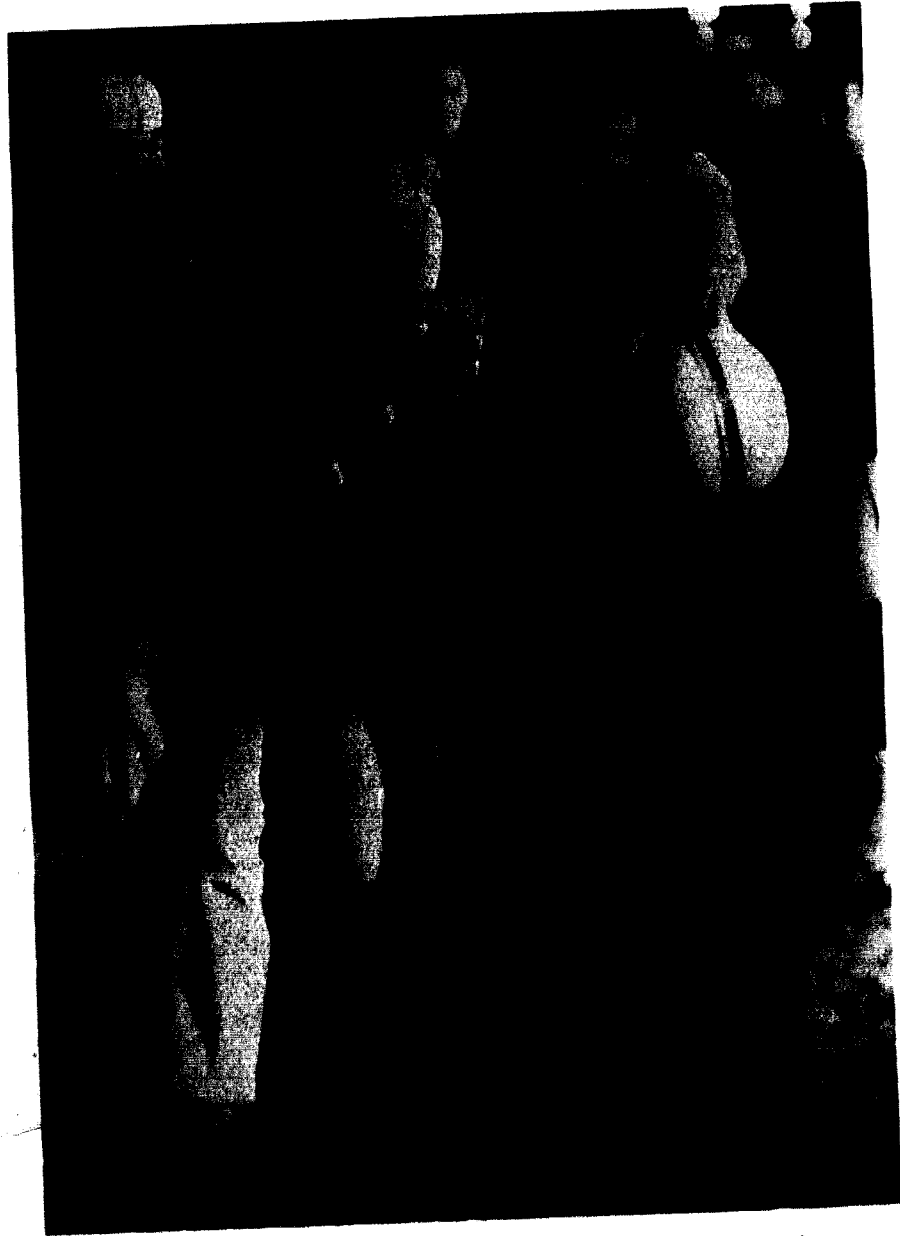

Wayne State scored both of their touchdowns on long drives but were unable to score on either extra-point attempt.

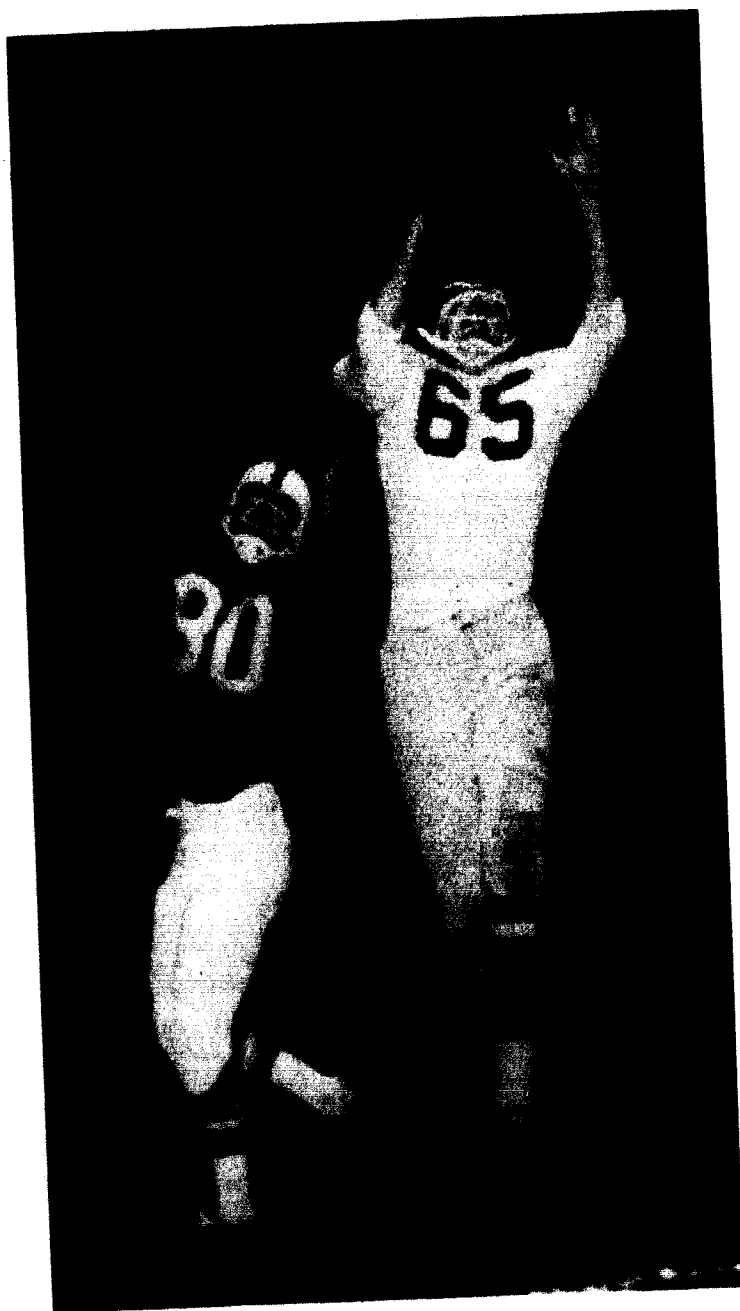
## WILLIAM JEWELL 45— GRACELAND 21

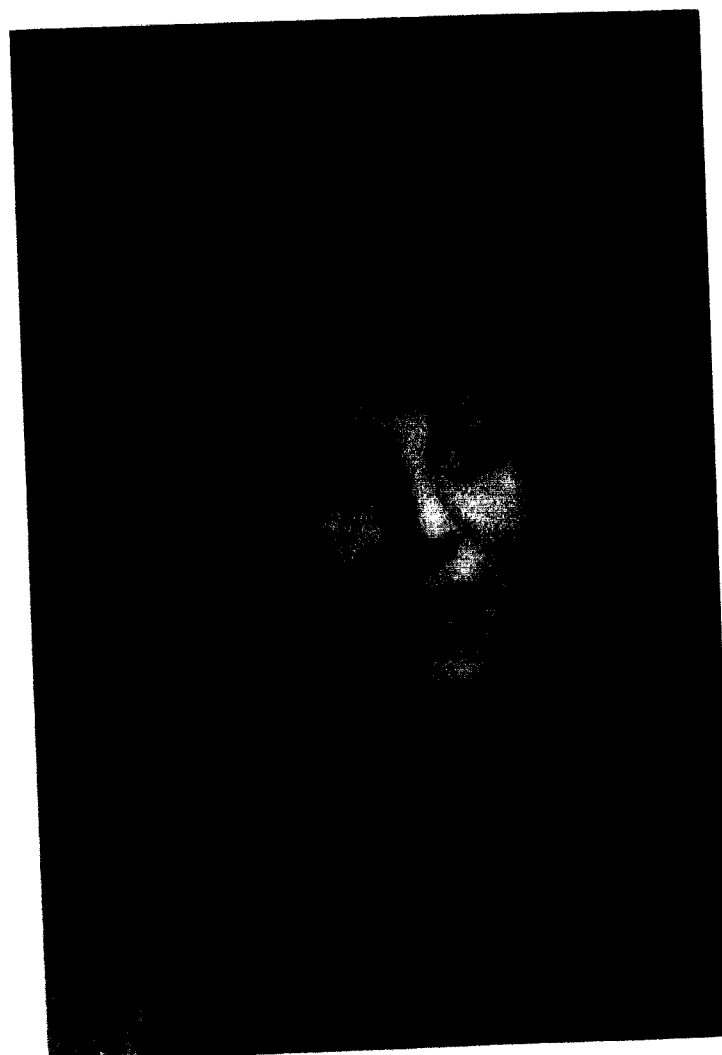

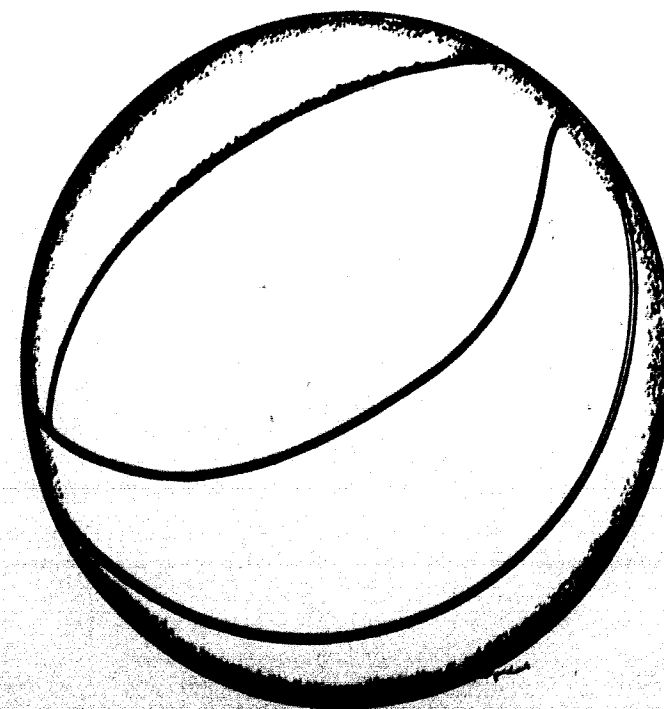

Graceland marched to one more touchdown to end the final scoring.



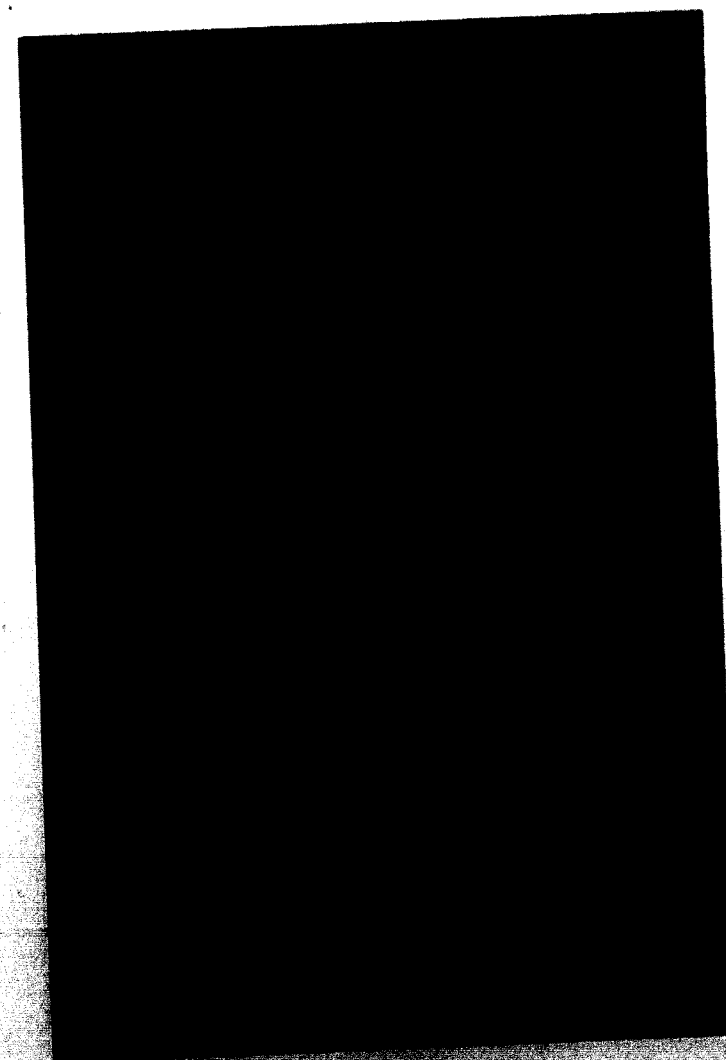

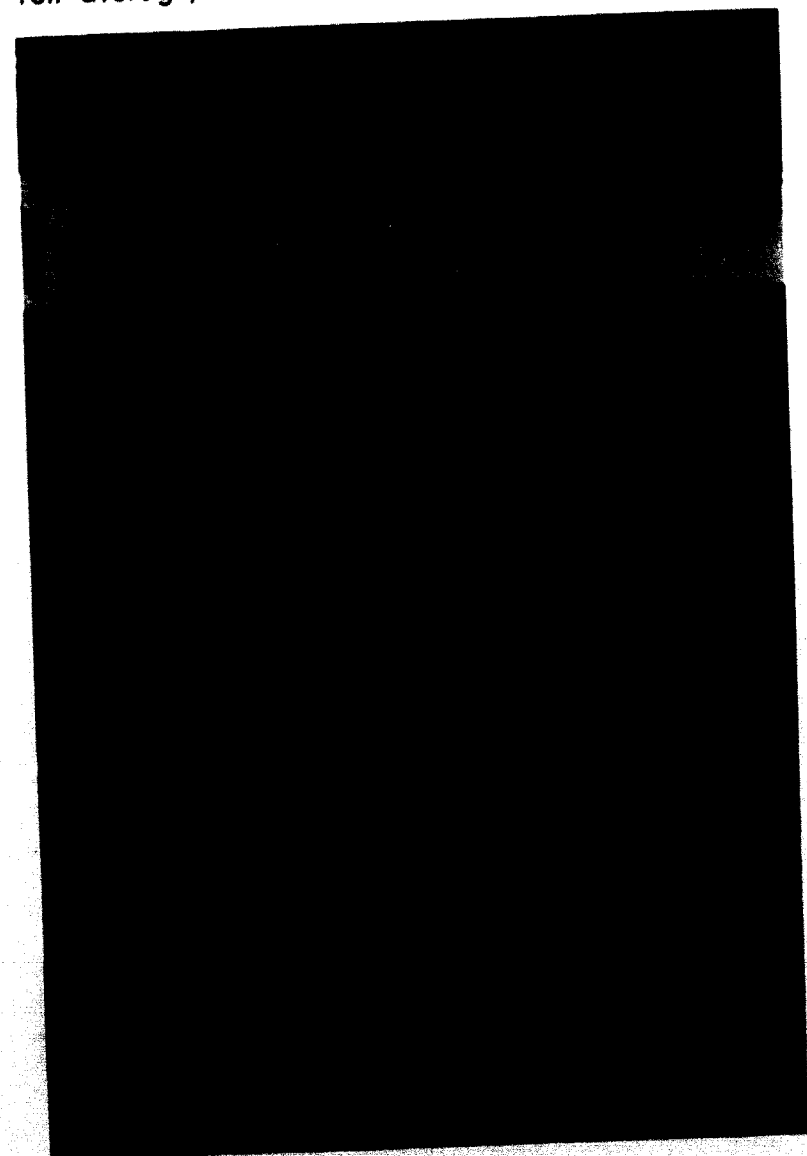

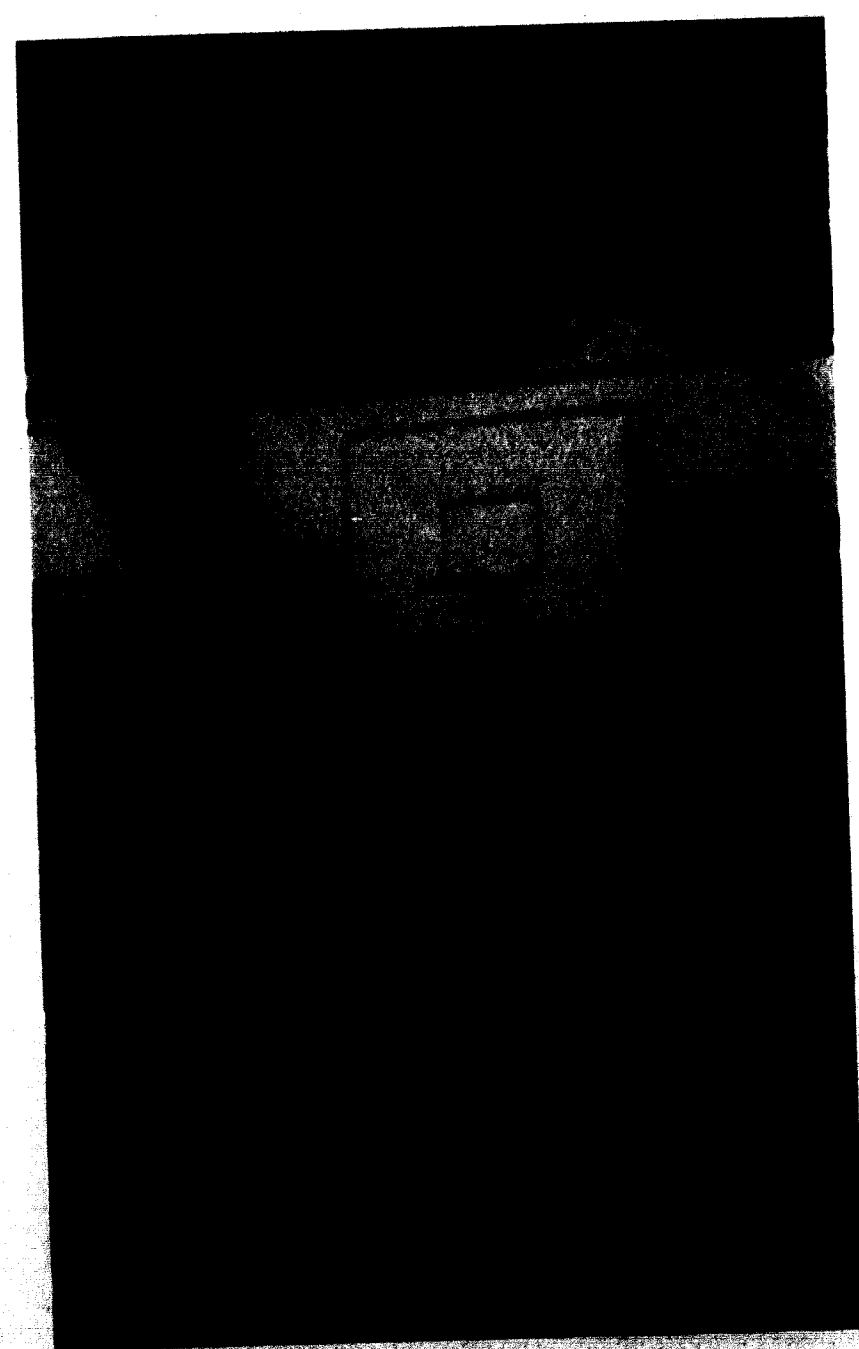

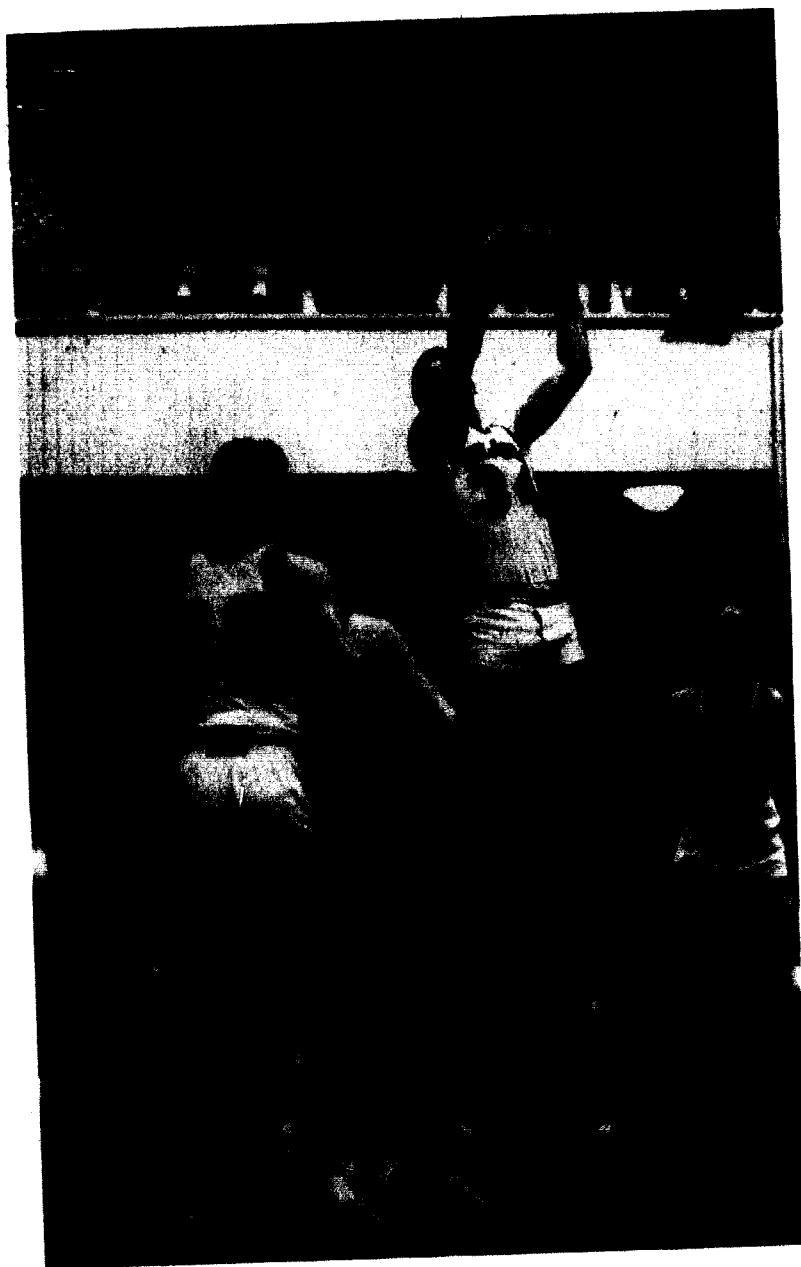

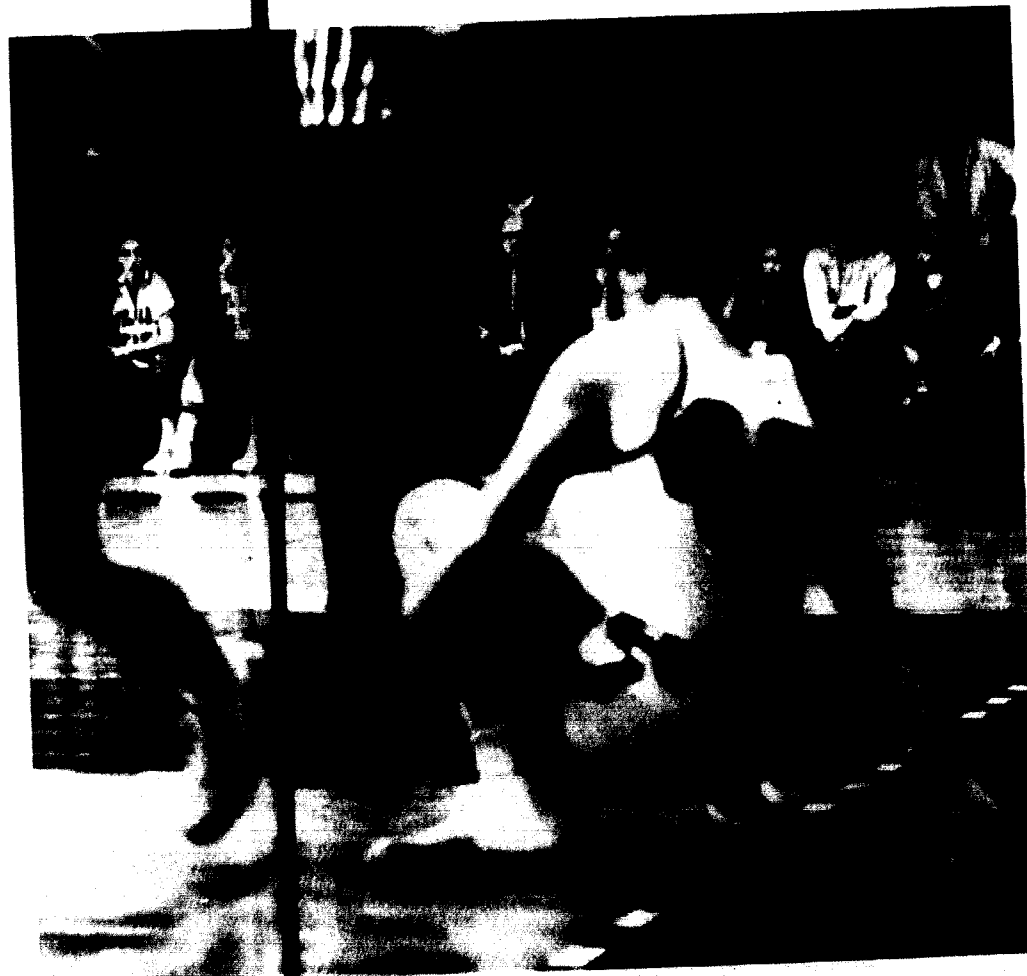


CHUCK JOHNSON pulls down another rebound against Westminster. Although the Cards were usually out-heighted, they were rarely beaten on the boards.

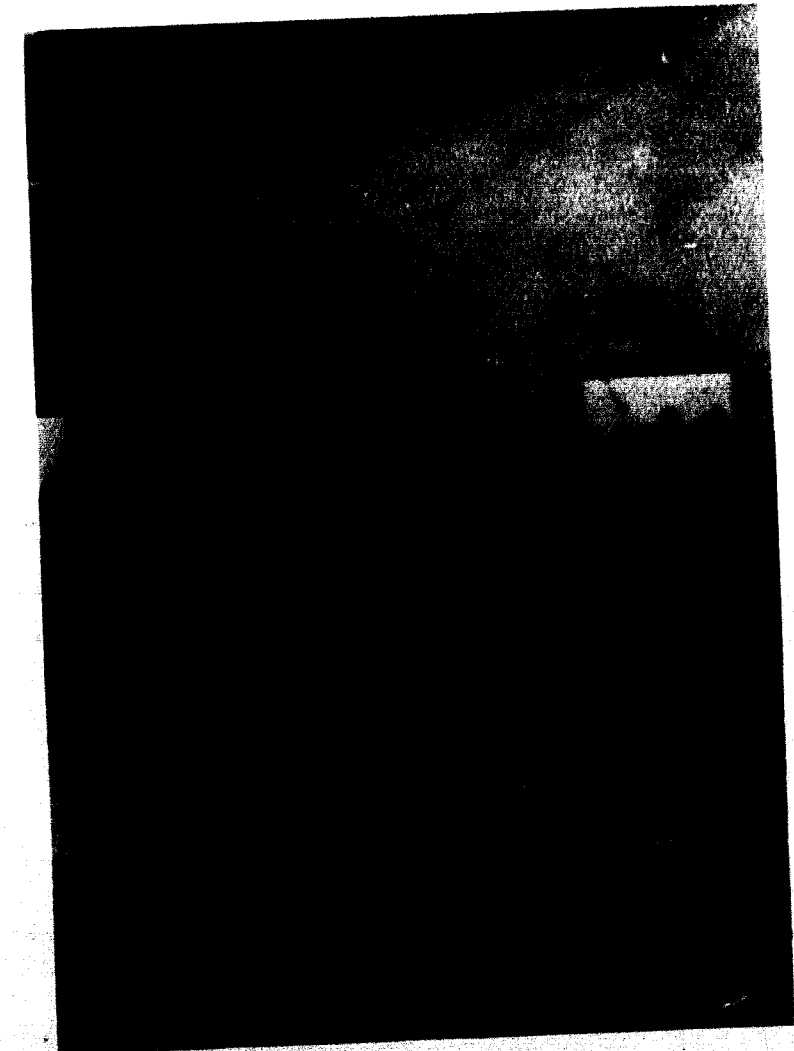
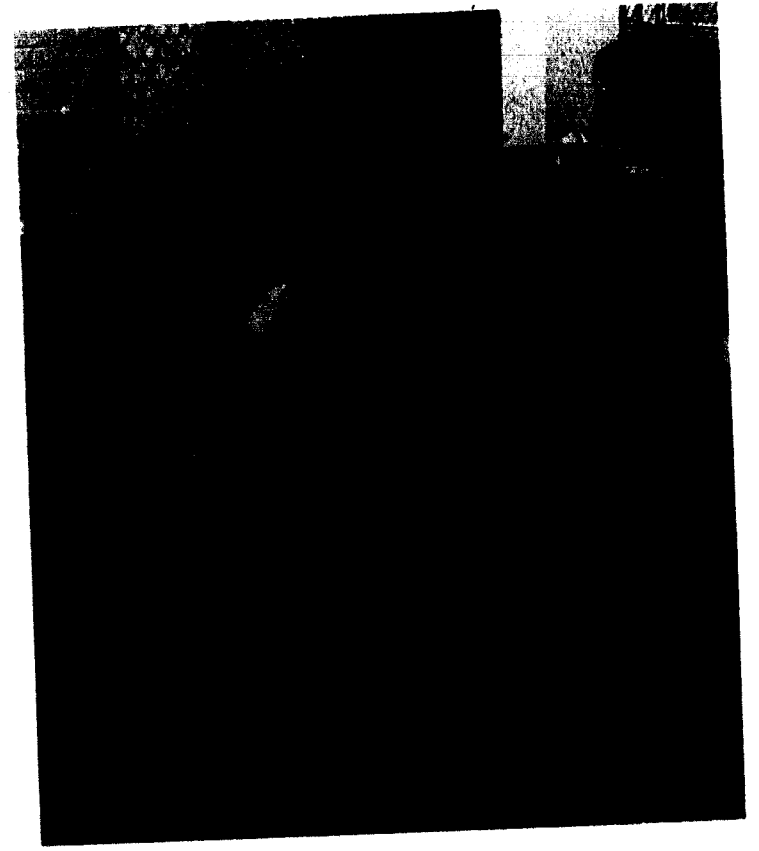

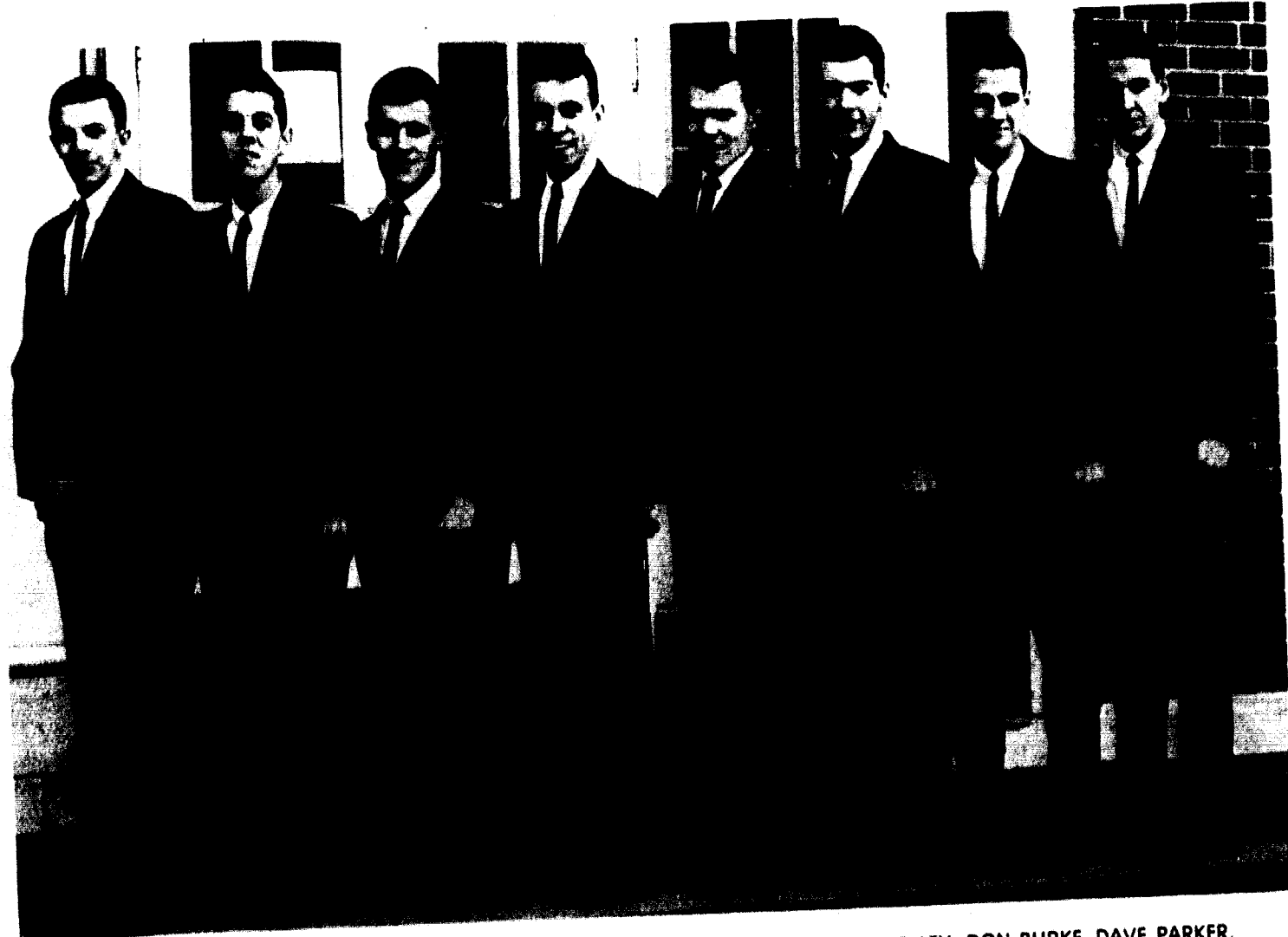

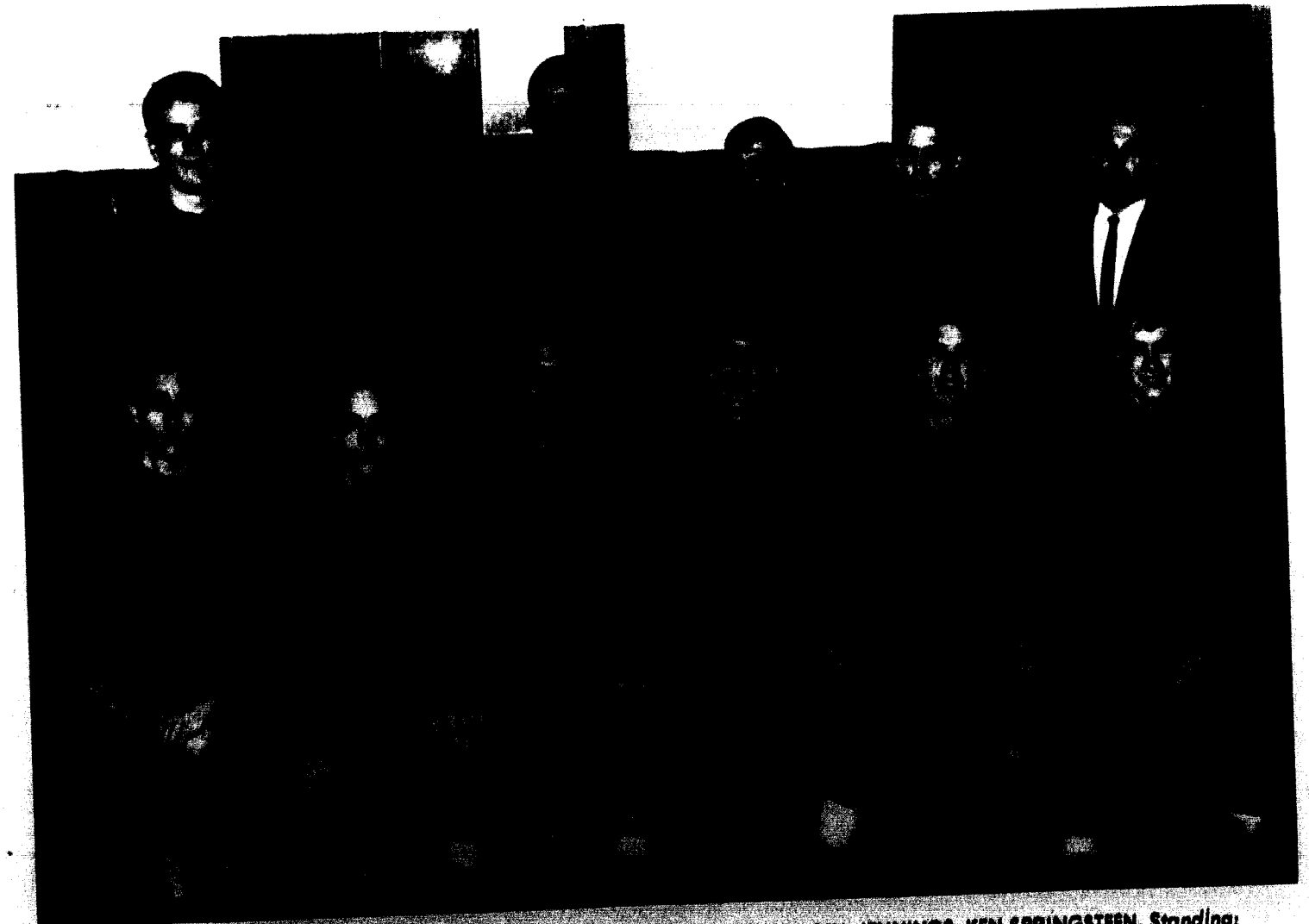

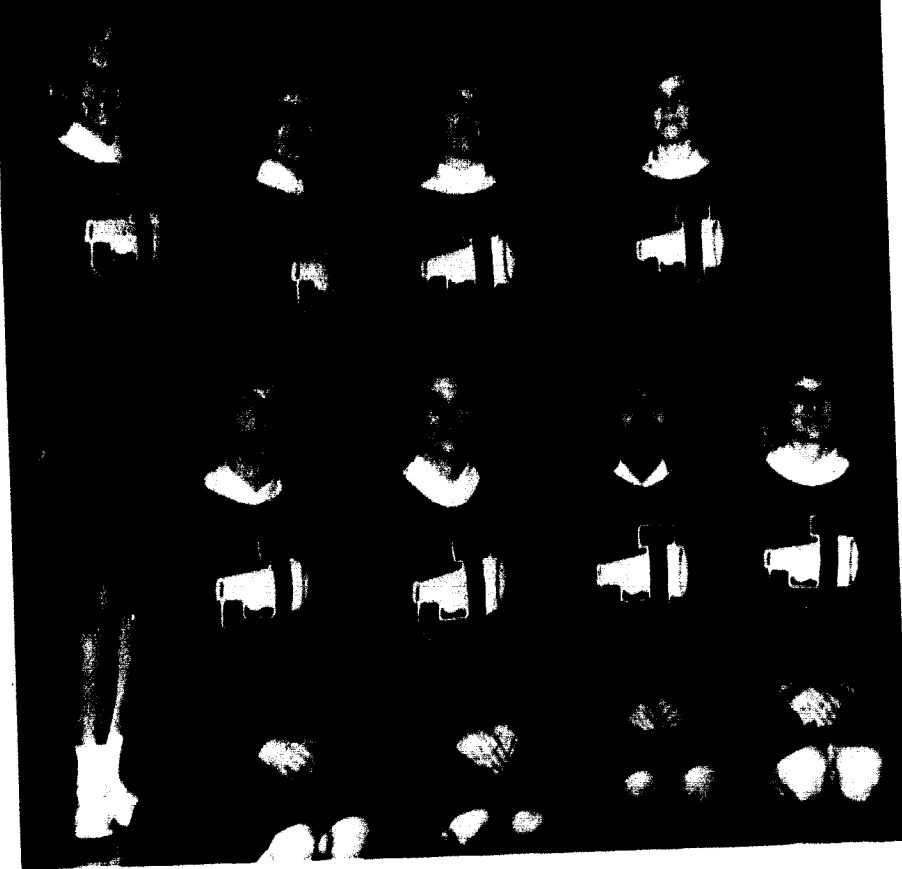

## History of Tatler Revue

A member of the dramatic group acted as stage manager and set up the order of the skits. The Tatler staff handled tickets, programs, and other business.

The Tatler Revue was a tremendous success, with enough money being made to finance the 1932 Tatler with a little left over. Since then Tatler Revue has grown to become a tradition that is appreciated and cherished by all who see or participate in Tatler Revue.
