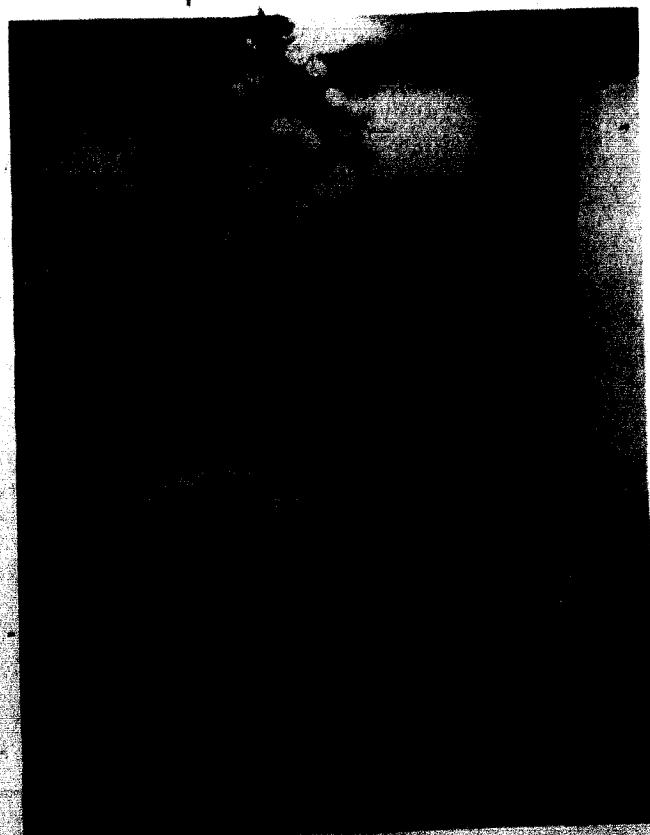


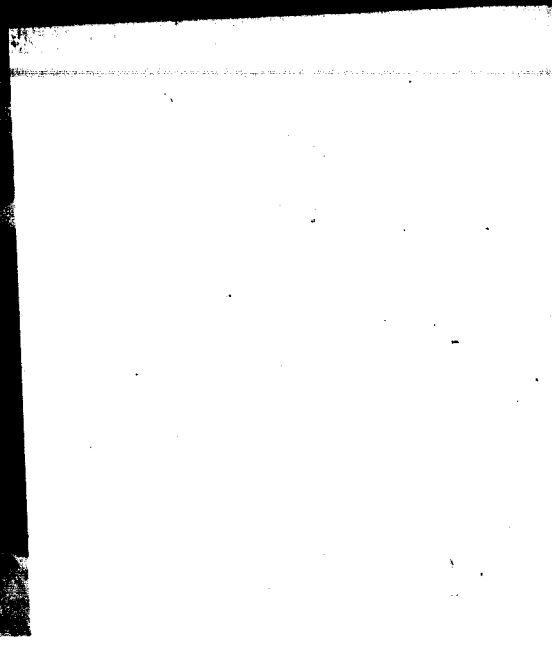
College offers many opportunities. The path of learning is one of the world's most taxing and challenging, yet undoubtedly the most rewarding.

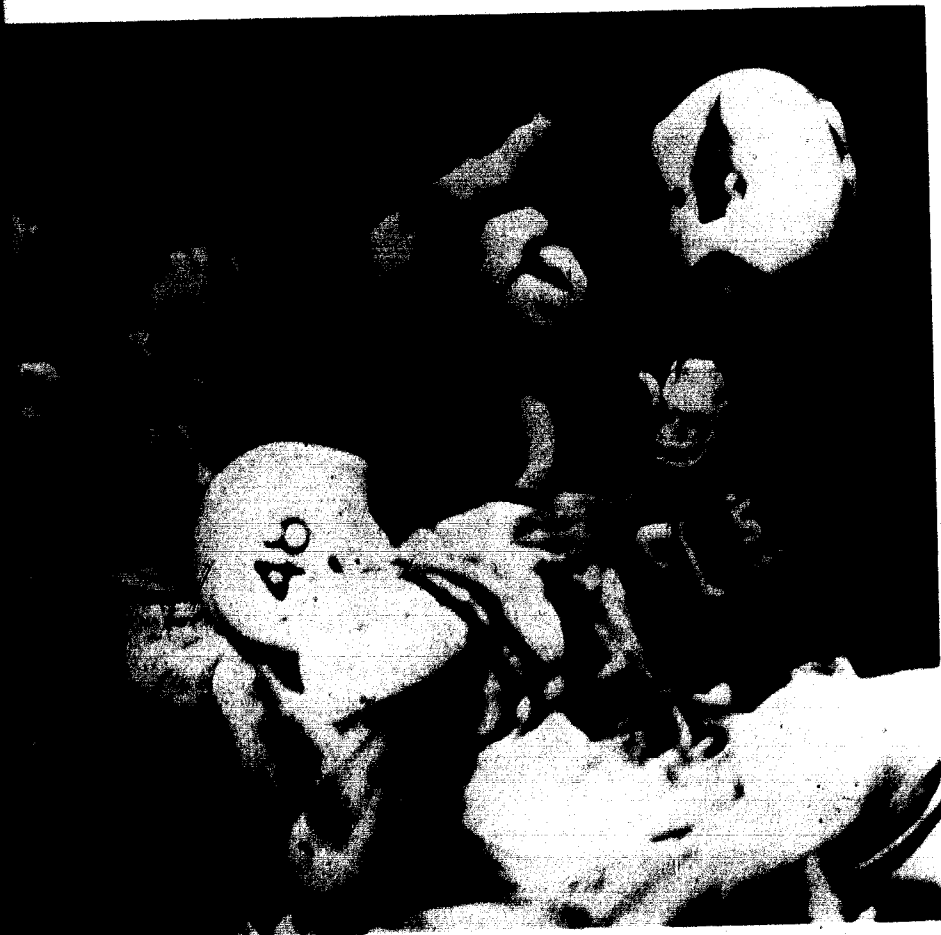

Patterson the cards won six, lost two and tied their final game. This record was remarkable considering the fact that the team was injury plagued. Basketball Team Captures M.C.A.U. Title

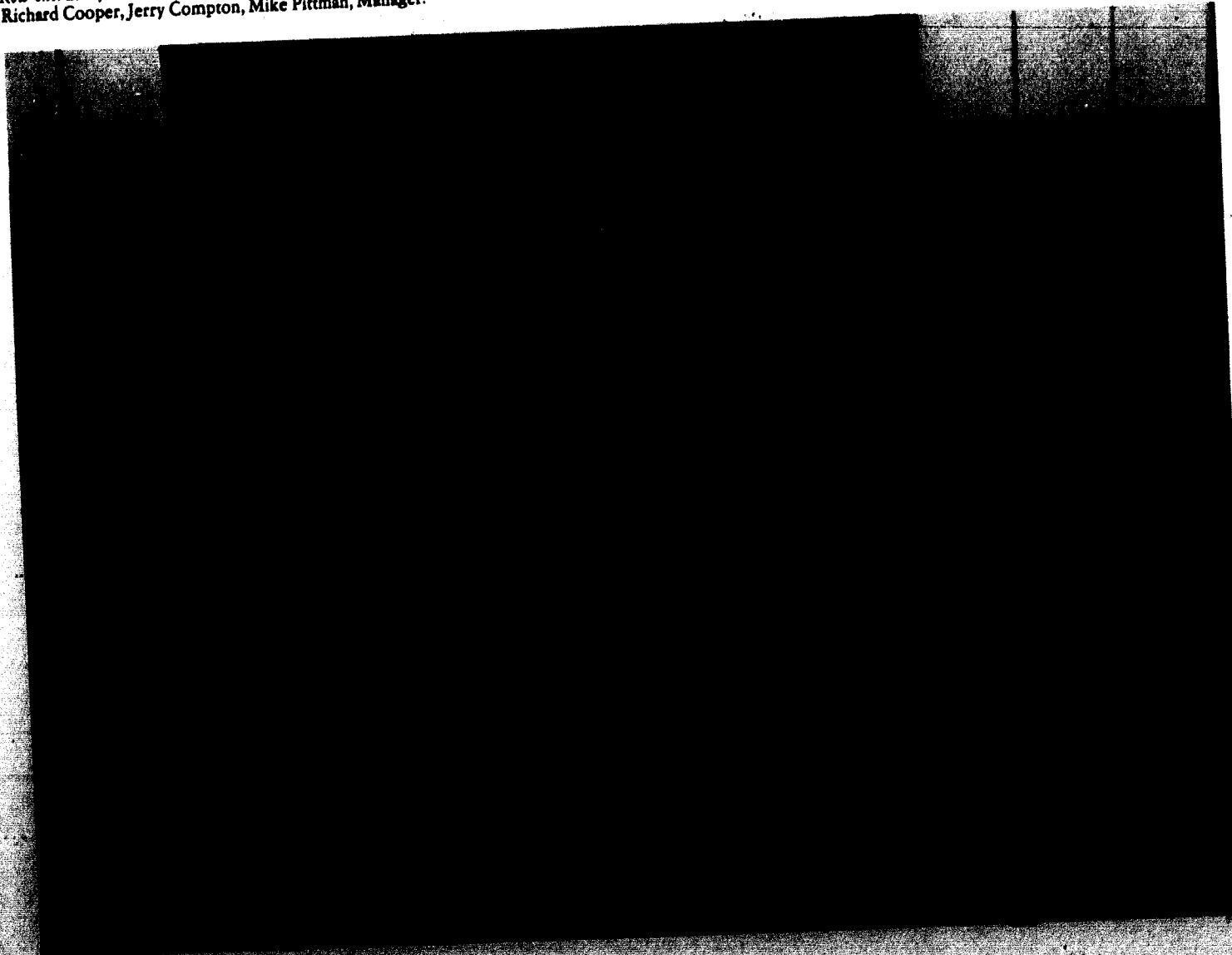
This year the Cards broke even on the court with a 14-14 record. The over-all season was not bad when viewed in the light of the competition faced by the team. Teams which presented the stiffest competition were Drake University and North Texas State of the Missouri Valley Conference, and the first and second place winners of the N.A.I.A. Tournament, Rockhurst and Pan-American, respectively.

The team recaptured the M.C.A.U. Conference cham-

pionship with a 12-2 record. The team's success during this season was mainly due to the balance of power within the team as the top five men maintained an average of better than 10 points per game.

The outlook for next season is unusually bright with only two men graduating, co-captains Terry Scott and Ron Tiemeyer.

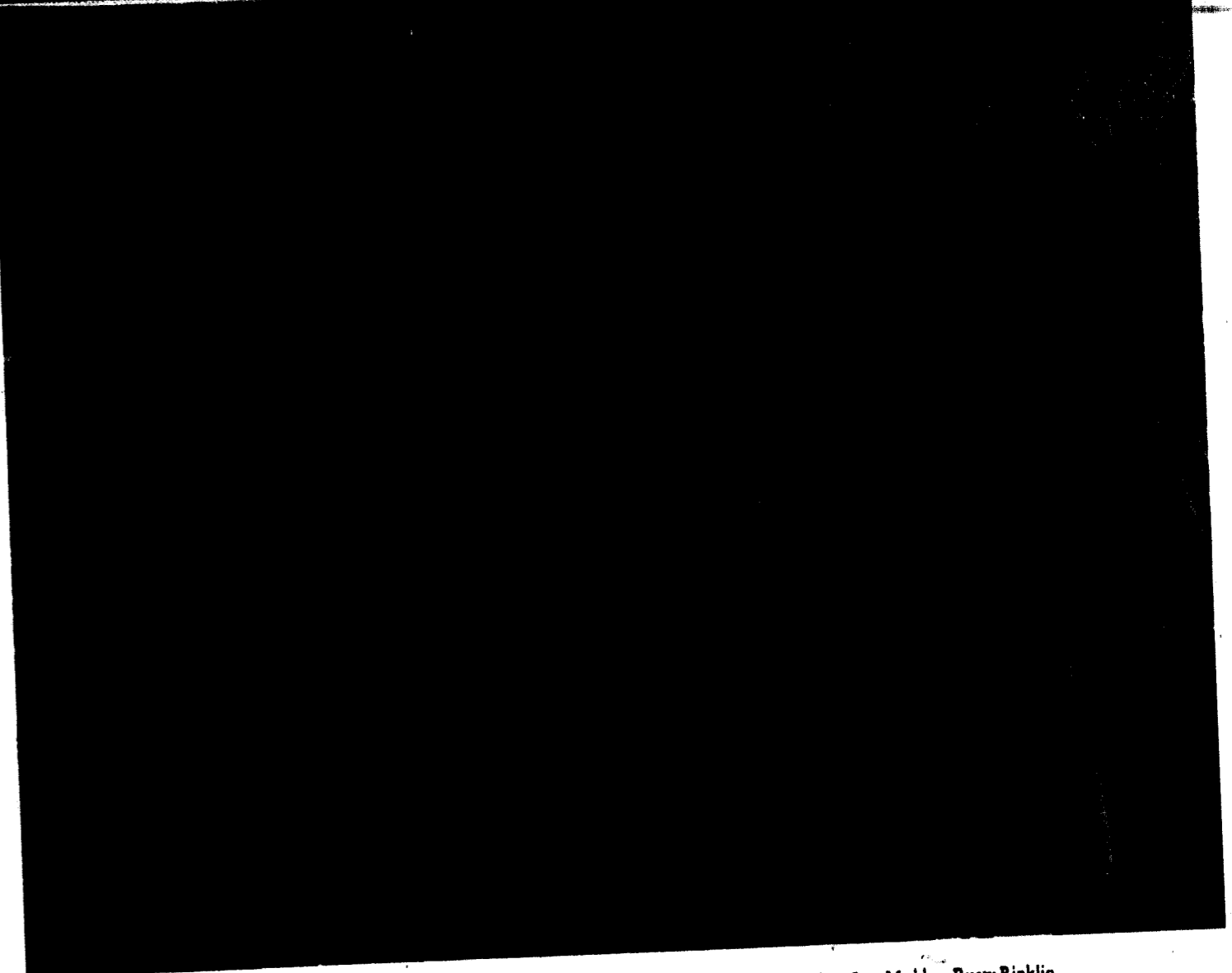
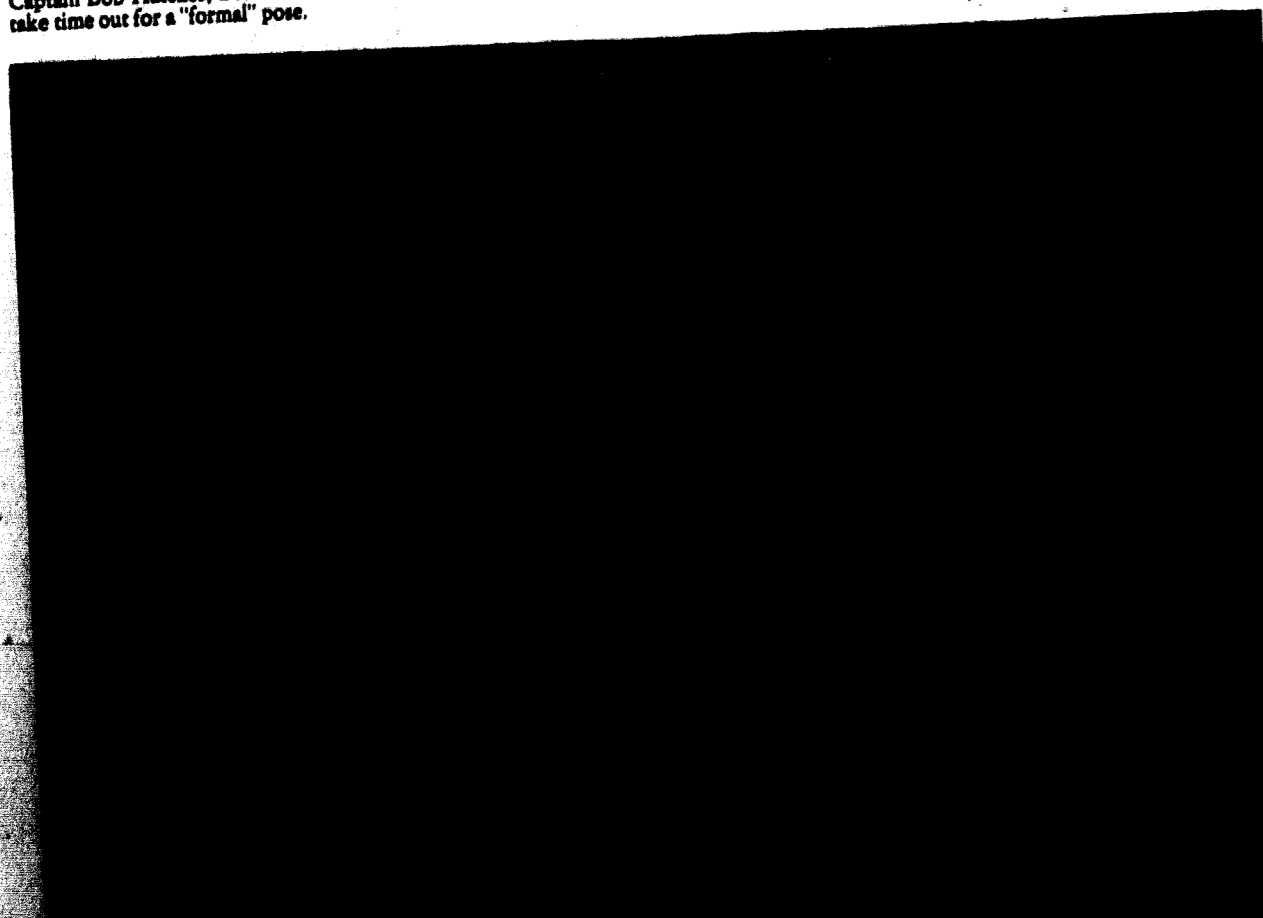
Cross-Country Wins Title

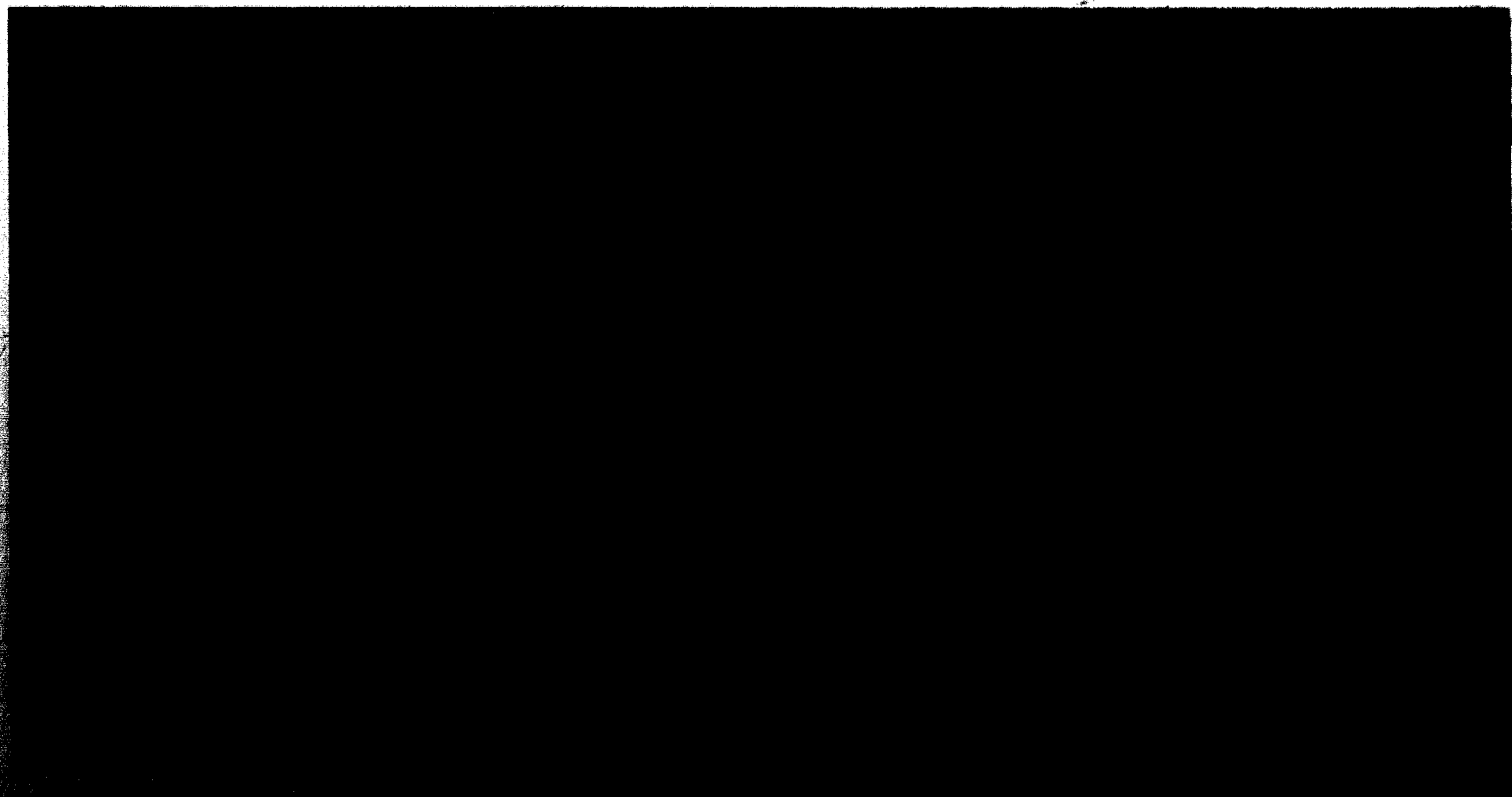

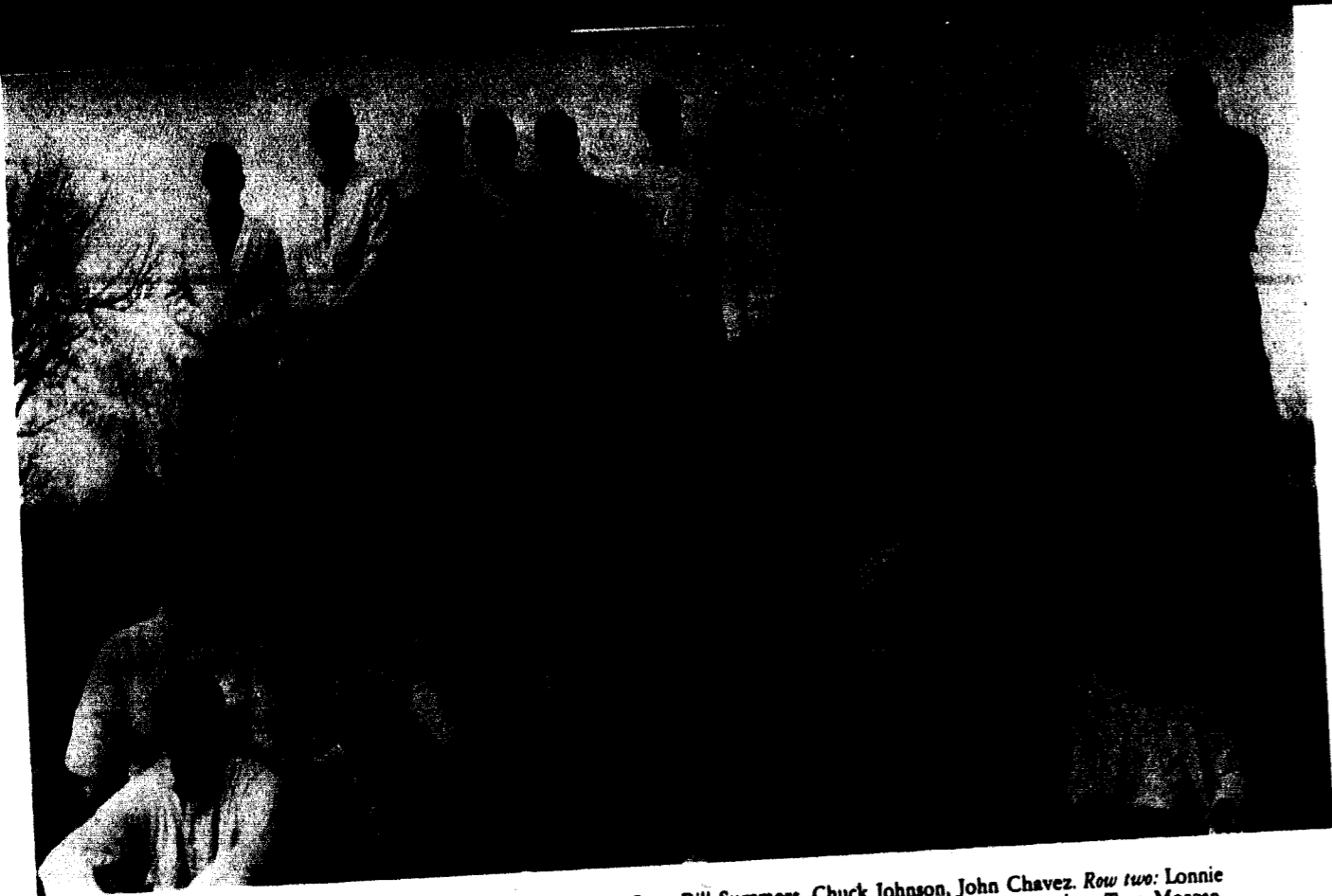

"J" Club

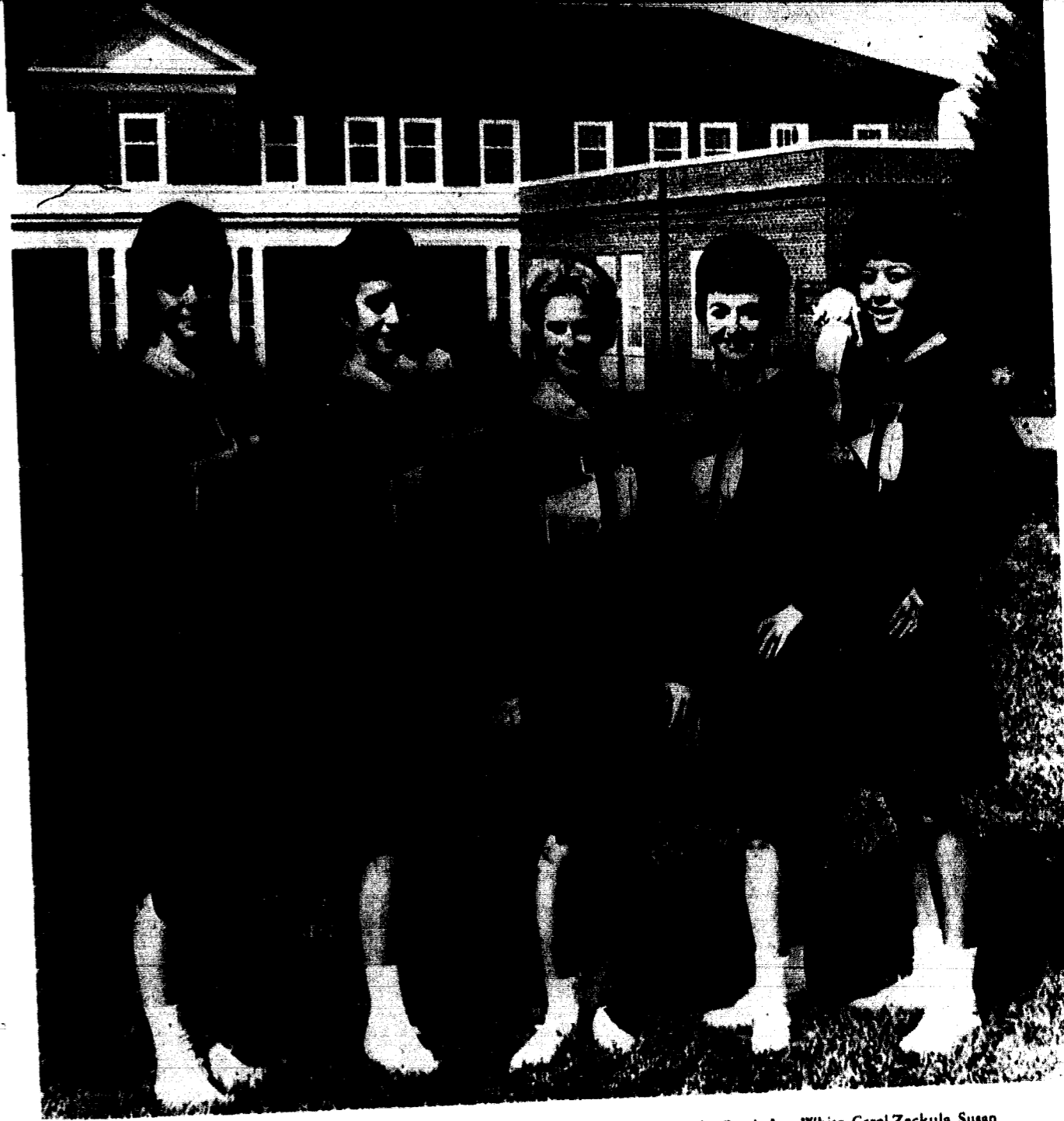

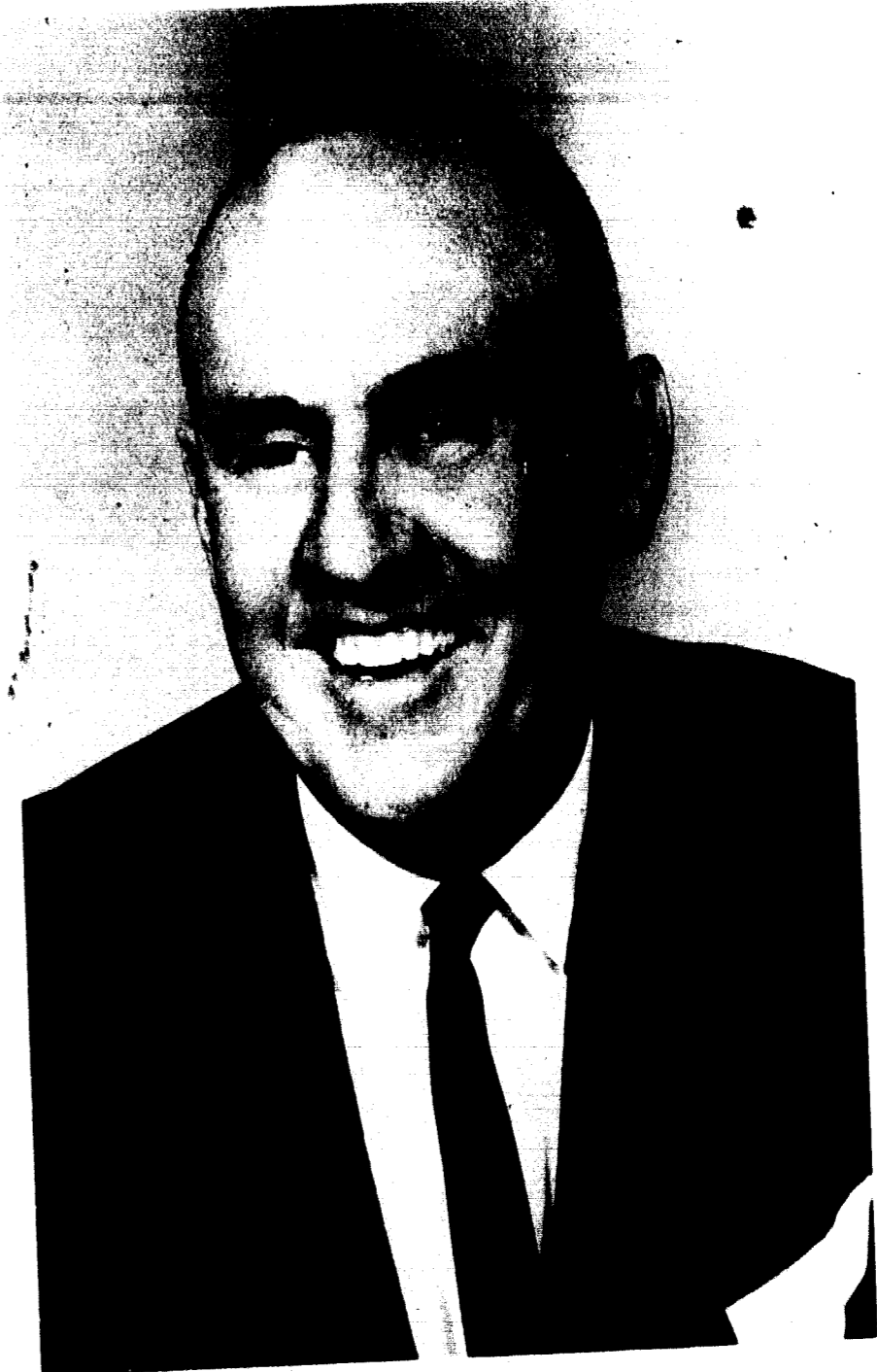

In Honor Of A Superior Career

This year Norris A. Patterson, head football coach and athletic director, added another milestone to his already distinguished career by capturing his 100th gridiron victory. Coach Patterson has compiled a record of 100 wins, 25 losses, and 7 ties in his fourteen year tenure at William Jewell.

"Pat" has guided the Cardinals to seven conference championships—two in the MIAA conference and five in Jewell's present conference, the MCAU. Moreover, he coached several baseball teams to championship berths. After being graduated from Missouri Valley College

in 1939, Coach Patterson continued his education by earning a master's degree from Kansas City University in 1950, and a doctorate from Columbia University in 1958.

The many professional honors which Dr. Patterson has received include the 1961 Little All-American Coach of the Year Award, the presidency of the MCAU Coaches Association, and the 1960-1961 chairmanship of the NAIA Professional Relations Committee.

And so, in honor of admirable achievement and enviable records, the 1964 *Tatler* is proudly dedicated to Norris A. Patterson.

College Union Board

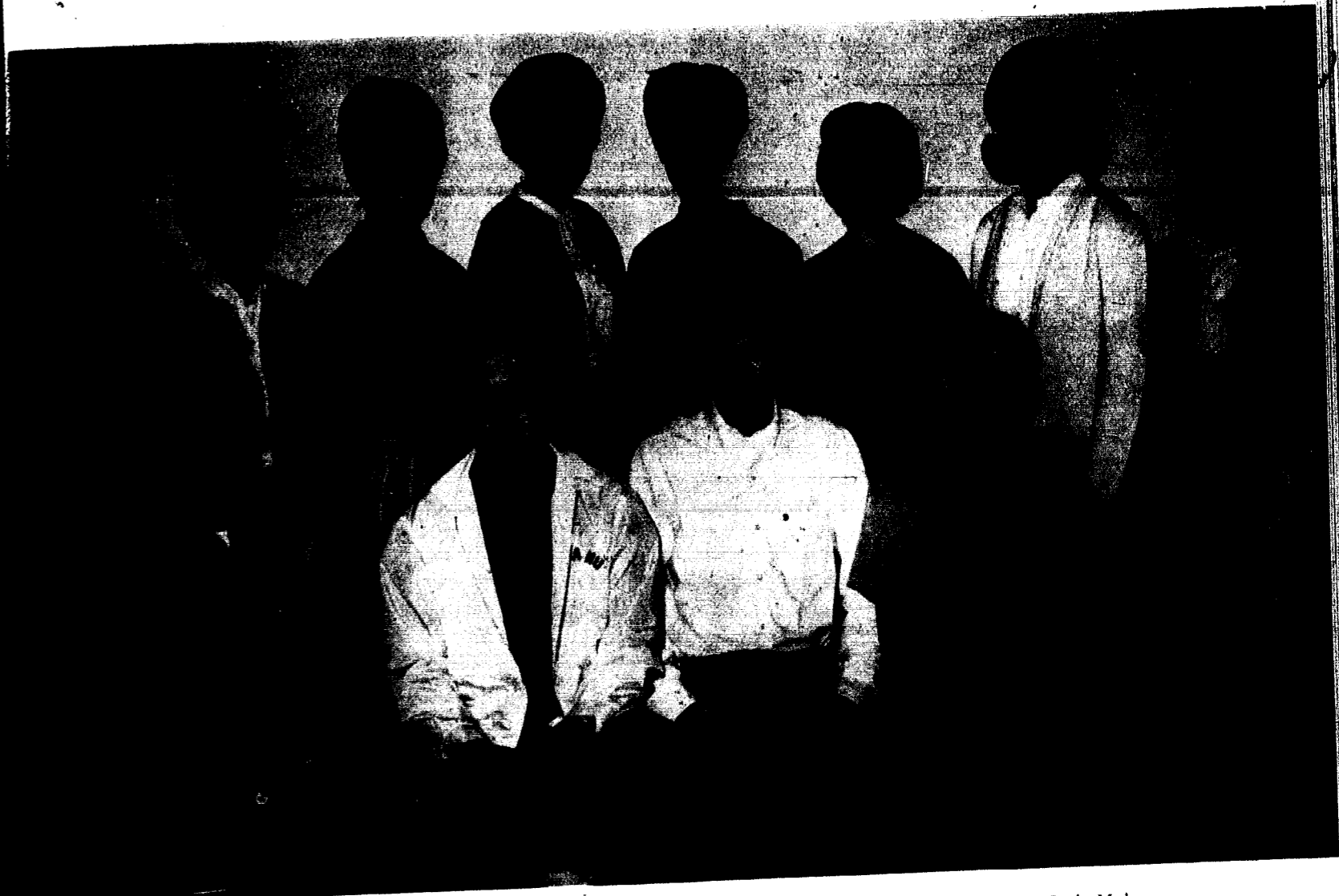

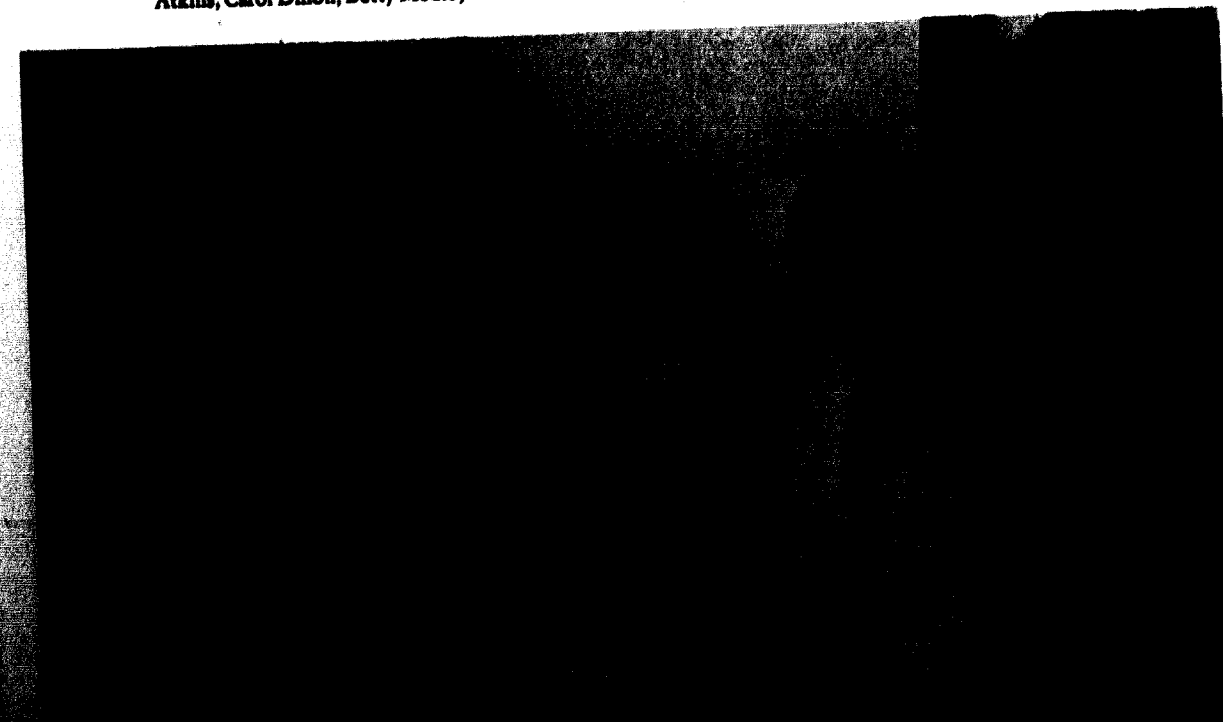
Senior Panhellenic Council

The William Jewell Players is one of the most active organizations on campus. This year's major contribution to the campus by the Players was the presentation of two strikingly significant plays.

The Players encourage interest in theatre by sponsoring field trips and strive to achieve dramatic excellence on the campus.

This year's two dramatic presentations by the William Jewell Players were "Antigone" by Jean Anouilh, and "Rhinoceros" by Eugene Ionesco.

"Antigone" was a modernized version of Sophocles' Greek tragedy depicting the eternal conflict between idealism and realism. Because its production occurred at a time which doubled the significance of the play, the cast and its directors dedicated the performance to the memory of President J. F. Kennedy on the weekend of his assassination.

The Players very successfully presented "Rhinoceros", a tragi-comic farce emphasizing the ridiculousness of existence and attacking blind conformity in humanity.

Miss Carole Reed, new to William Jewell's faculty this year, expertly led the Players in the presentations as well as working with Miss Virginia Rice in the organization.



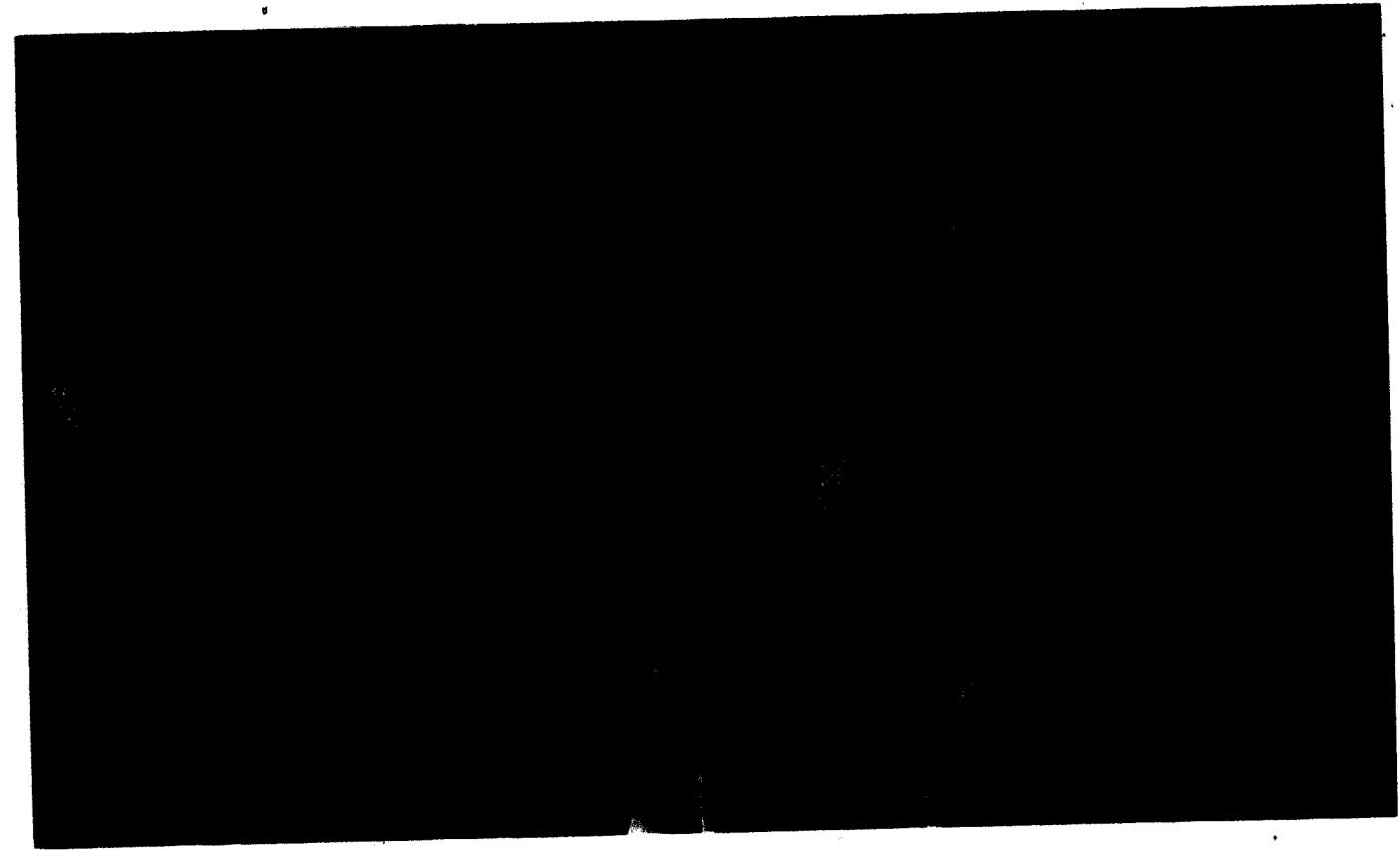

The Psychology Club is composed of students interested in the various branches of psychology.

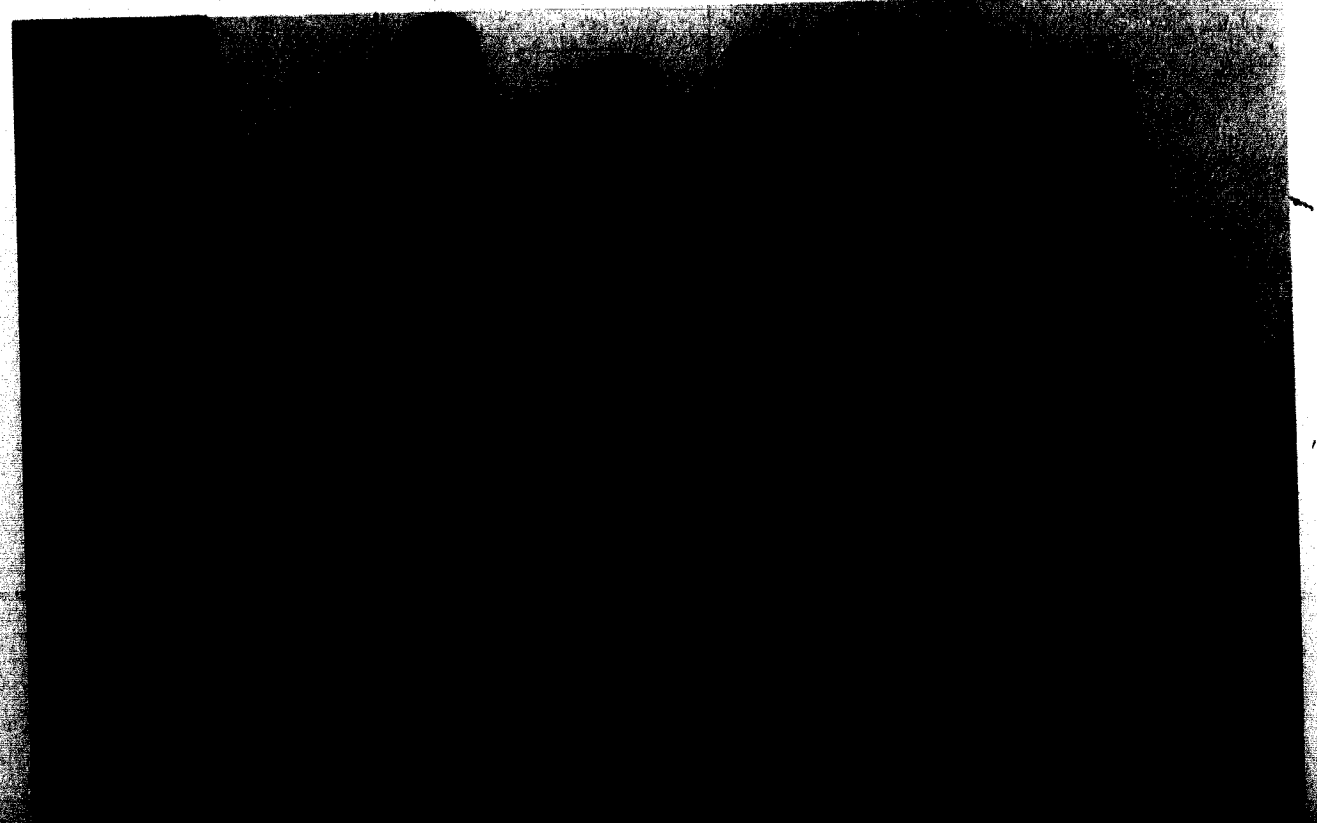

Membership requirements include twelve hours of history and a "B" average in all subjects.

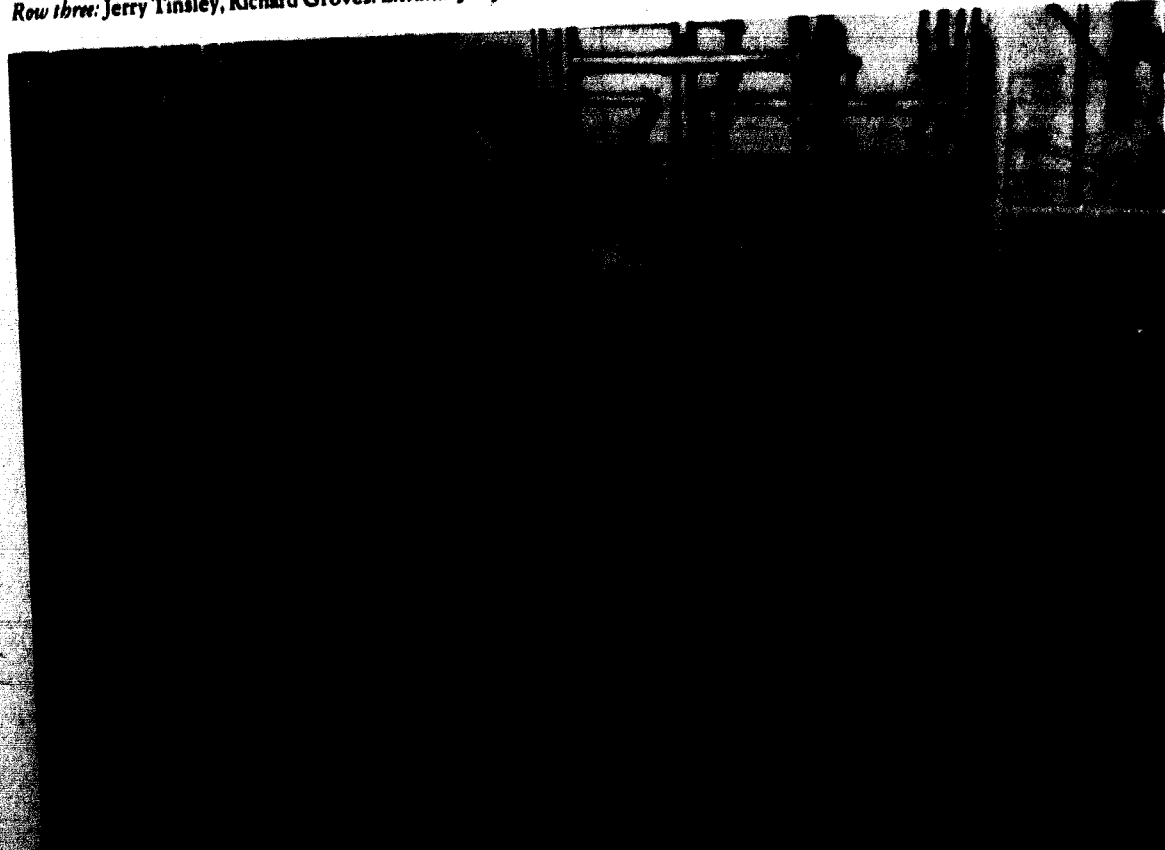

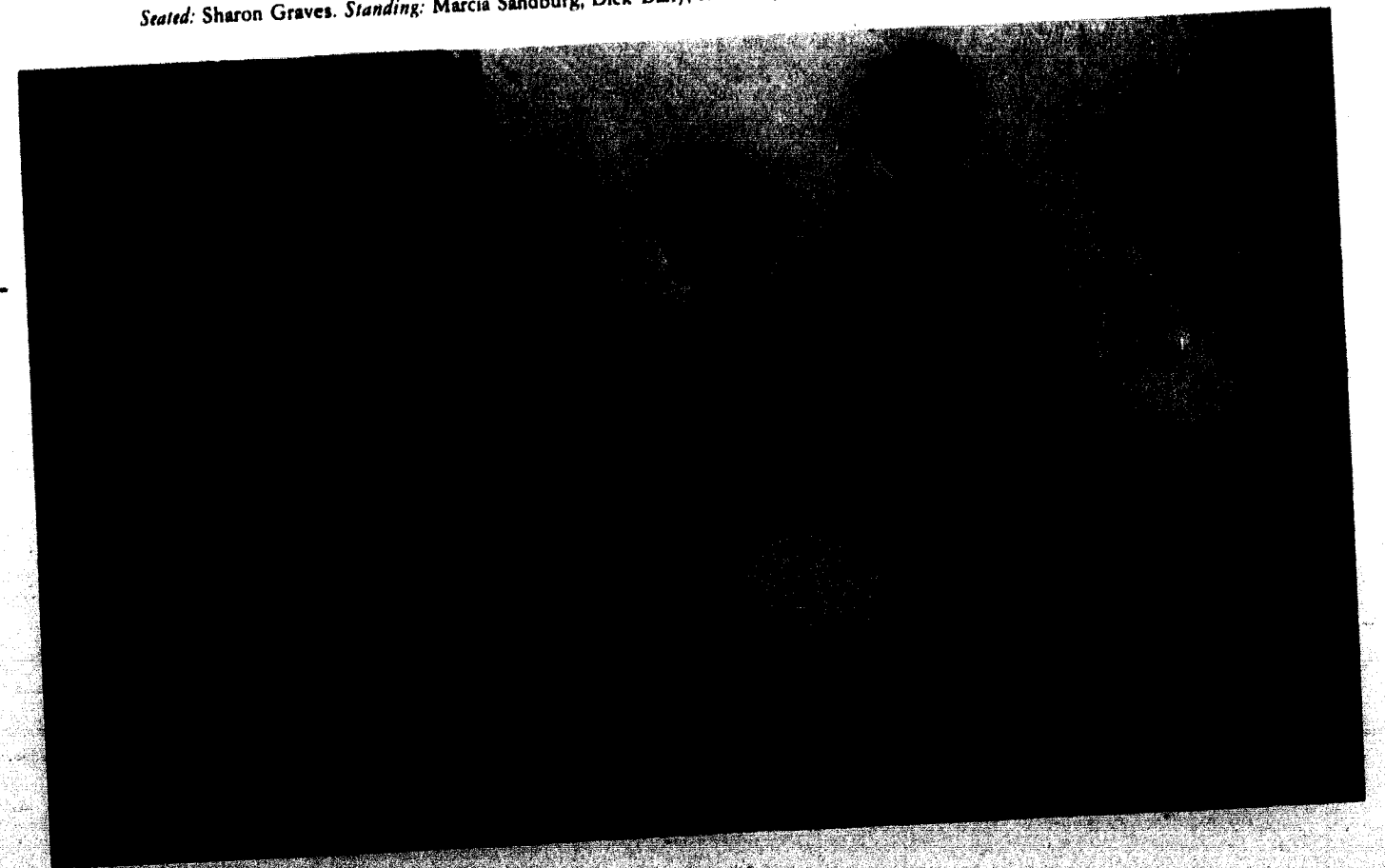
BSU Choir

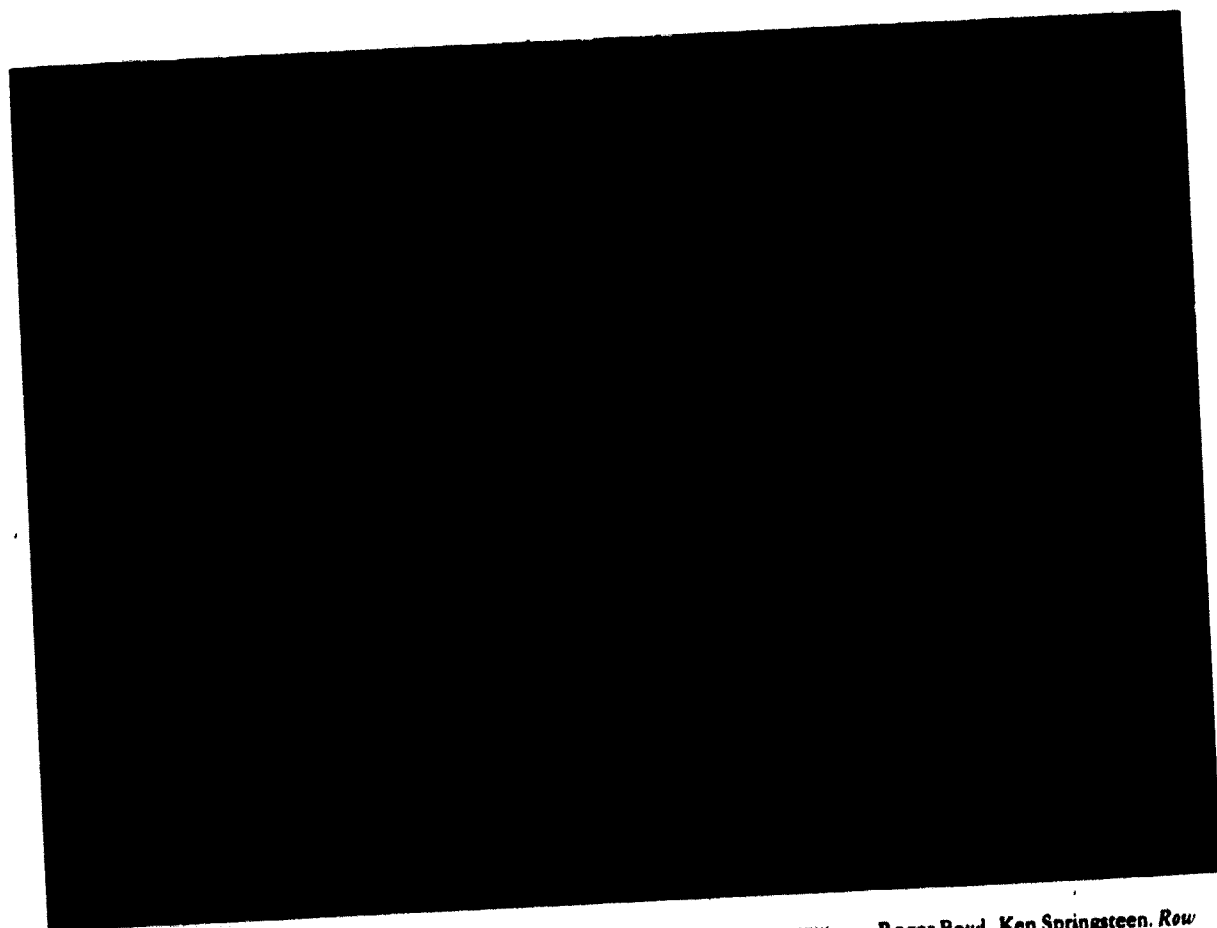


Baptist Student Movement

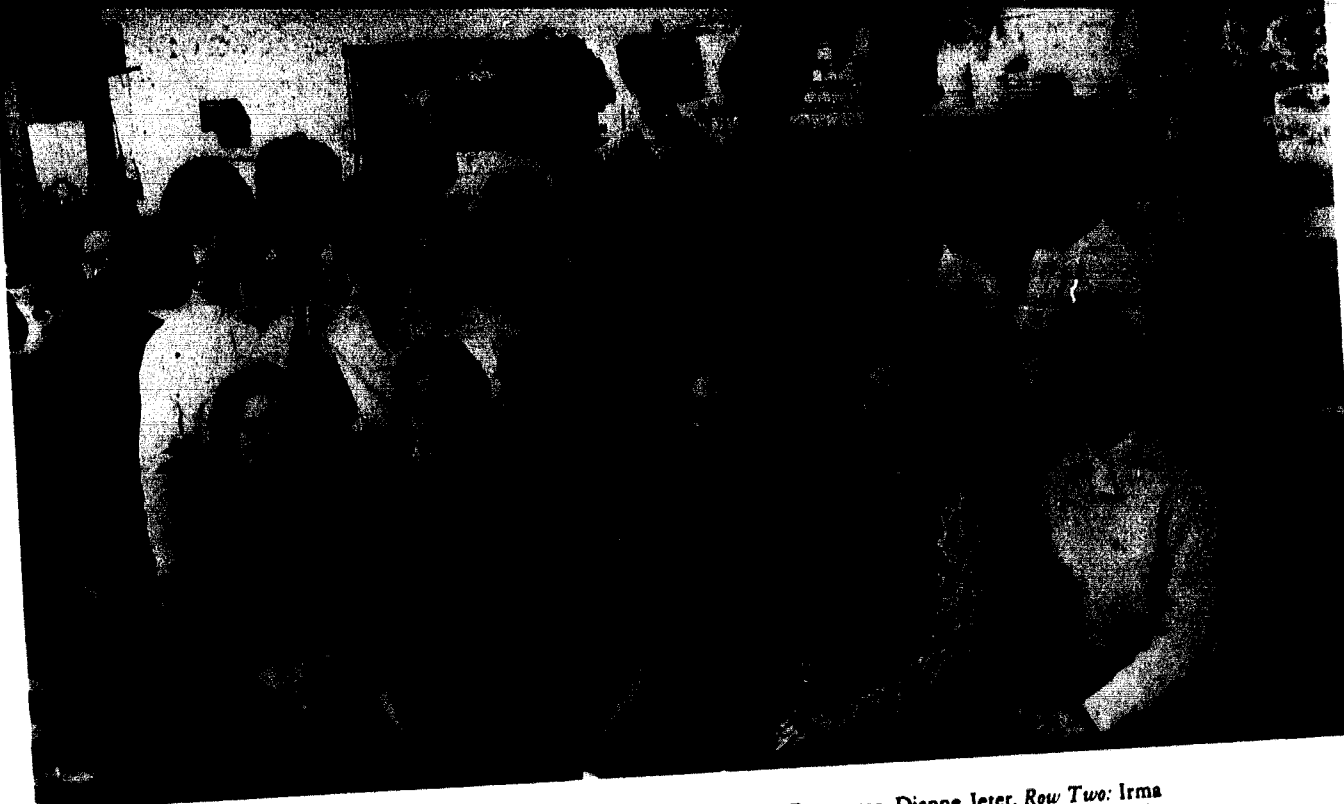
The principal aim of the MA is to give its members the opportunity to meet and discuss common interests, needs, and problems related to church and scholastic experiences.

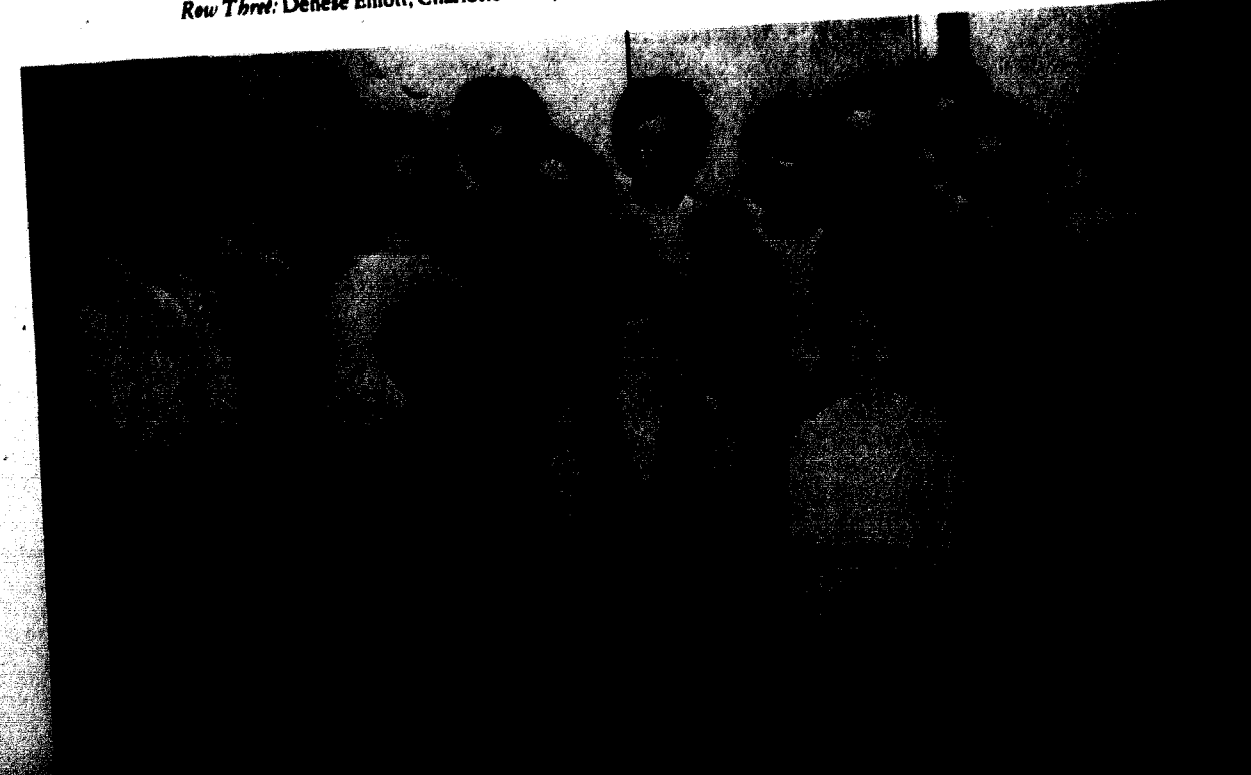
Young Women's Auxiliary

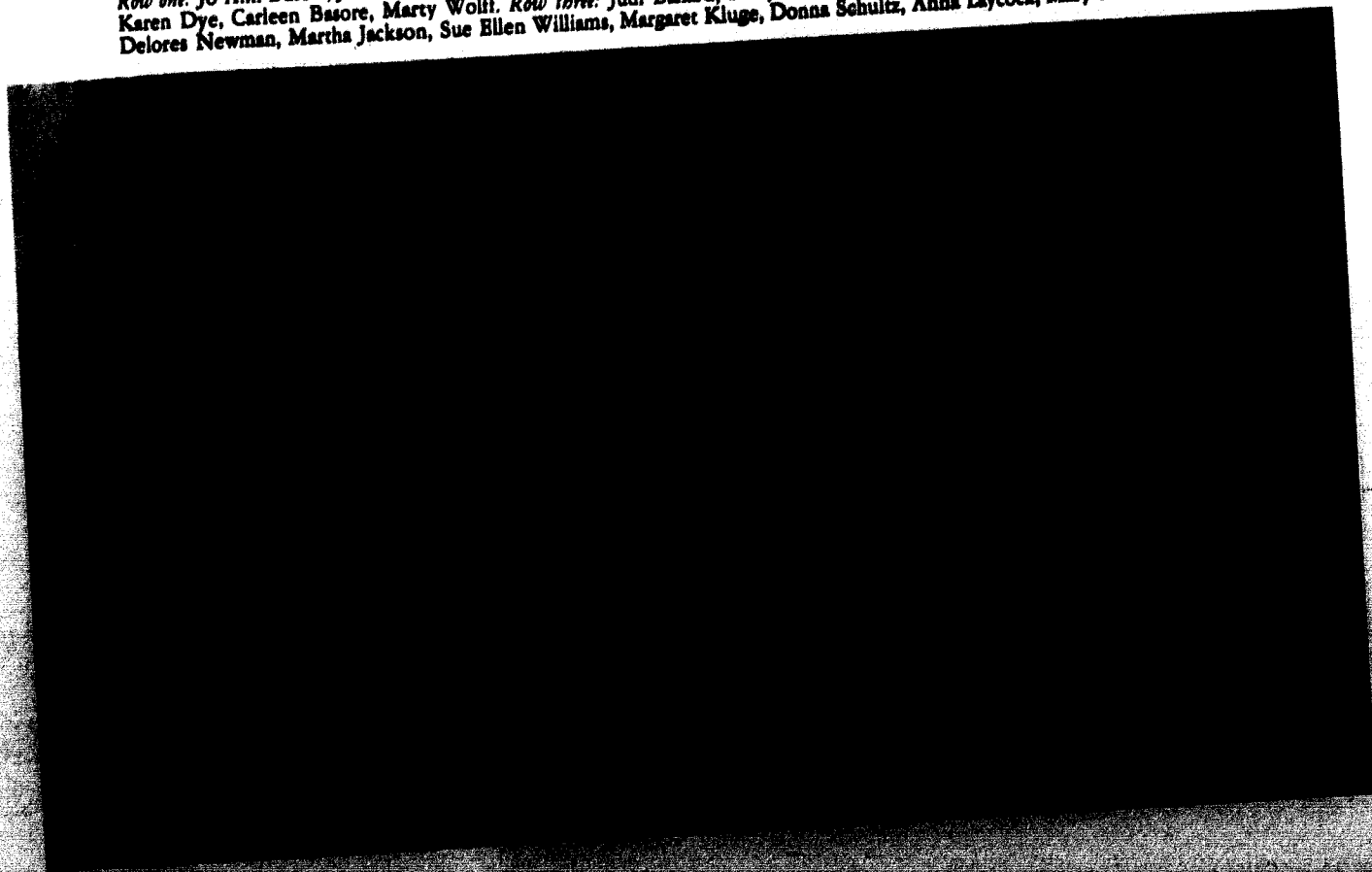

"L'Enfant Prodique"

A new interpretation of an old story is the innovation of Mr. E. Guinand's libretto "L'Enfant Prodique." Although the lyrics are from the familiar Biblical text of the Prodigal Son, Mr. Guinand uses character delineation forcefully. That is, he includes a mother who is vital for the progression of the plot within the libretto.

Lia the mother (Kathy Patterson) weeps and grieves deeply the loss of Azael the Prodigal Son (Carl Moman). No comfort can be given Lia by the boy's father Simeon (Ronald Newman). Even the young men and women servants of the household speak of Lia's seven years of mourning for her son.

But eternal desolation is not to be Lia's lot. The battered and worn Azael fearfully and shamefully returns home, only to find that he is warmly and joyfully received.

Ronald Newman, Carl Moman, and Kathy Patterson portray the warmth of familial love.

The servants of Simeon's household are John Yingling, David Moman, Vicki Yingling, Sue Spotswood, Roger Crozier, and Duane Goss.

"The Old Maid And The Thief"

As she calls out in the dark house, Laetitia finds herself alone.

This delightful short opera by Gian-Carlo Menotti was written as a bizarre tragedy containing a great deal of humor.

The story essentially revolves around a spry old maid, Miss Todd (Ruth Ann Bull), who seemed to have only two things on her mind: the weather and the activities of various bachelors. Her principal interests are conversationally spurred on by the town gossip, Miss Pinkerton (Mavis Miller). Employed by the old maid is the servant girl, Laetitia (Sara Coday).

The interest of the story is found when Laetitia befriends Bob, a beggar (Dick Bailey), and secures him lodging within the old maid's home. After a week of the beggar's residence within her walls, Miss Todd is beginning to suspect that he is the thief who escaped from a near-by penal institution.

Also within the week's passing, Laetitia is beginning to fall in love with the not un-handsome thief. Together they pledge their love, pilfer the old maid's home, and flee away.

Upon her return home, the old maid bemoans the loss of her possessions, and perhaps still more, the loss of her would-be lover and her unrequited love. Upon this note the opera ends.

The French playwright, Jean Anouilh, revised Sophocles' Greek tragedy, "Antigone," to apply to the eternal conflict between idealism and realism—in this case, the individual spirit opposed to tyrannical government.

The play, excellently directed by Miss Carole Reed, was produced at a time that doubled its meaning—the weekend of President Kennedy's assassination.

In Tribute

Dr. Minetry L. Jones, Vice-President of the College, was stricken by a heart attack on December 17, 1963, while attending the Executive Board of the Missouri Baptist Convention. He died nine days later.

The life of Minetry Jones was characterized by five great loves: his love for his family, his church, William Jewell College, his denomination, and for others. It has been said, he, above the ordinary man, was always on the side of progress.

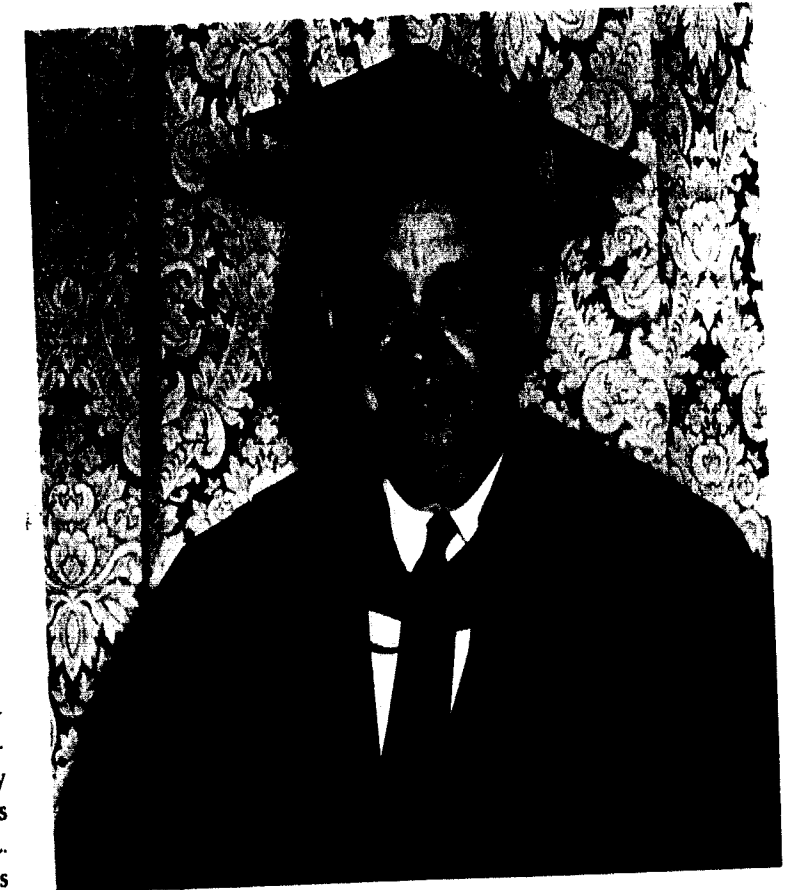
Dr. Jones was a graduate of William Jewell College, Class of 1914, and was made a trustee of the school in 1932. In 1938 he joined the staff as administrator of business affairs. Here he distinguished himself. President H. Guy Moore said of him, "He has rendered a tremendous service in our college's building program. He has done more for William Jewell in this area than perhaps any other man."

No wonder William Jewell College chose to confer on him, on last year's Achievement Day, the highest honor which the College can confer—the honorary degree of Doctor of Laws. Following are a few lines from the tribute paid him on that day: "Minetry L. Jones is a William Jewell alumnus who has served his alma mater in positions of the highest trust, with singular devotion and success, for thirty years. His services

as finance and business officer of the College in particular, have promoted its growth and welfare in countless ways, and since 1944 his labors have been built into every new or refurbished campus structure. A former trustee and interim President of the College, a widely known Baptist lay-leader, and a vigorous and tireless fund-raiser, he has directed the highly successful campaign for the construction of the new library."

Yes, he loved William Jewell College! Because of his love for youth he stayed youthful to the extent that few people ever stopped to consider his age.

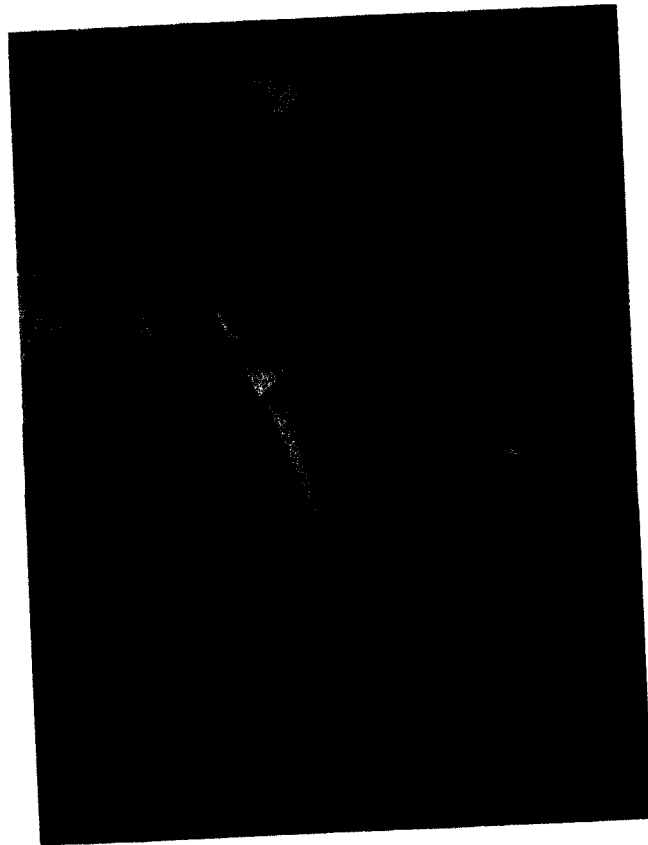
