Saturday morning the parade was held with the men of Sigma Nu and the women of Alpha Gamma Delta winning the first place float.

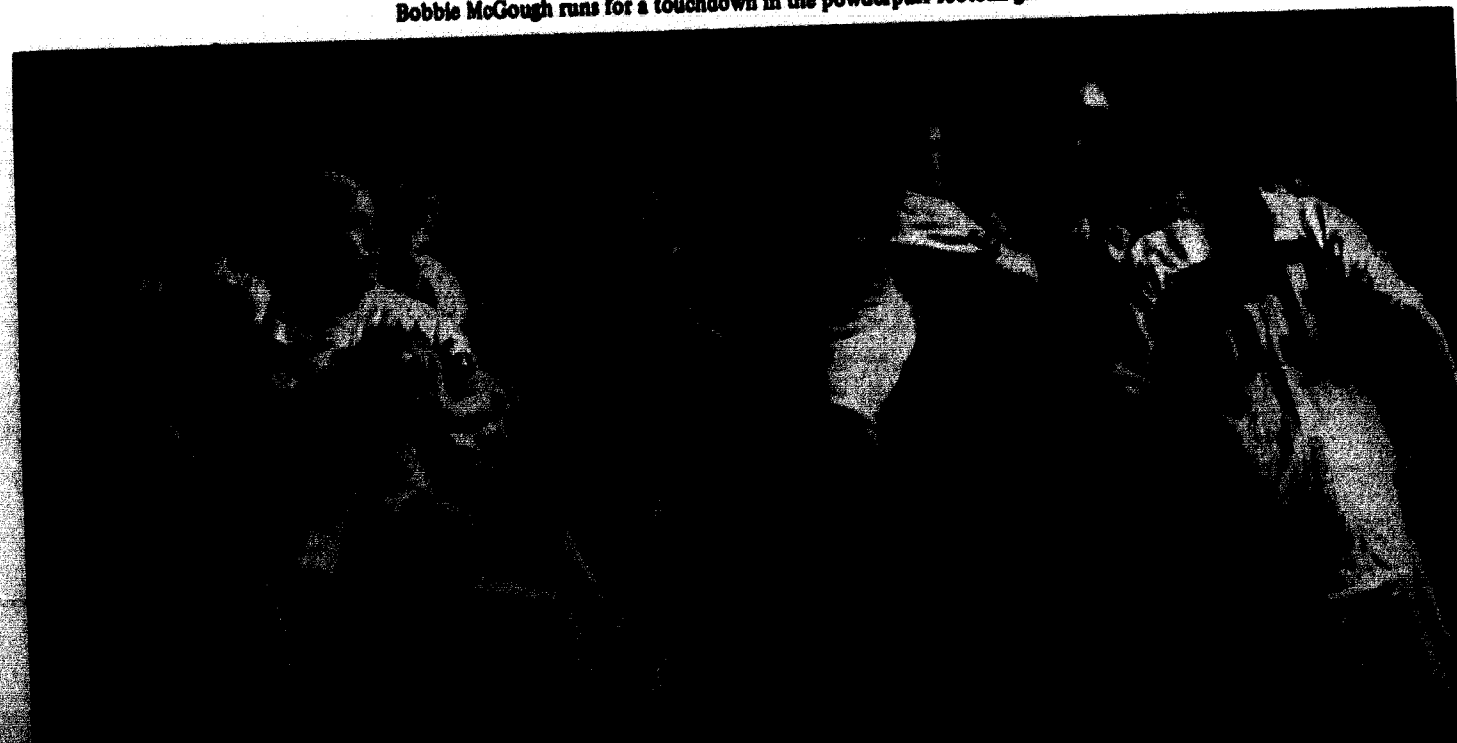
Although the Jewell football team had a few problems during the game, the half time events were quite successful with Beth Dunlop crowned as Homecoming Queen.

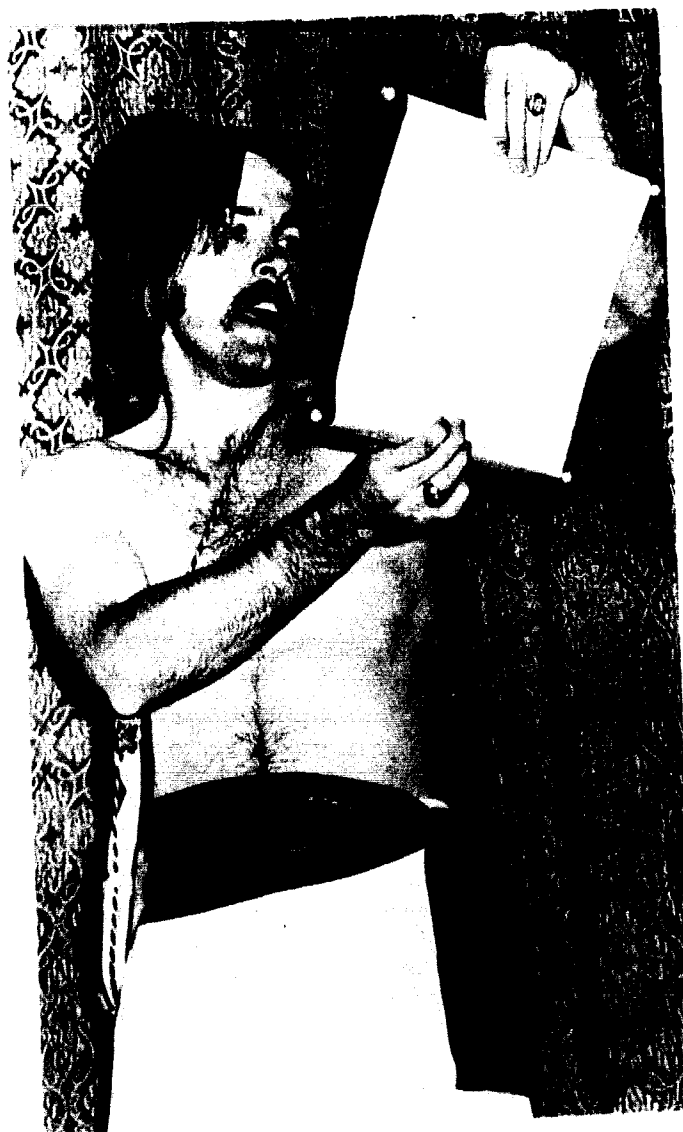

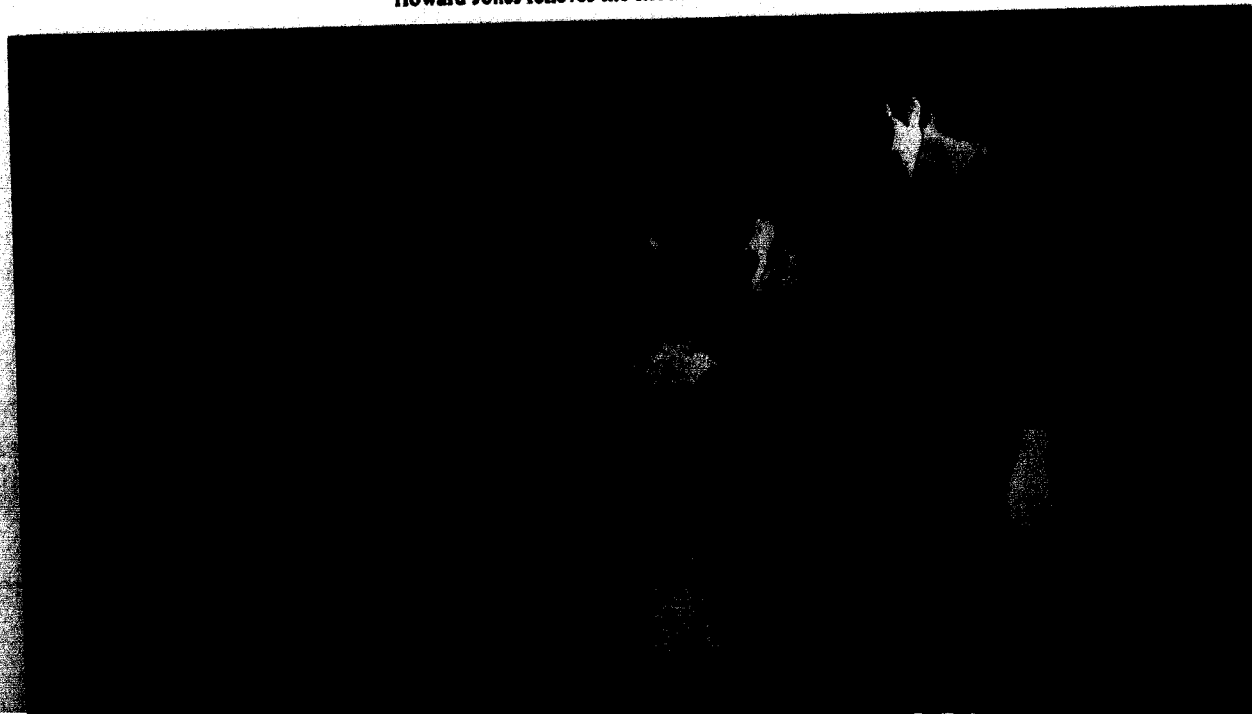

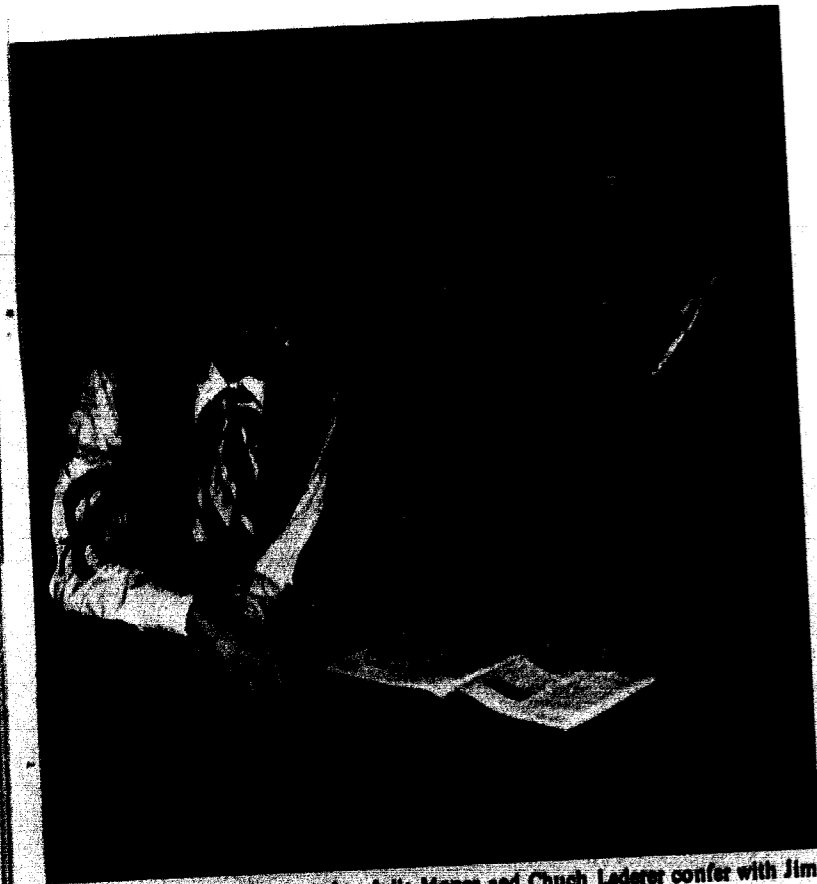

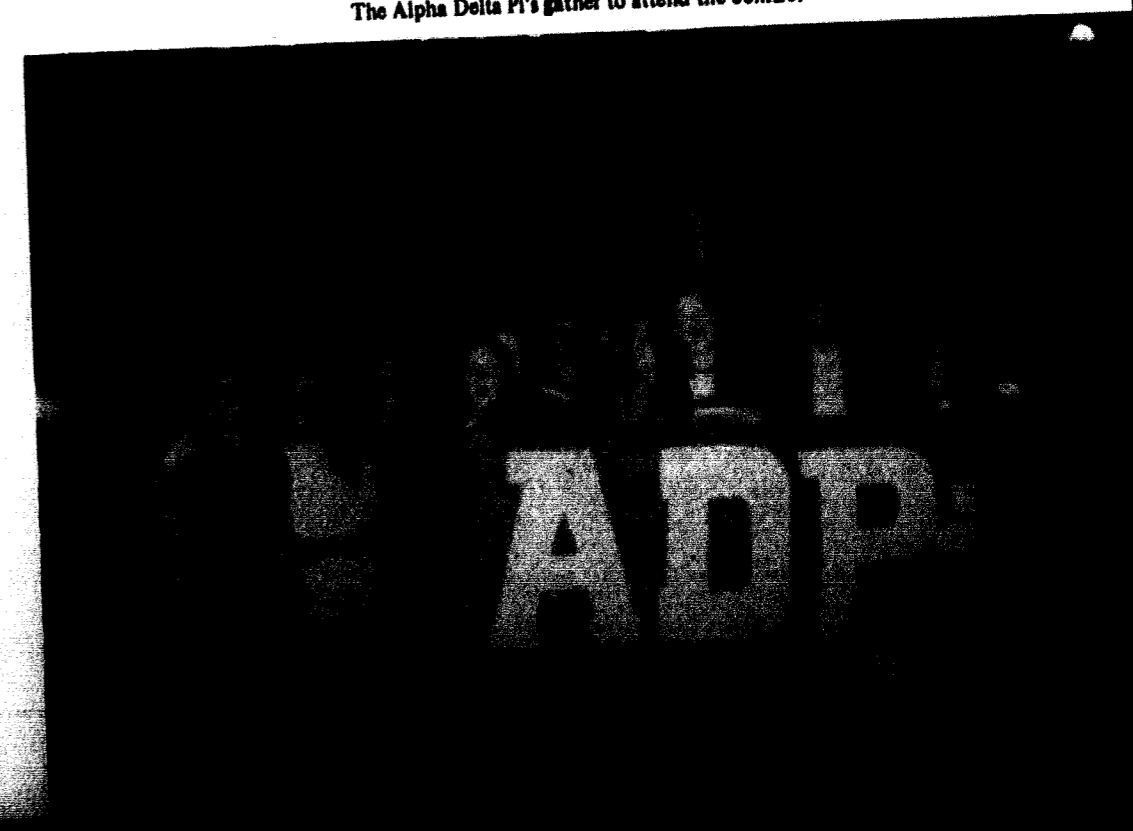

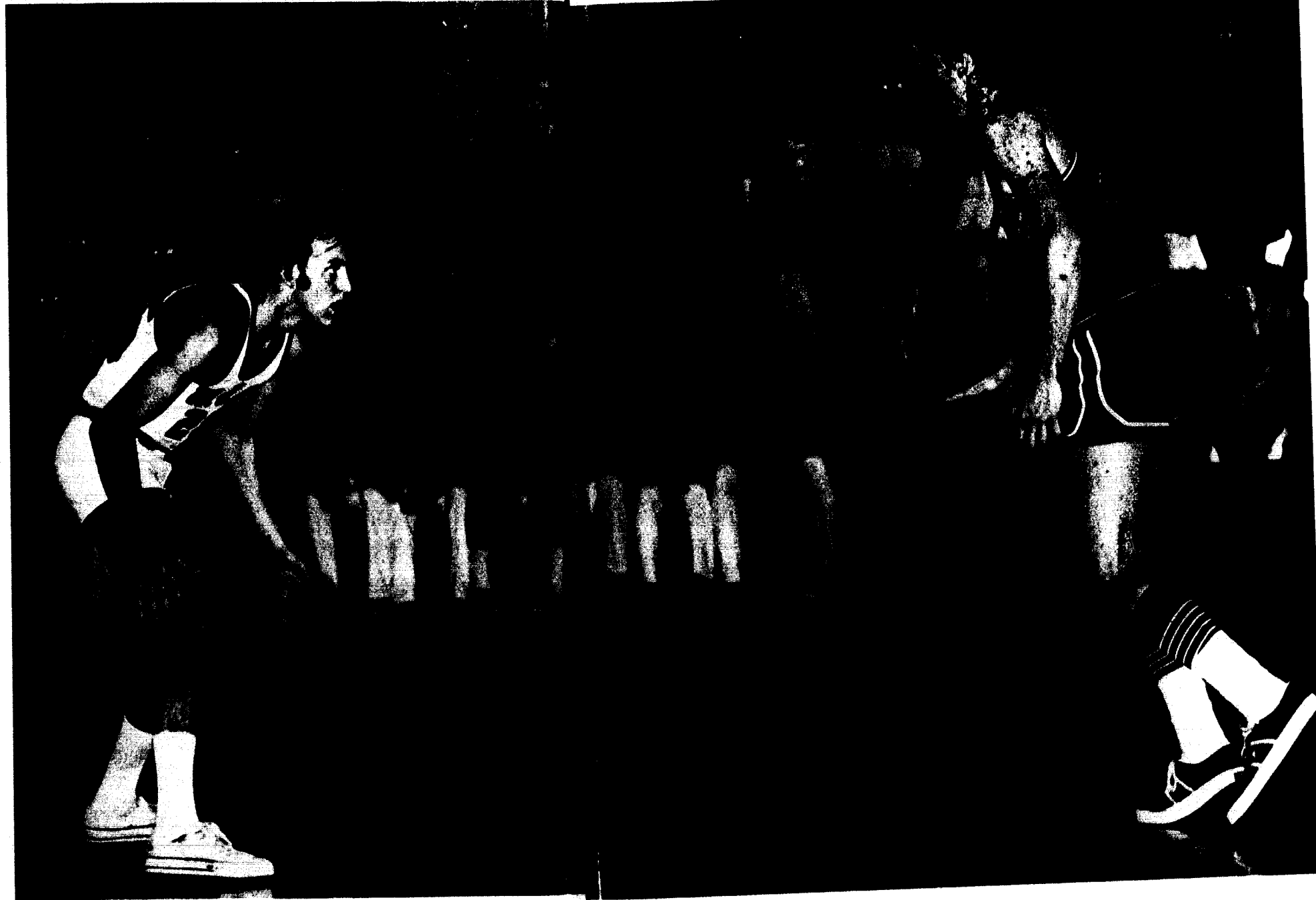
