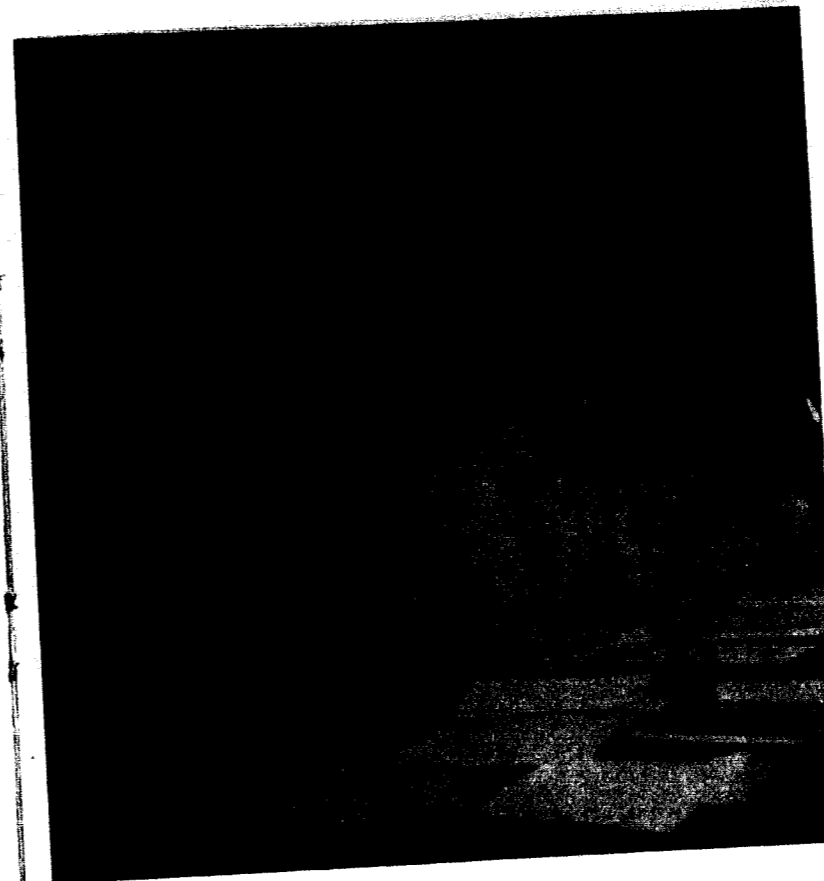
In the fall and winter a book exchange was conducted. Many students took advantage of the buses Senate sponsored to some of the away football games.

Other Senate activities included the adoption of a new constitution and cooperating with Dr. Kingsley's office in sending bi-monthly information packages to our overseas students.

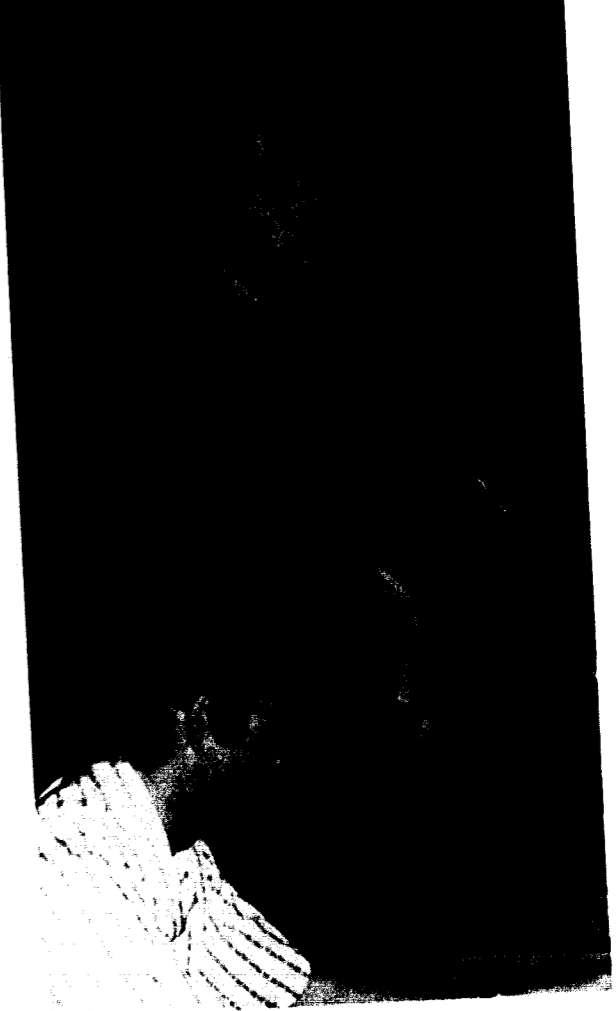

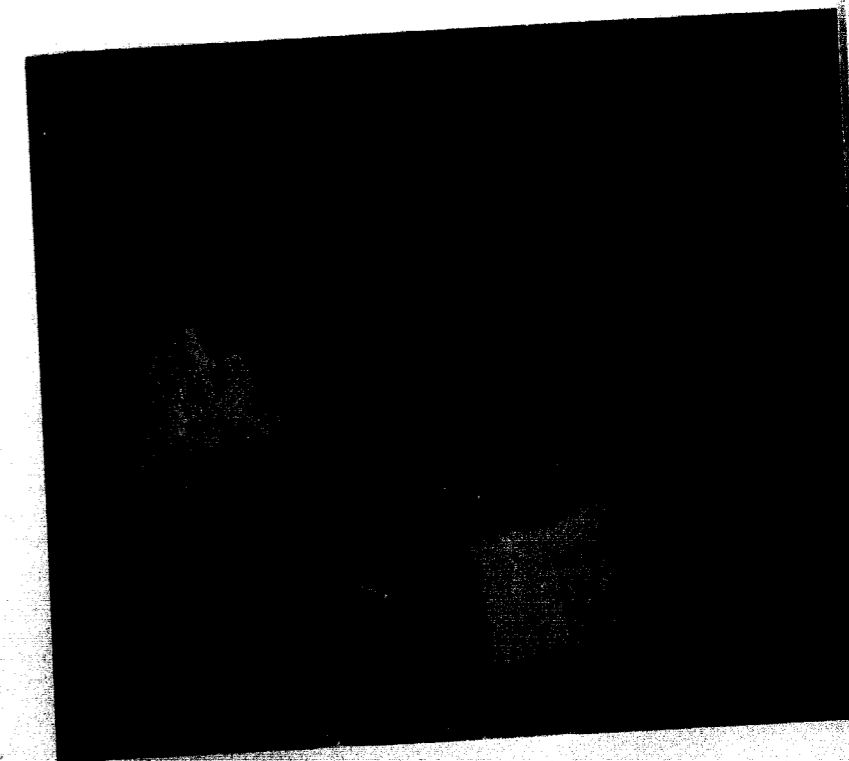

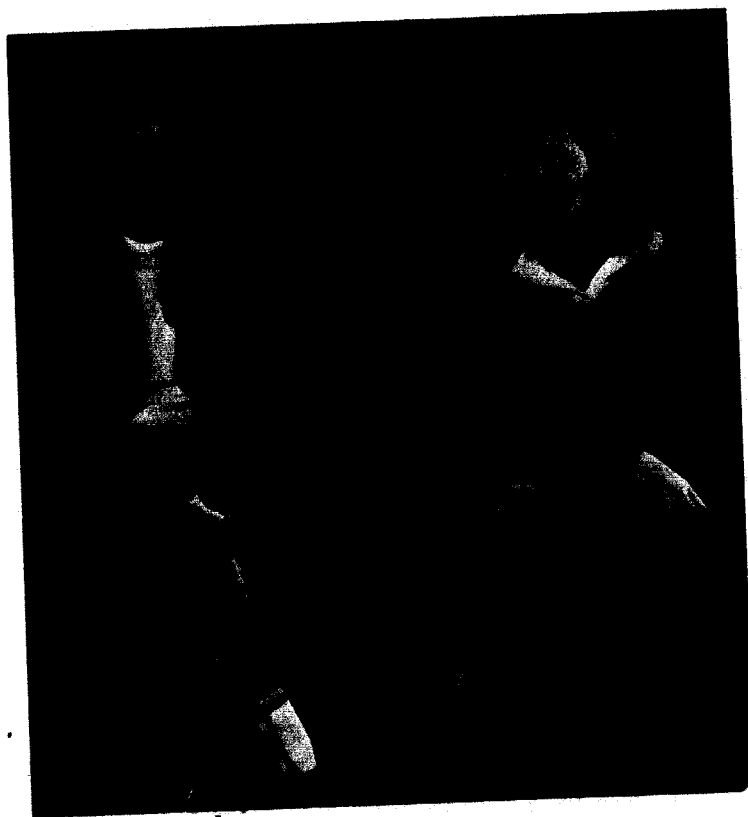

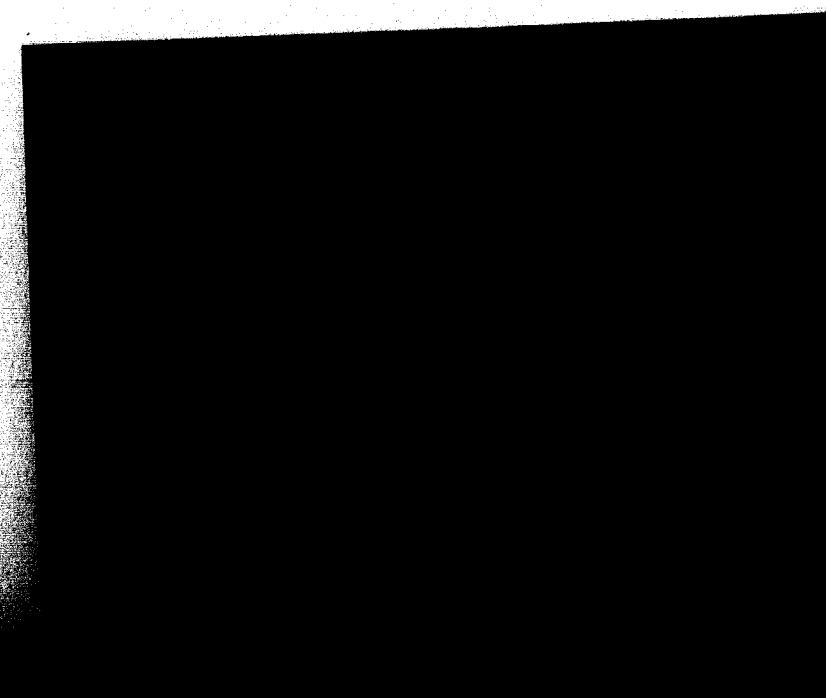


Cardinelles

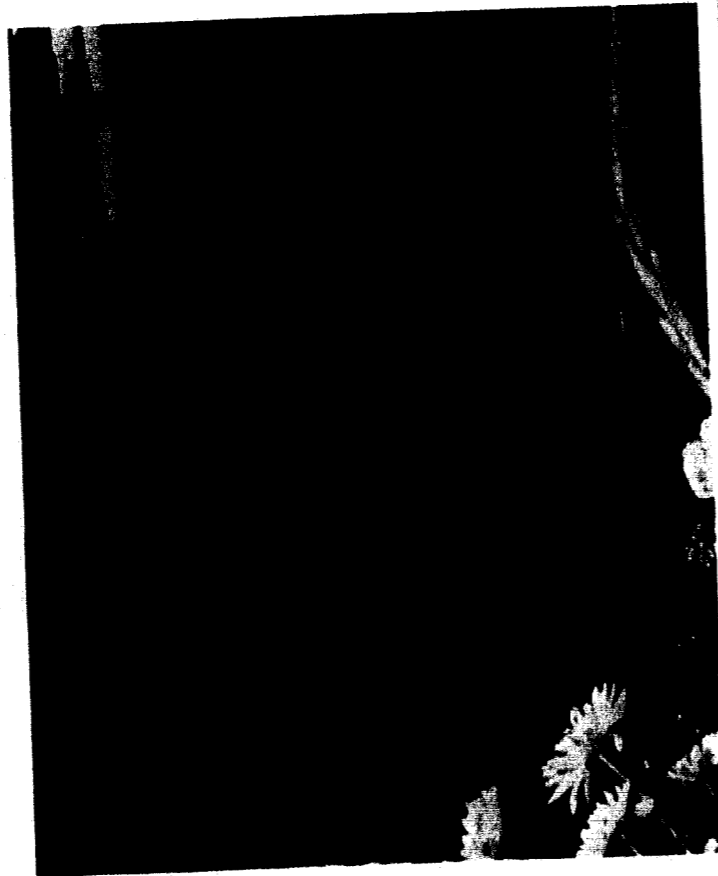

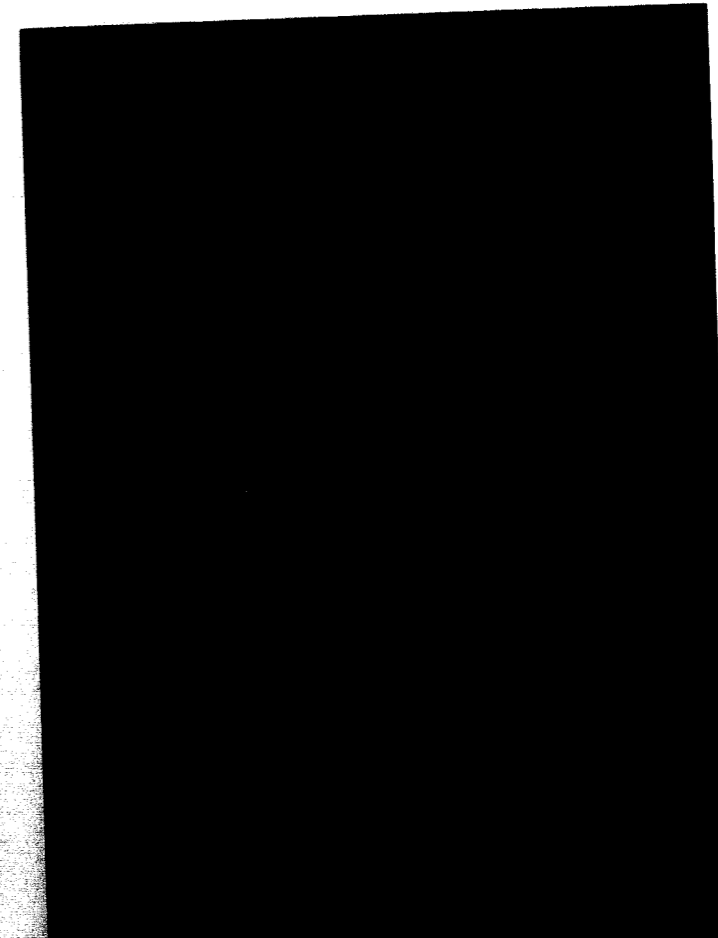

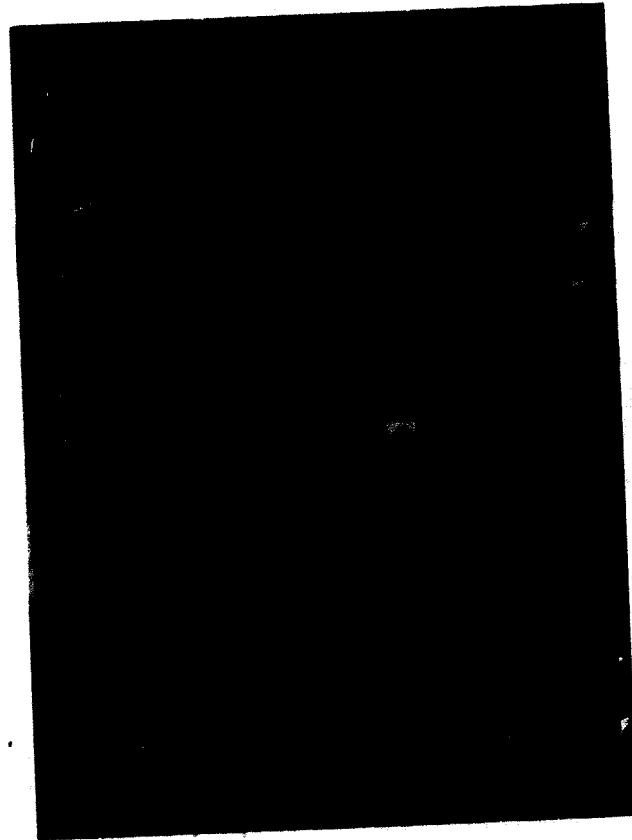

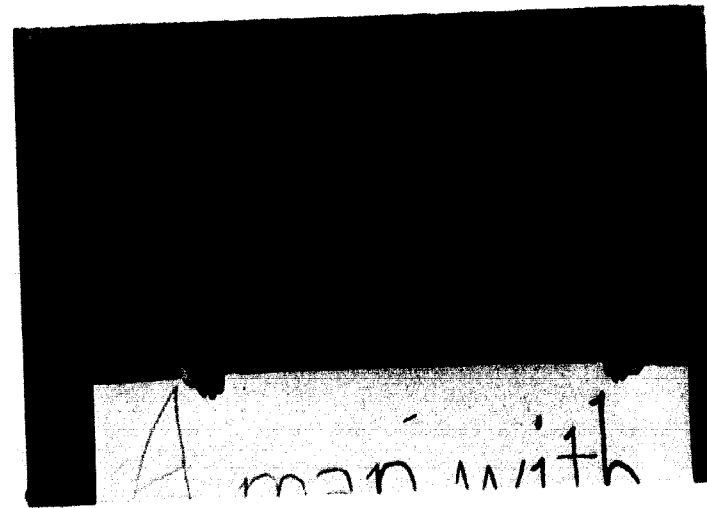

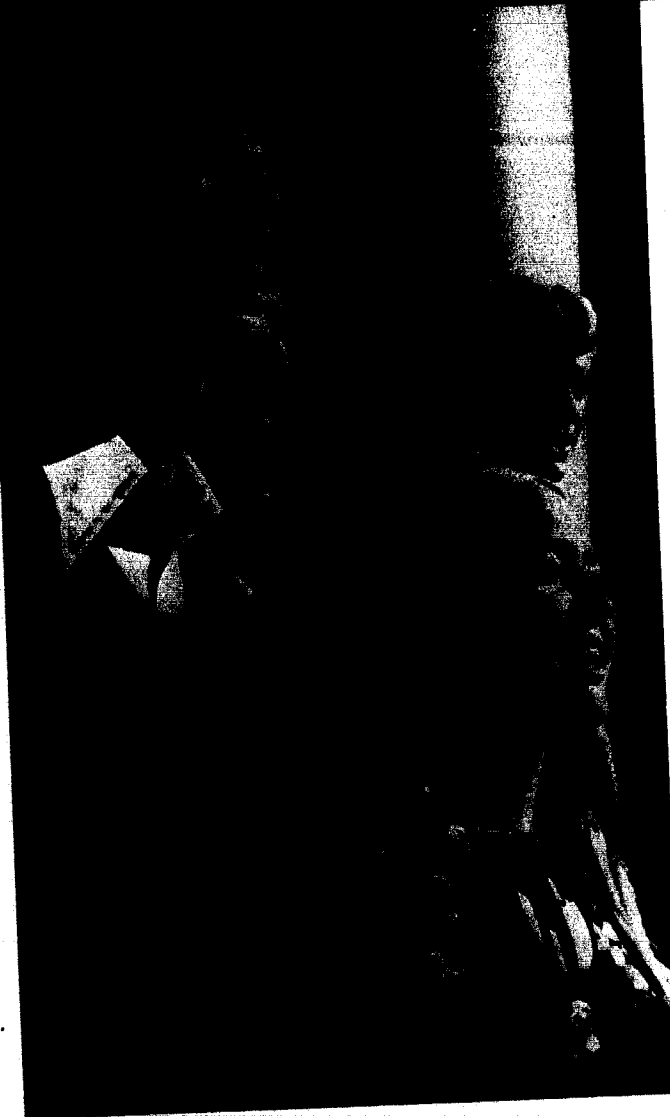

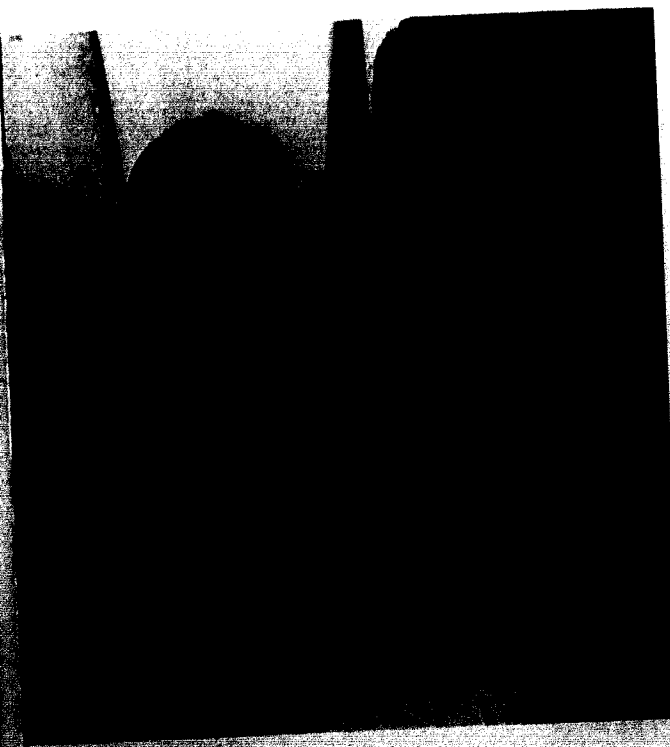

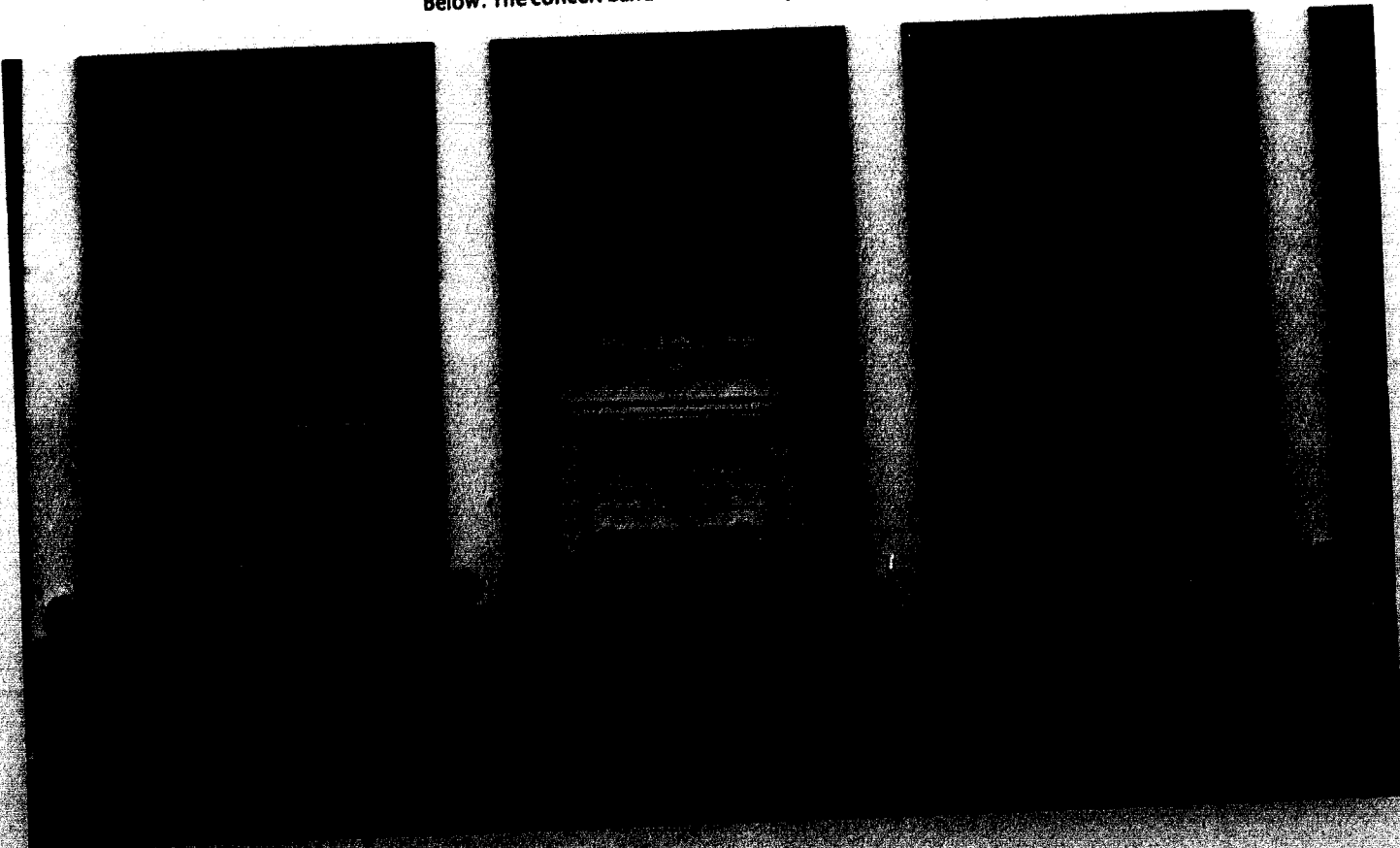

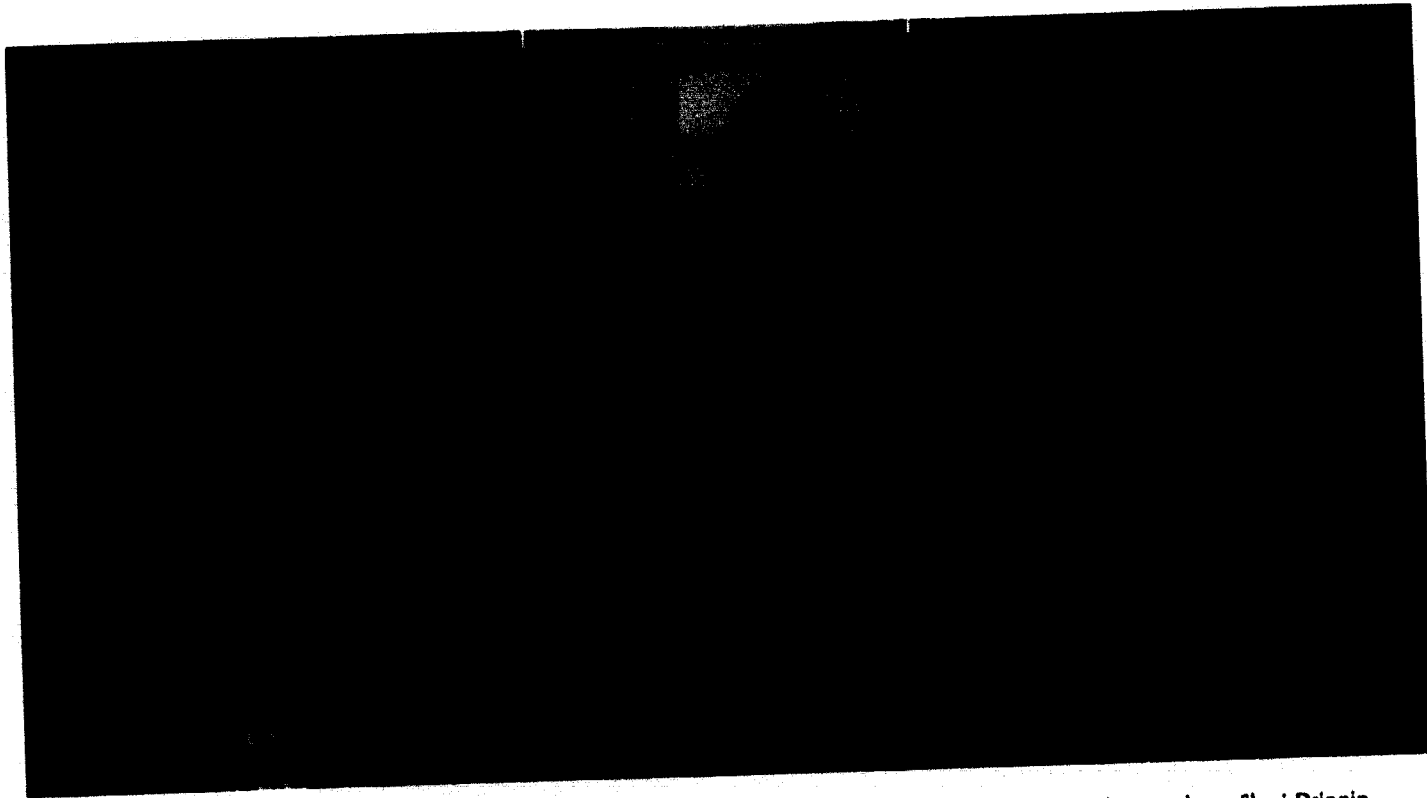

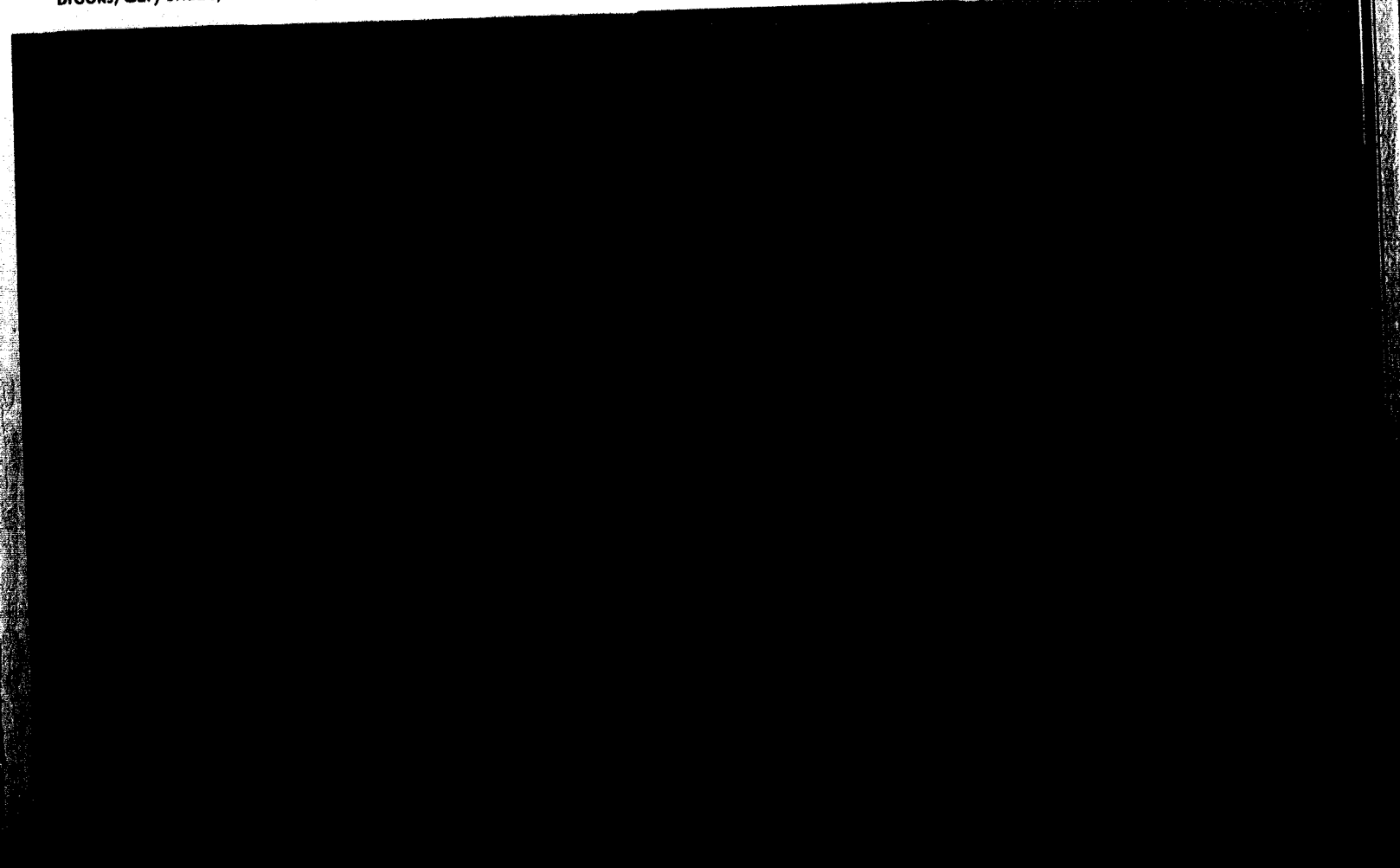


Society of Physics Students And ΣΠΣ

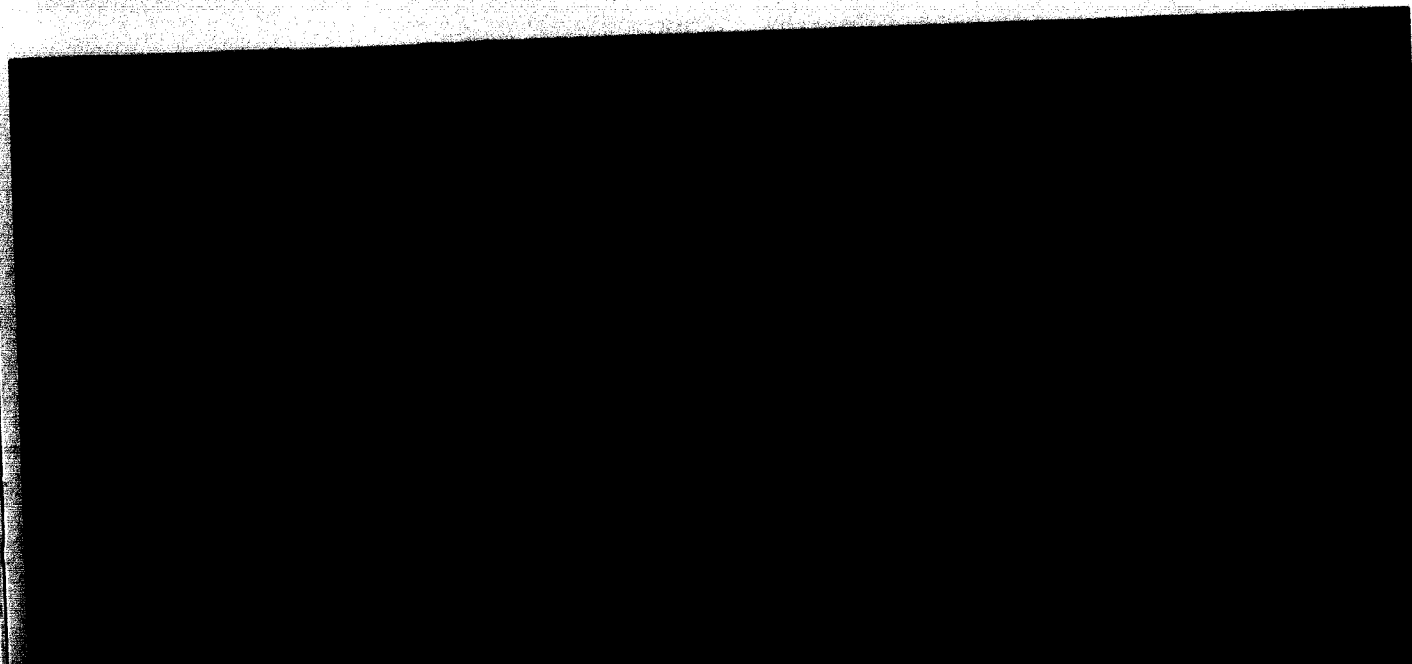
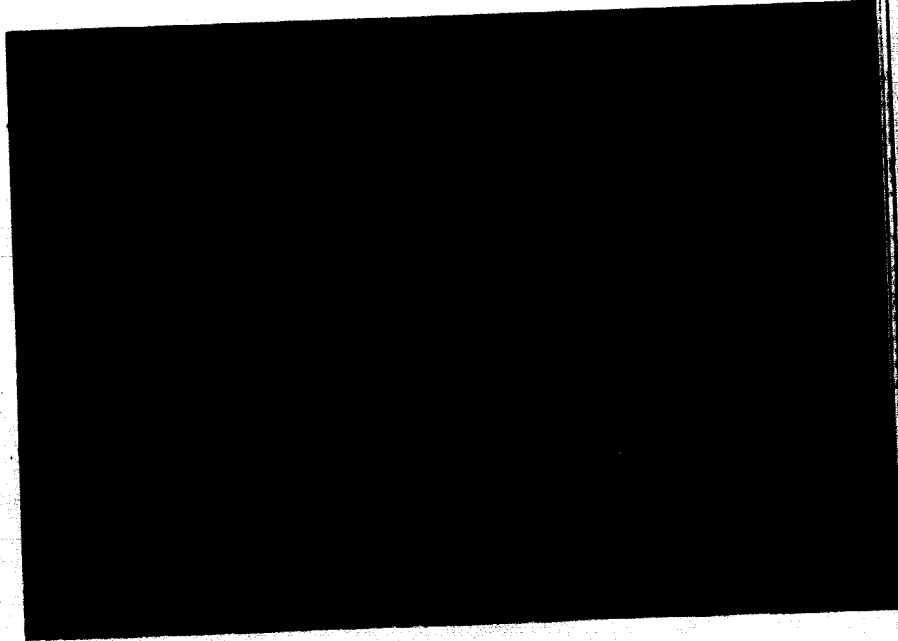
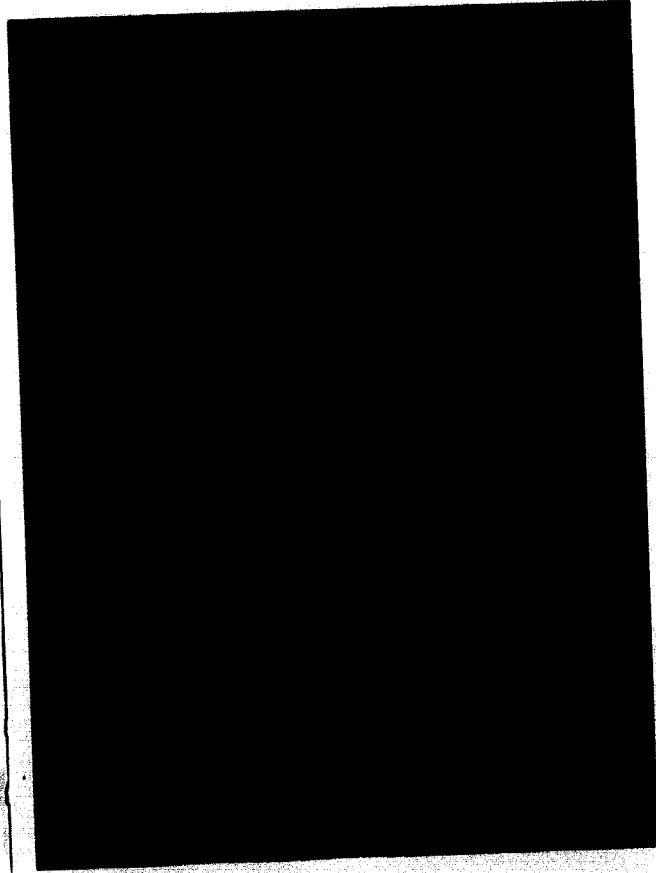


Pi Gamma Mu

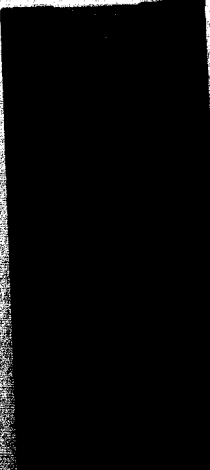
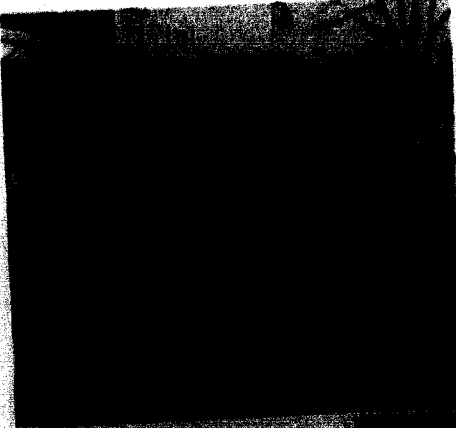
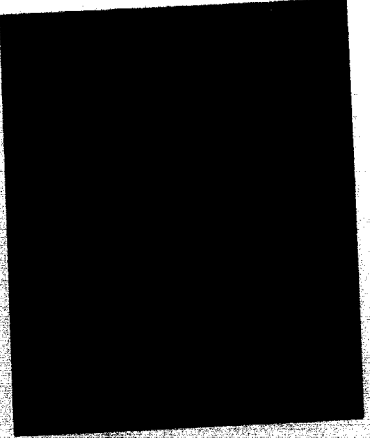
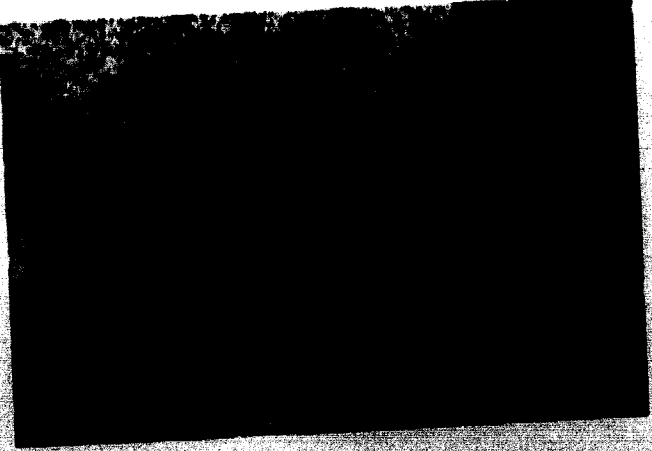
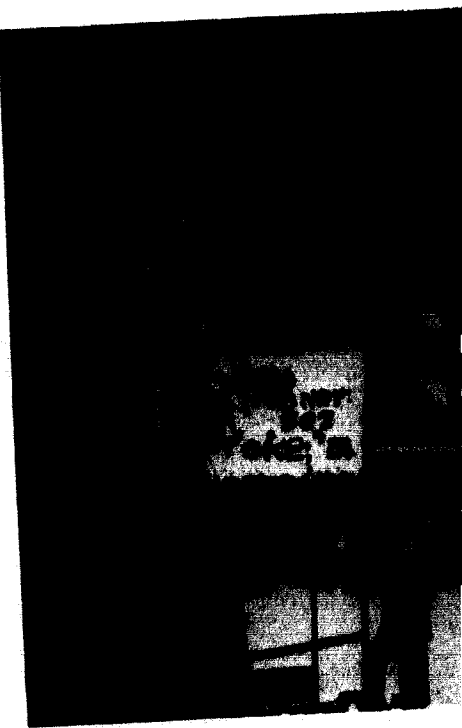
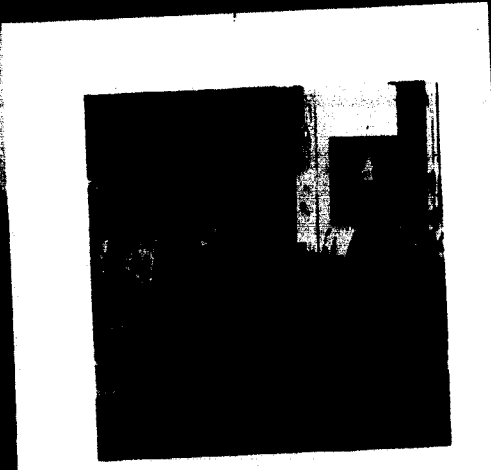
"Cardinal Comics" Homecoming '73

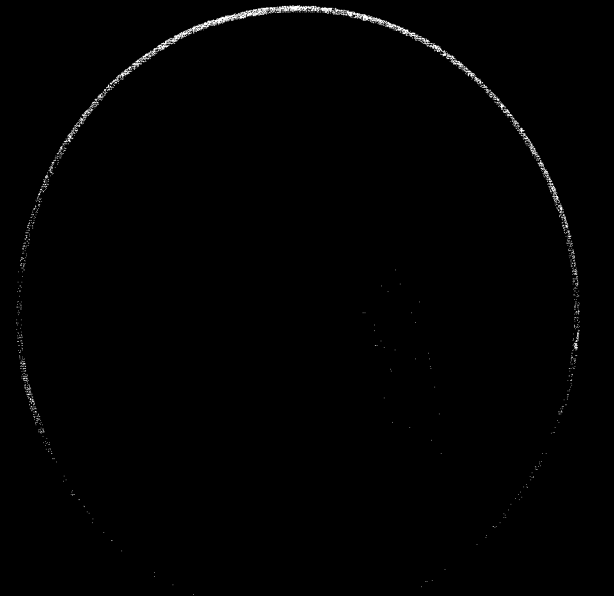
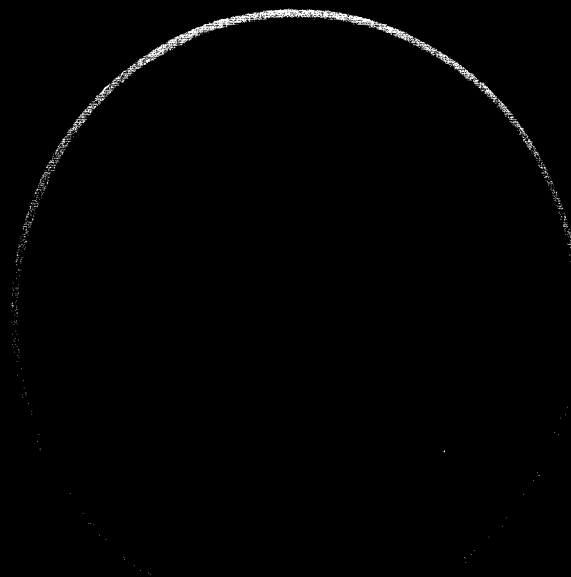
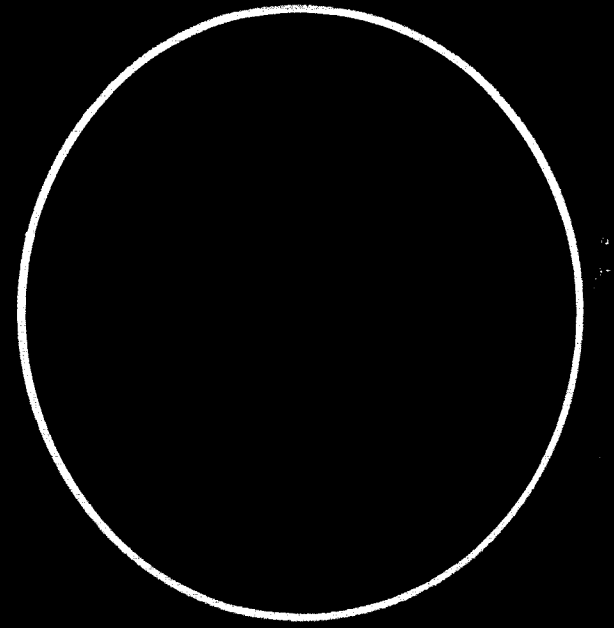
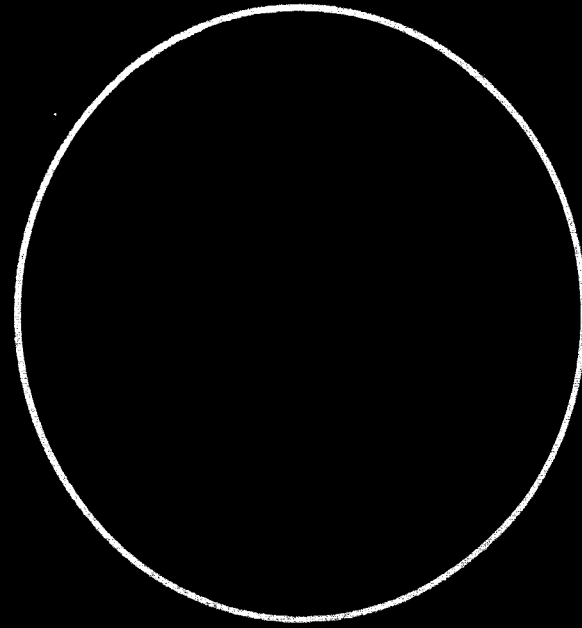
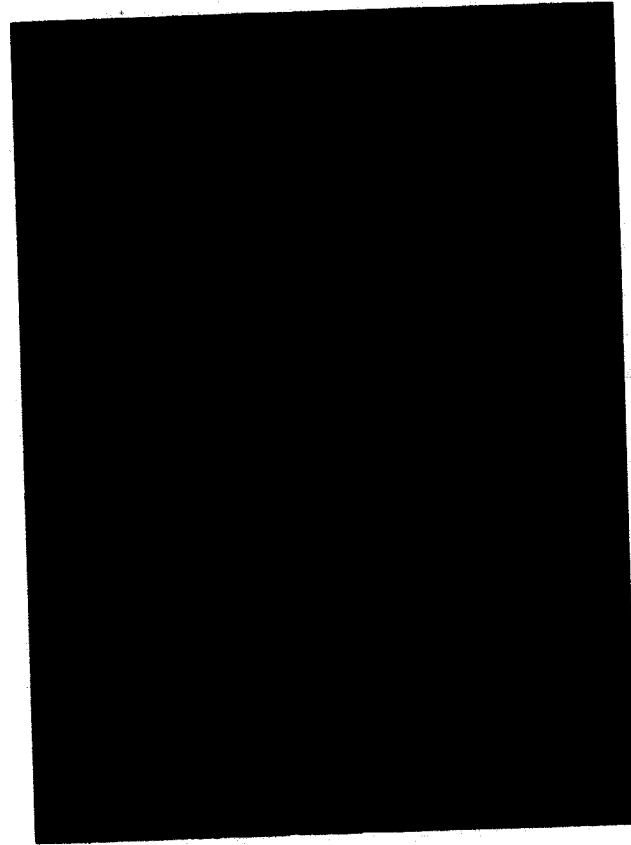
Achievement Day

ZTA And ΦΓΔ — Second Place



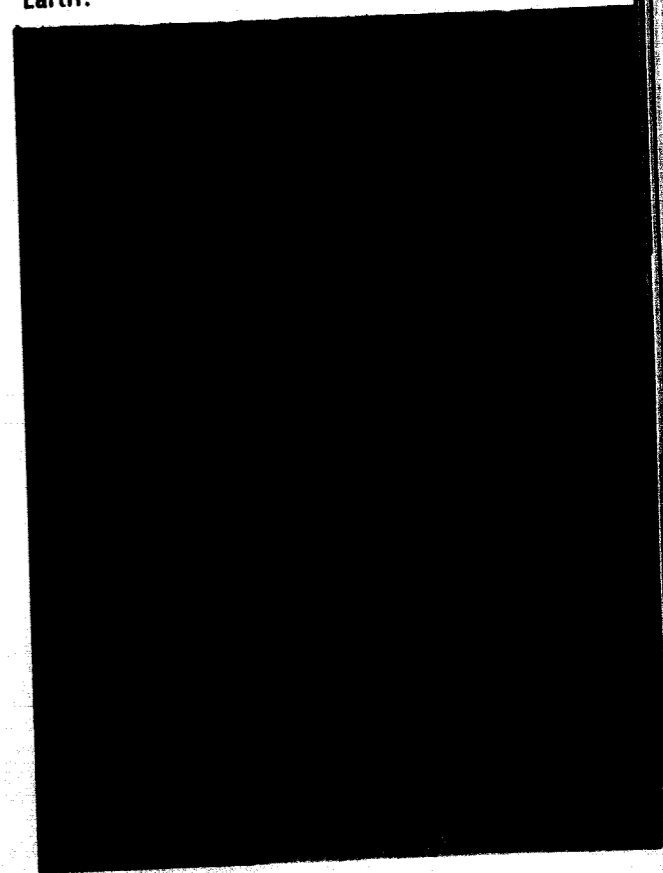

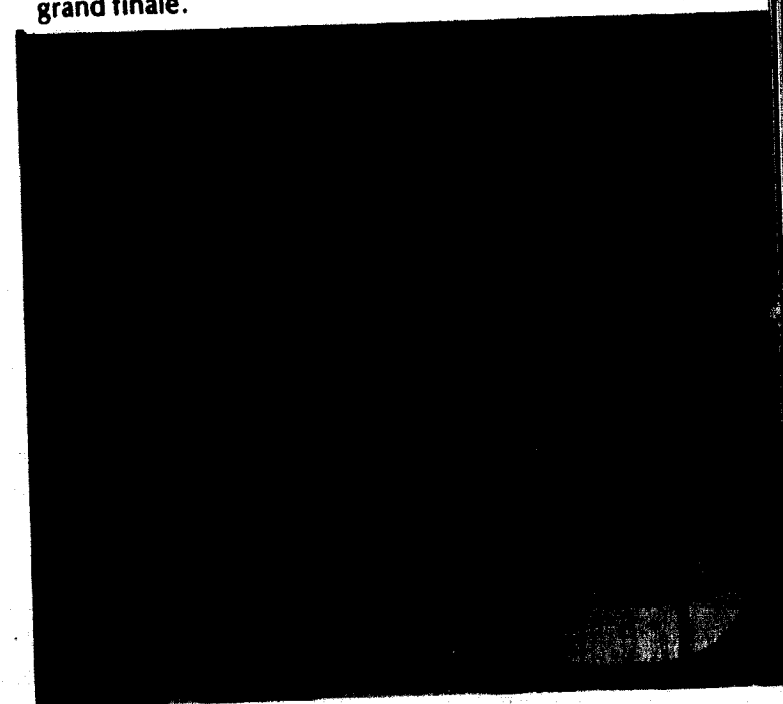
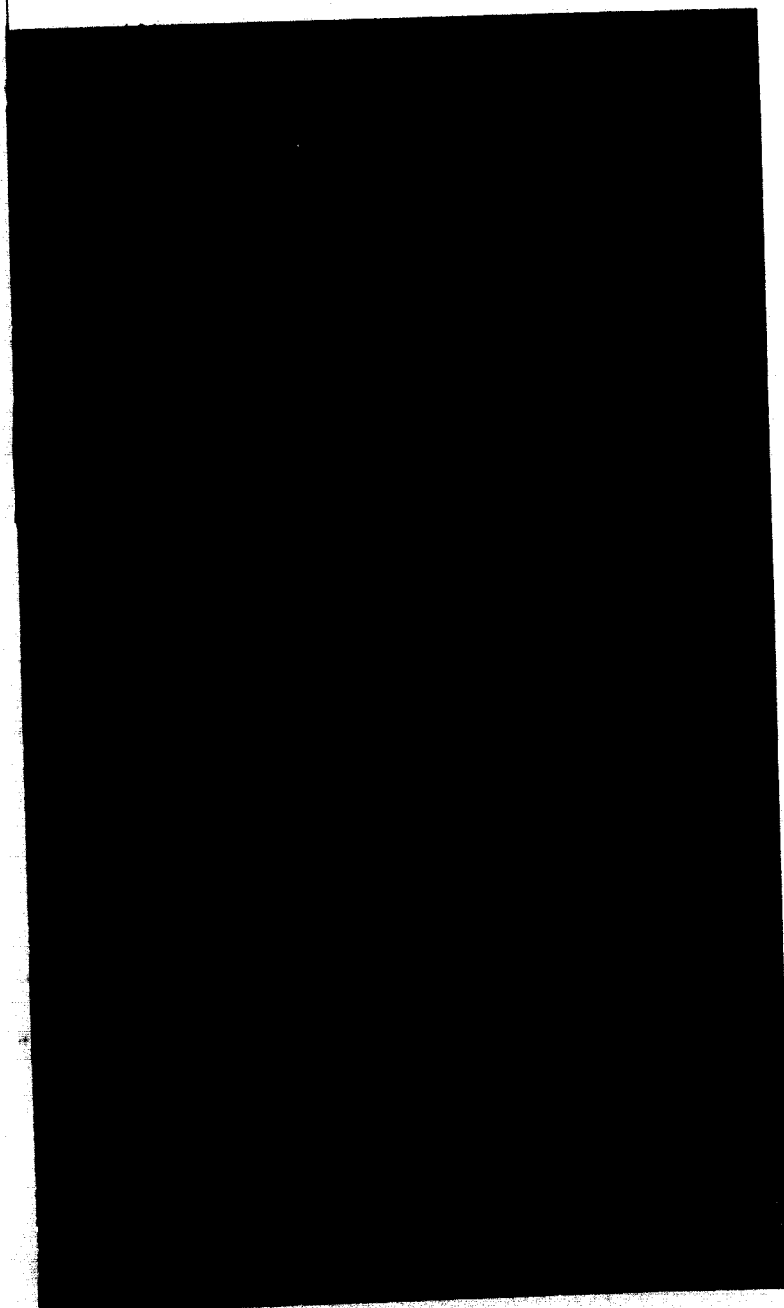
Non-Affiliates

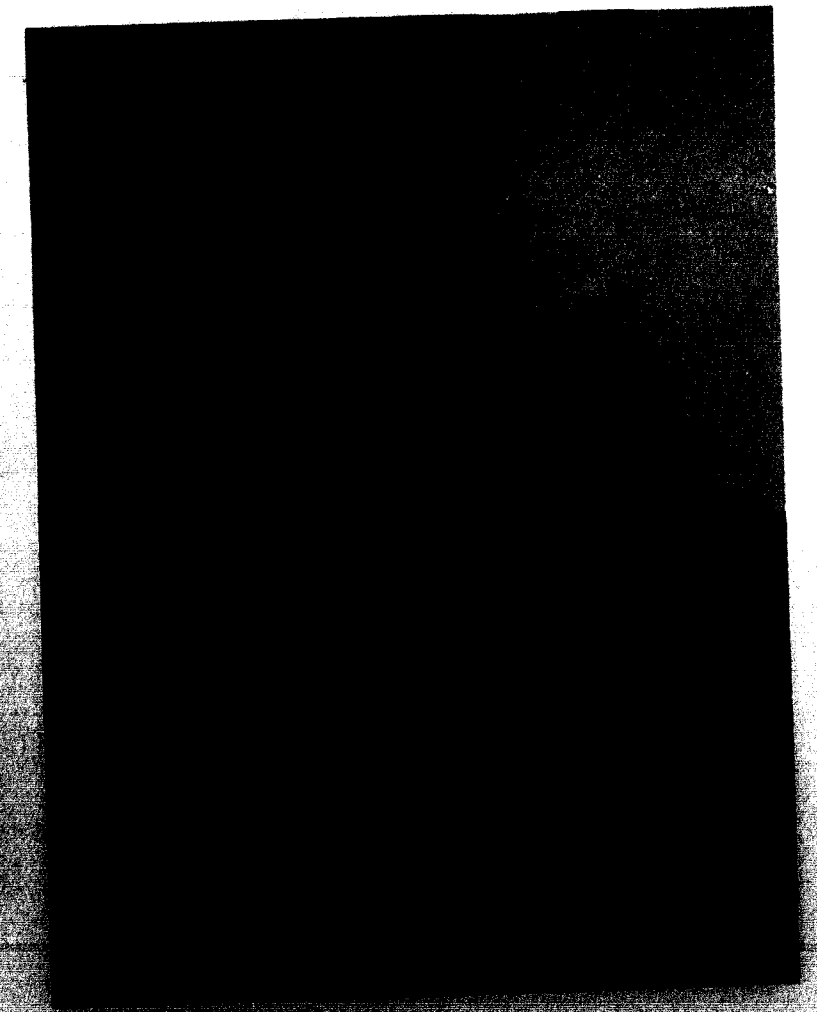
All major productions were extra-curricular and tryouts were open to all. Approximately 200 students participated or were involved in some way.

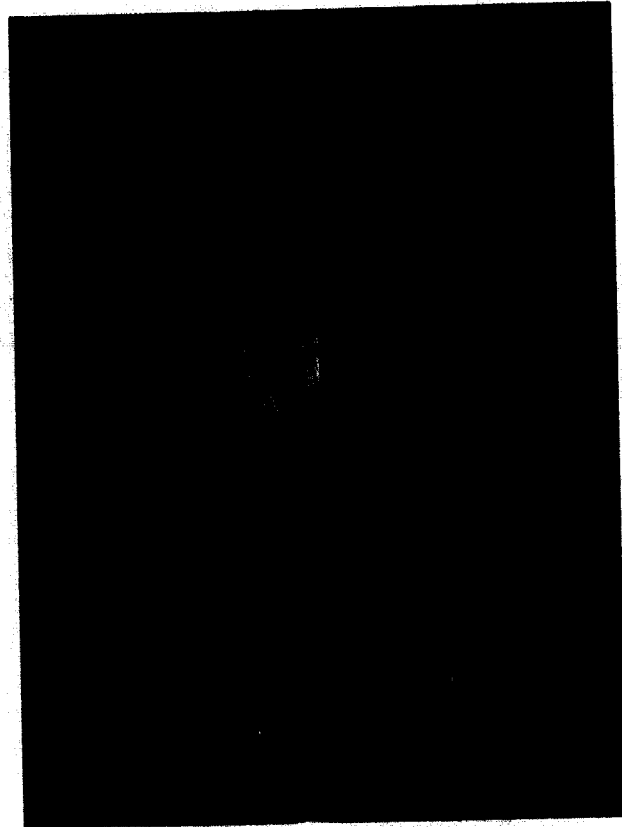


Laurie Schwamb in her own production for Theatre II.

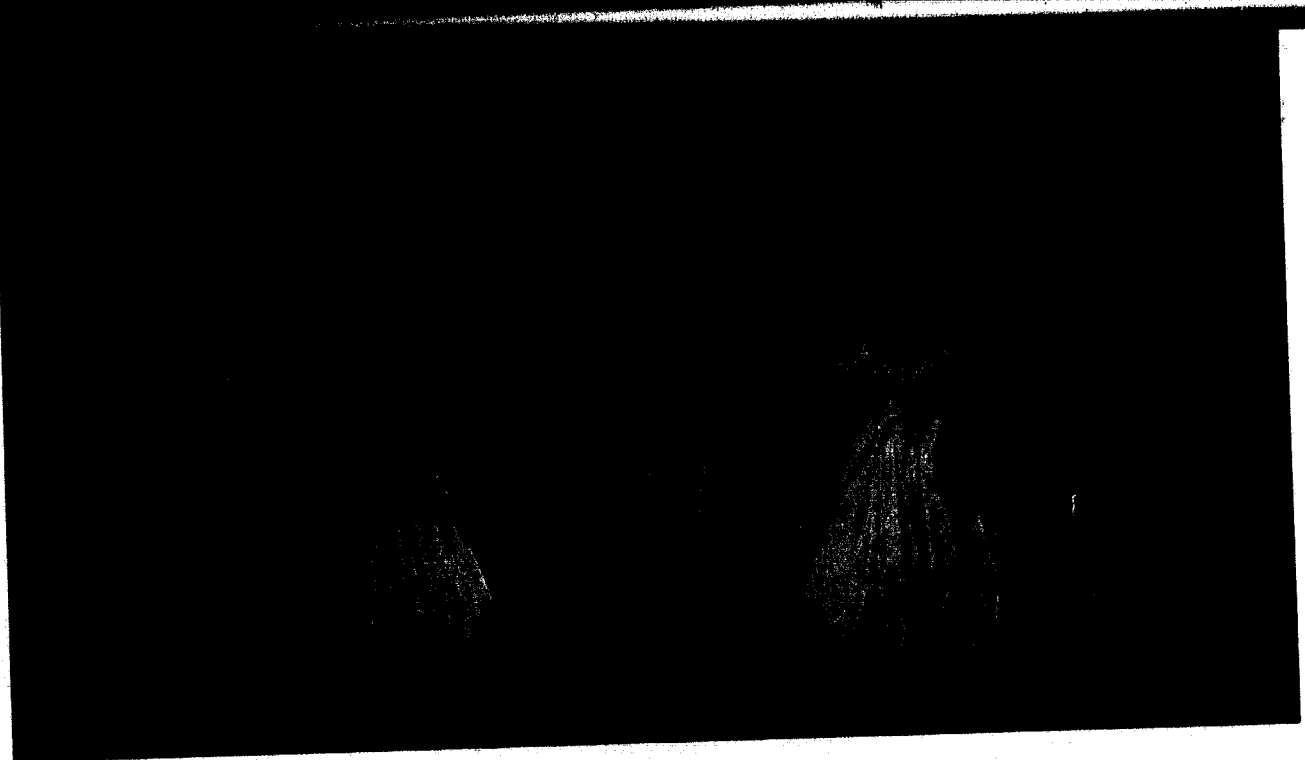


A Potpourri of Opera

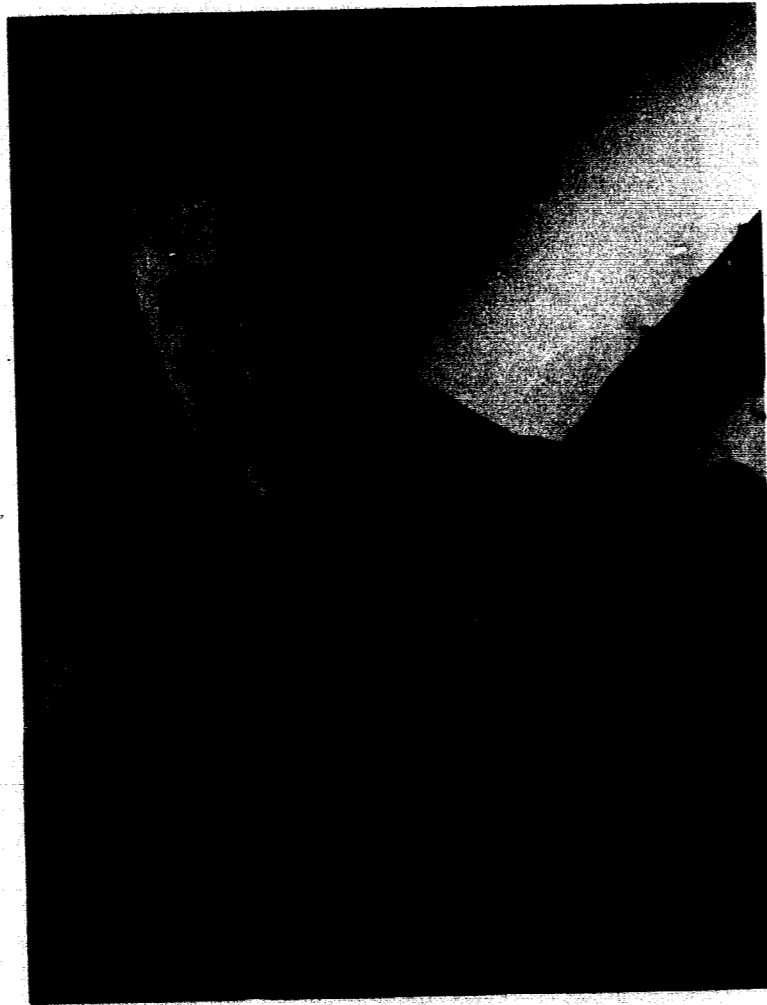

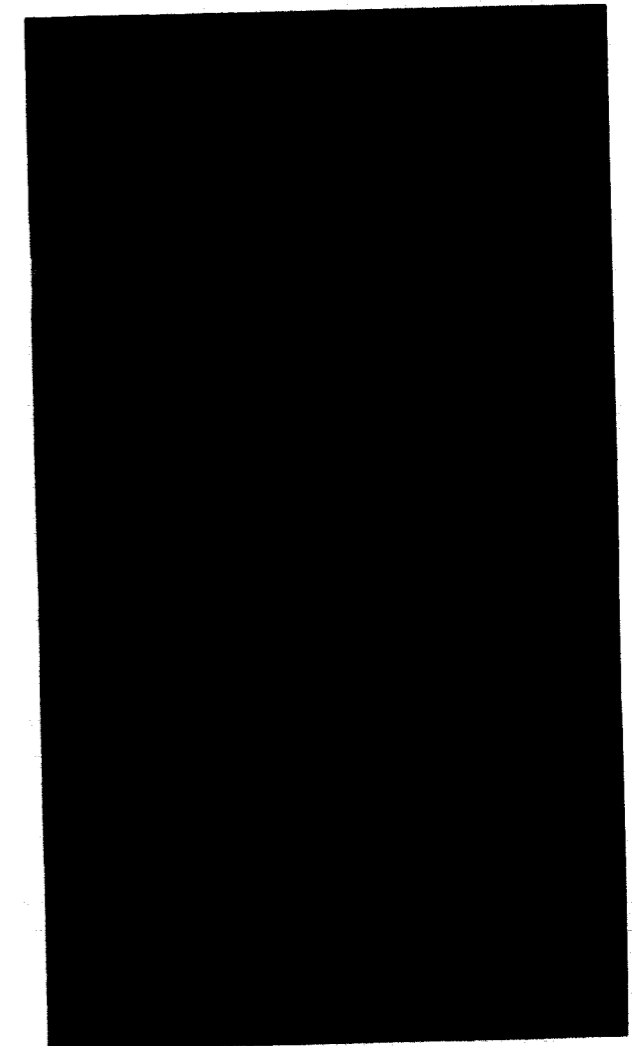
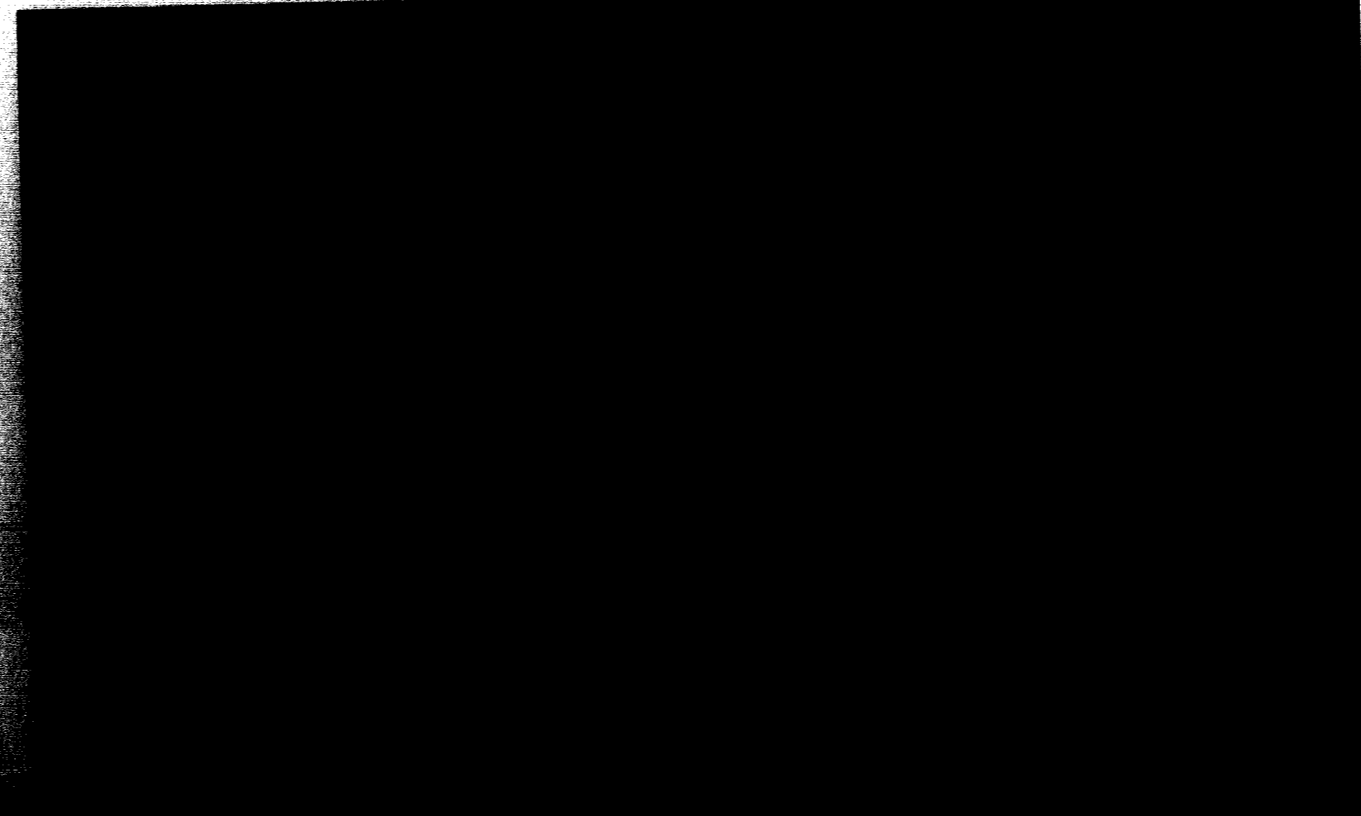


Winterims

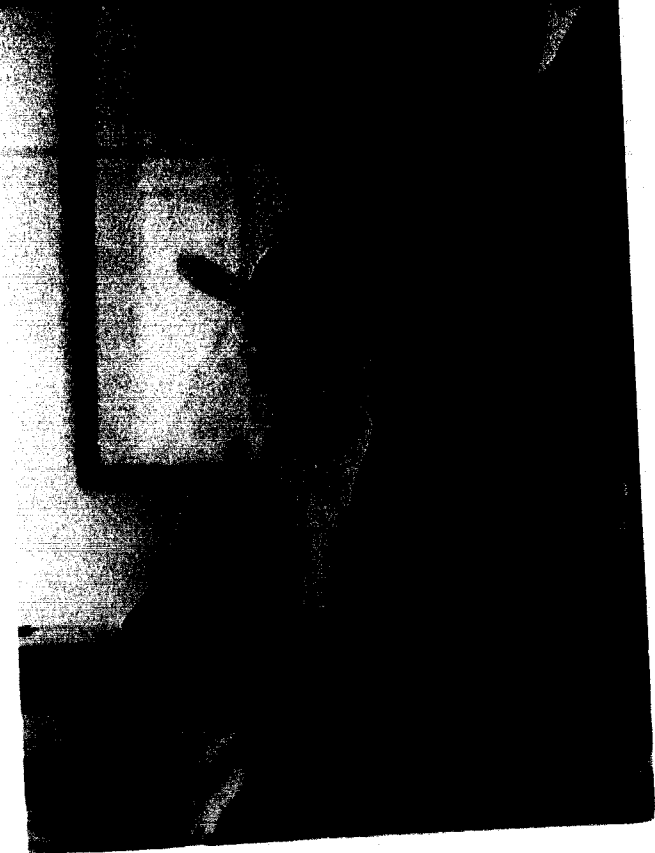

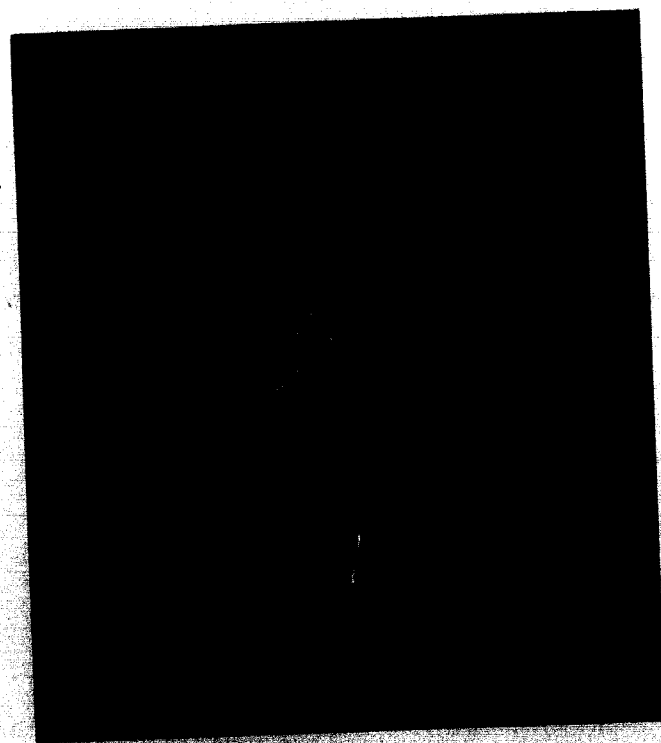

James Crane was chosen for the second team all district and honorable mention included Bullock, Teegarden and Taylor.

Mineral Water Bowl honors went to John Strada, most valuable lineman, and Weader Millentree, most valuable back.

John Strada and Dan Cox were the team's co-captains for this year. The 1974 team has chosen Jerry Owens, Dal Overton, and Mike Griffin as the new tri-captains.

This year's team was young since most were freshmen and sophomores, but, with a year of competition behind them, next year should be even better.

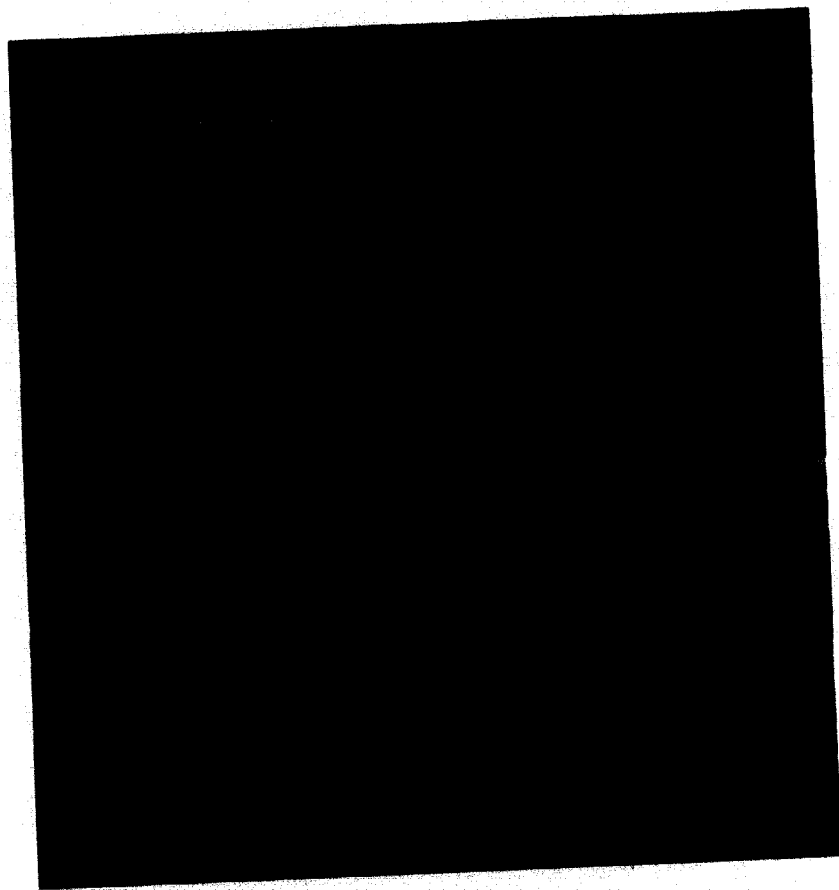

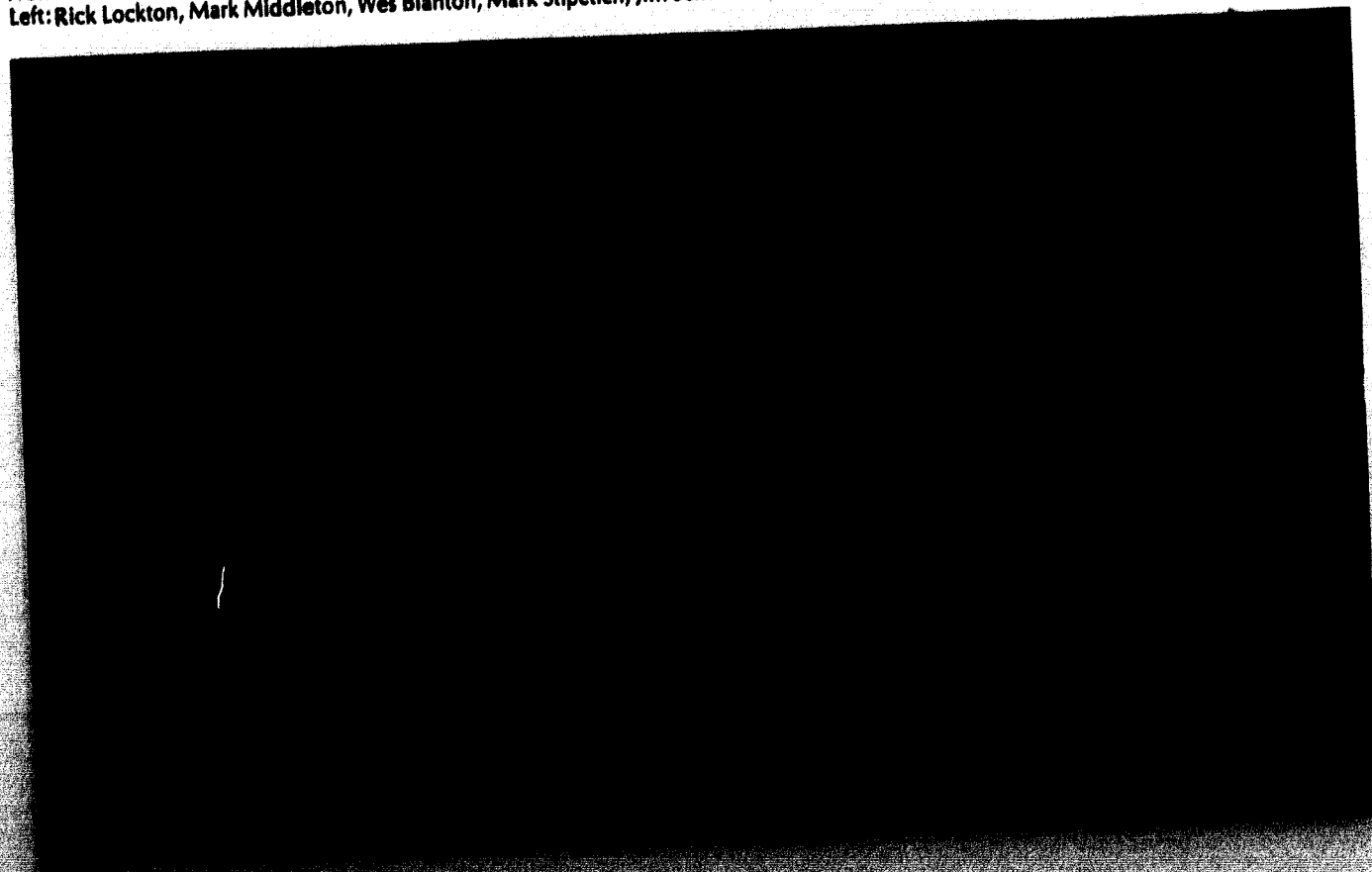
Baseball

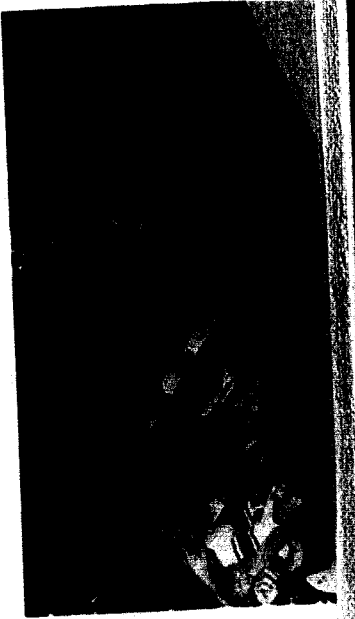


Above: Chuck Harrelson prepares for a smash to the back corner. Below: Gerry Williams successfully returns a winning backhand.

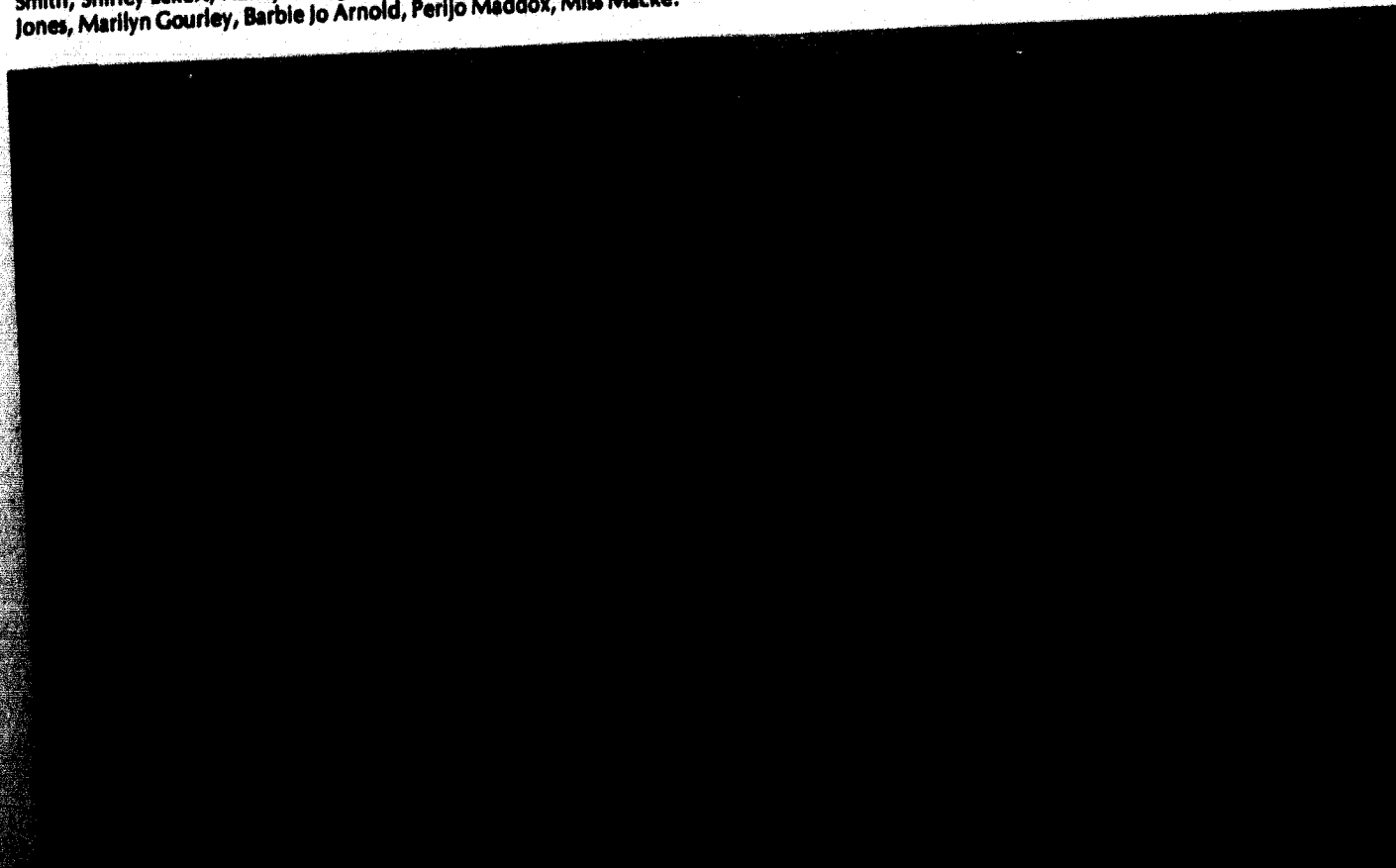
The women's volleyball team successfully completed their second year of intercollegiate competition. Besides their 7-5 season record, they also took third in the first state tournament for small colleges.
