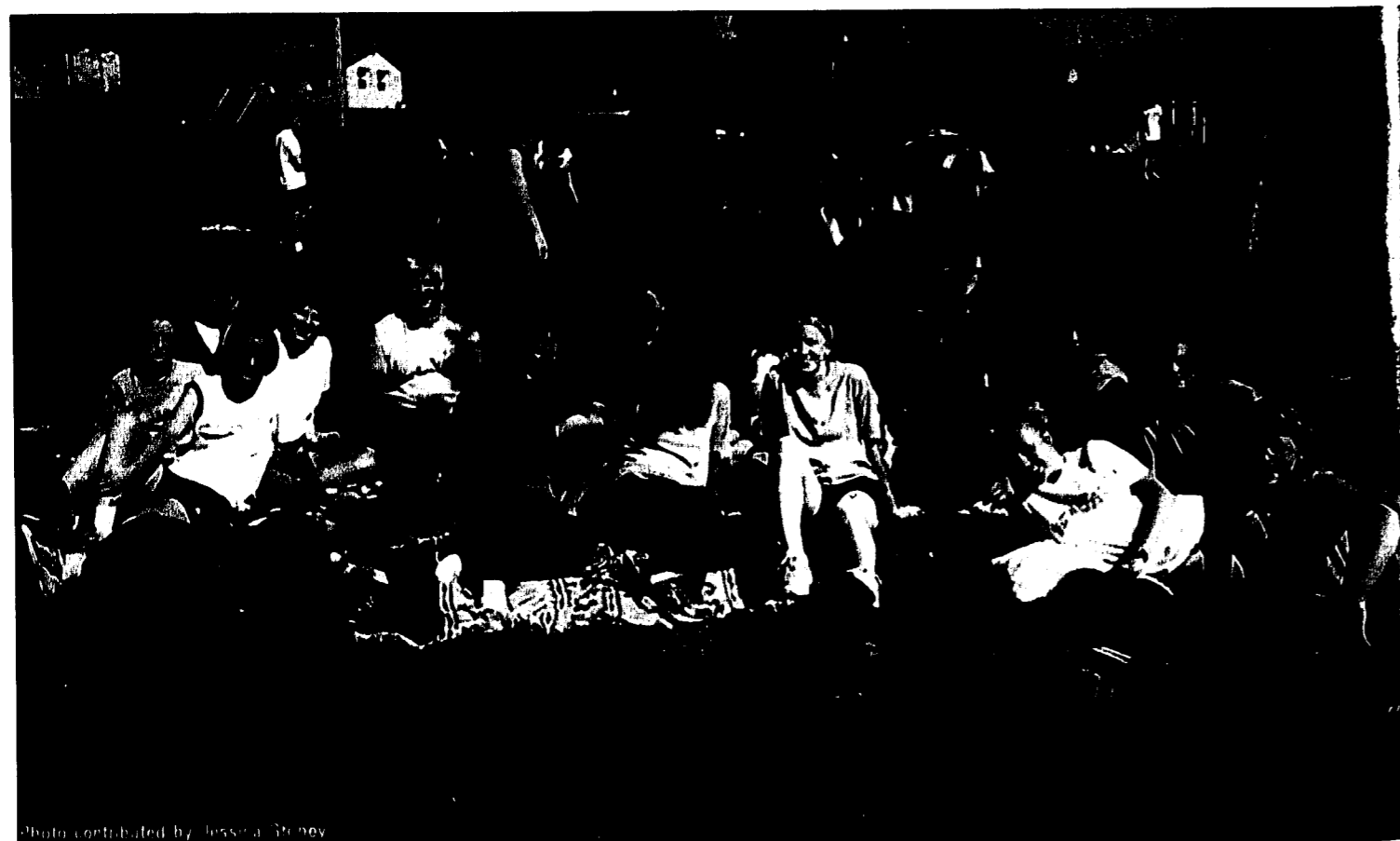

Every fall, William Jewell College celebrates tradition. Alum of all ages come from near and far to support their Alma Mater. This year, however, was much more than a Homecoming celebration. This year, Homecoming was just as much about the present and future as the past. According to TIME magazine, William Jewell College is the nation's premiere liberal arts college. Following the award was this year's Homecoming theme: *Now is the TIME*.

Sororities paired up with fraternities competed against each other and the independents for the Stocksdale Trophy. Driven with a force incomparable to any other group were the women of Alpha Gamma Delta and the men of Lambda Chi Alpha. This group stomped the competition and claimed victory. 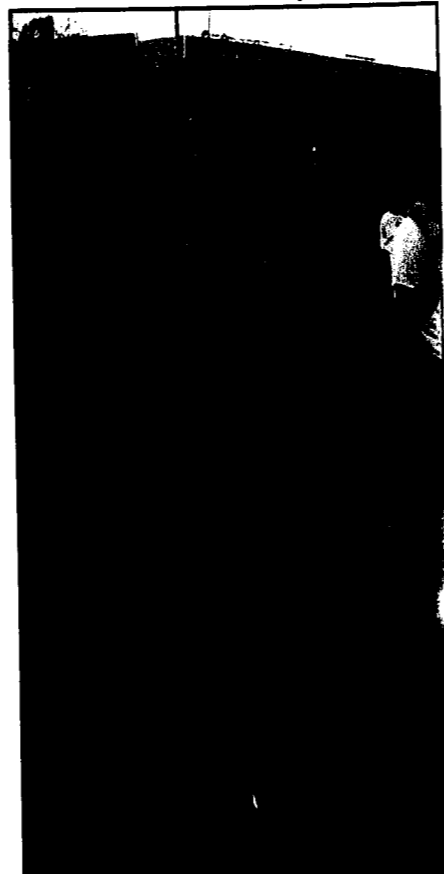

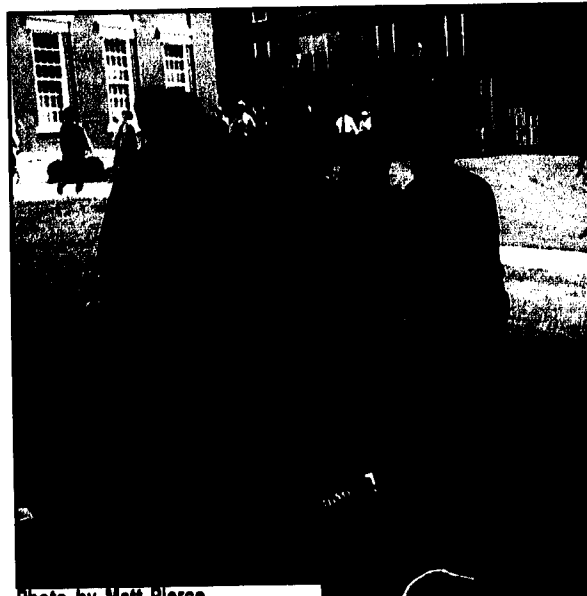

After a weekend without time to think of mom, dad, and home sweet home, first year students are ready to begin classes. They are ready to find their niche and become the adults they are supposed to become.

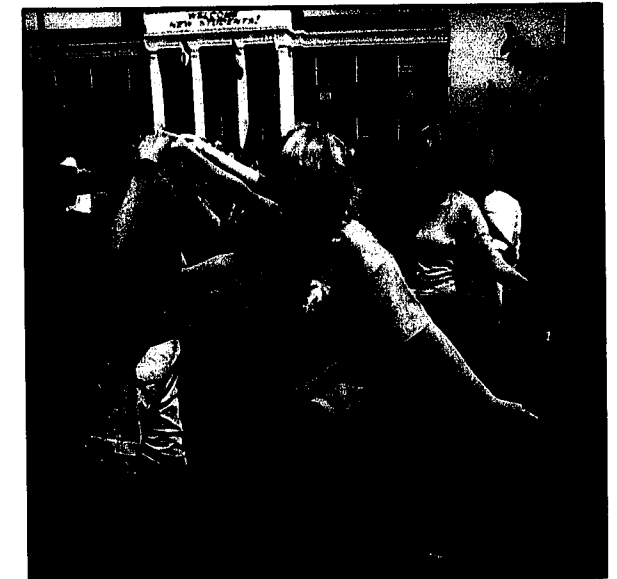

"WE KNOW WHAT WE ARE, BUT NOT WHO WE MAY BE."

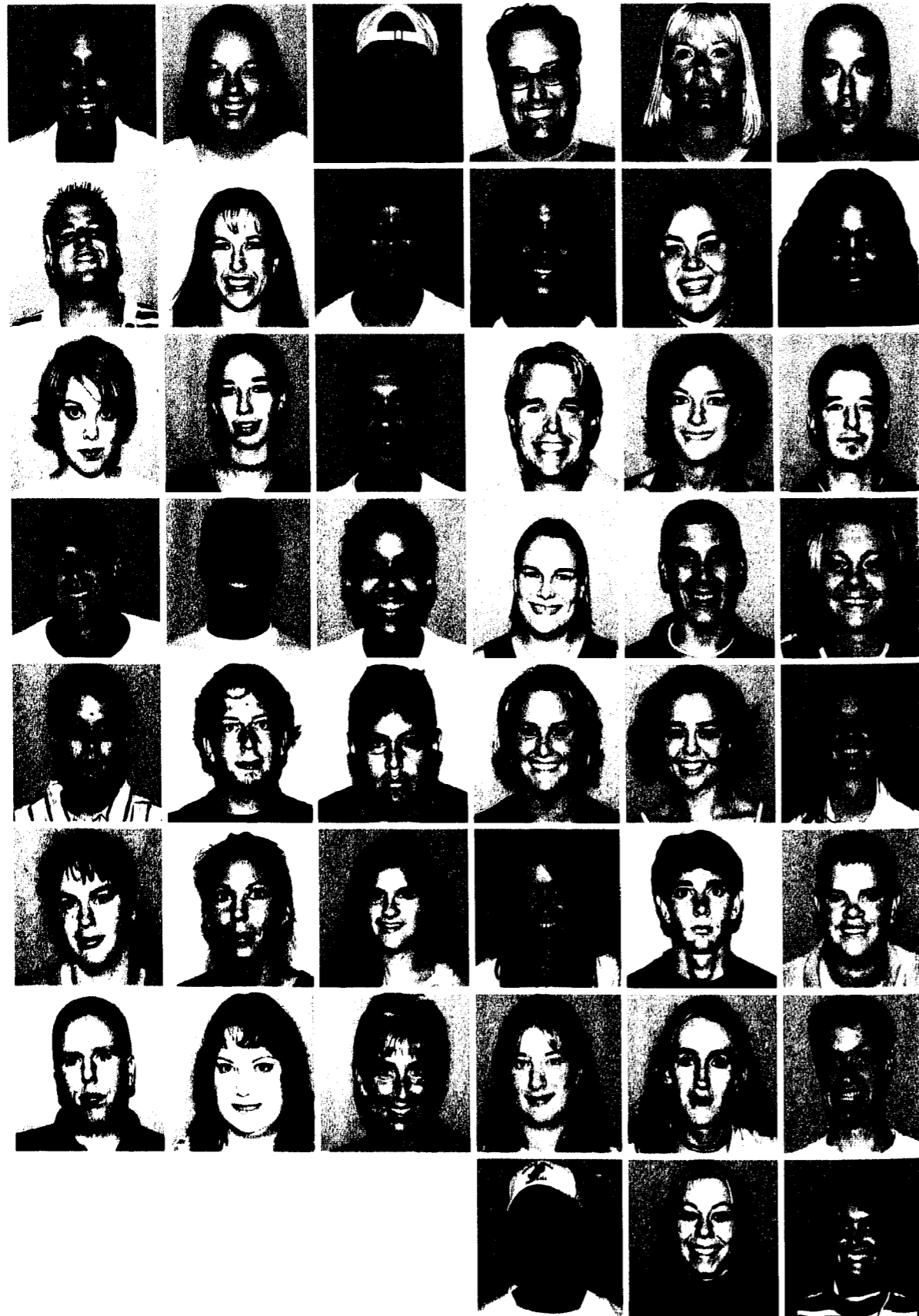

With a fresh coach behind the wheels next year's football season is sure to exceed everyone's expectations. The fans will wait, as the boys in red get ready to rumble.

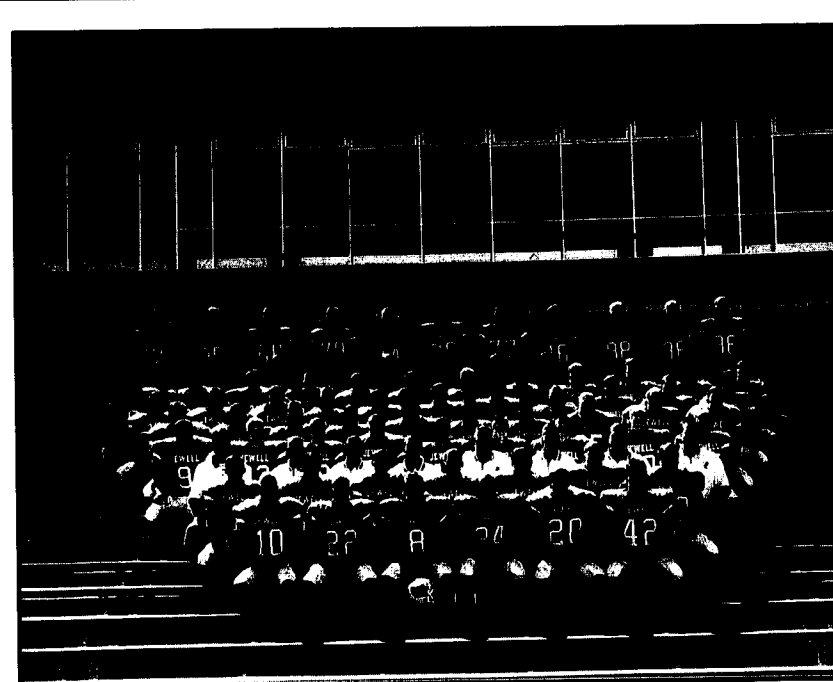

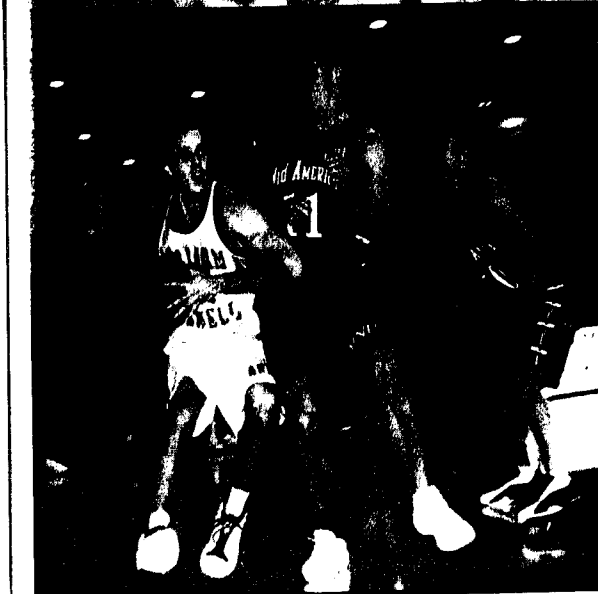
No one could have predicted what would be in store for the Cardinals after November

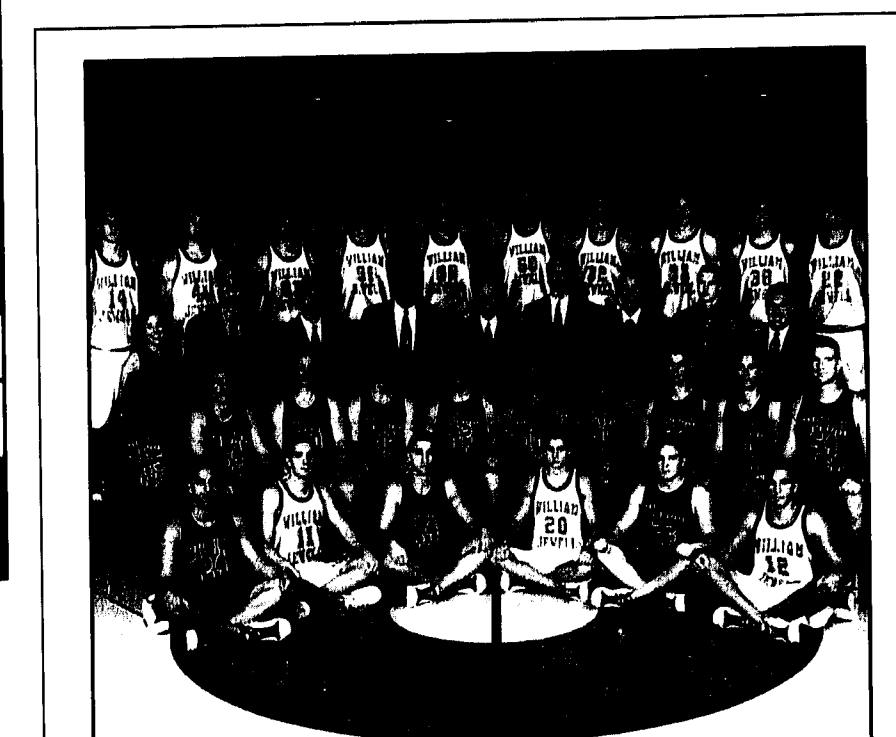

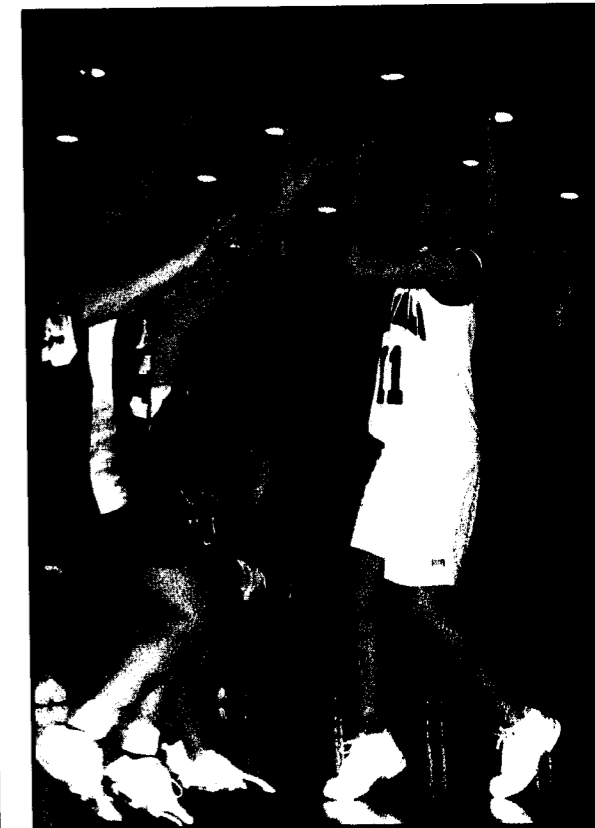

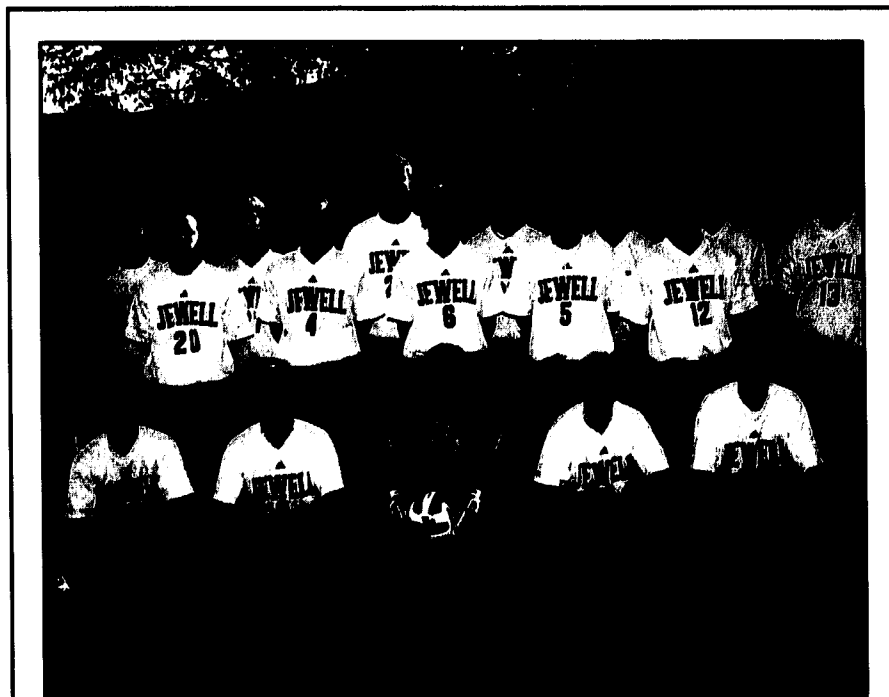
This year's soccer team went through numerous changes. The year started off with six seniors and by the end, four were left. Injuries plagued the team and other players were left to survive.

both academic and extra-cirricular, it was decided that Chris Cissell would head up the men's soccer program along with the women's program. The two would almost be combined.

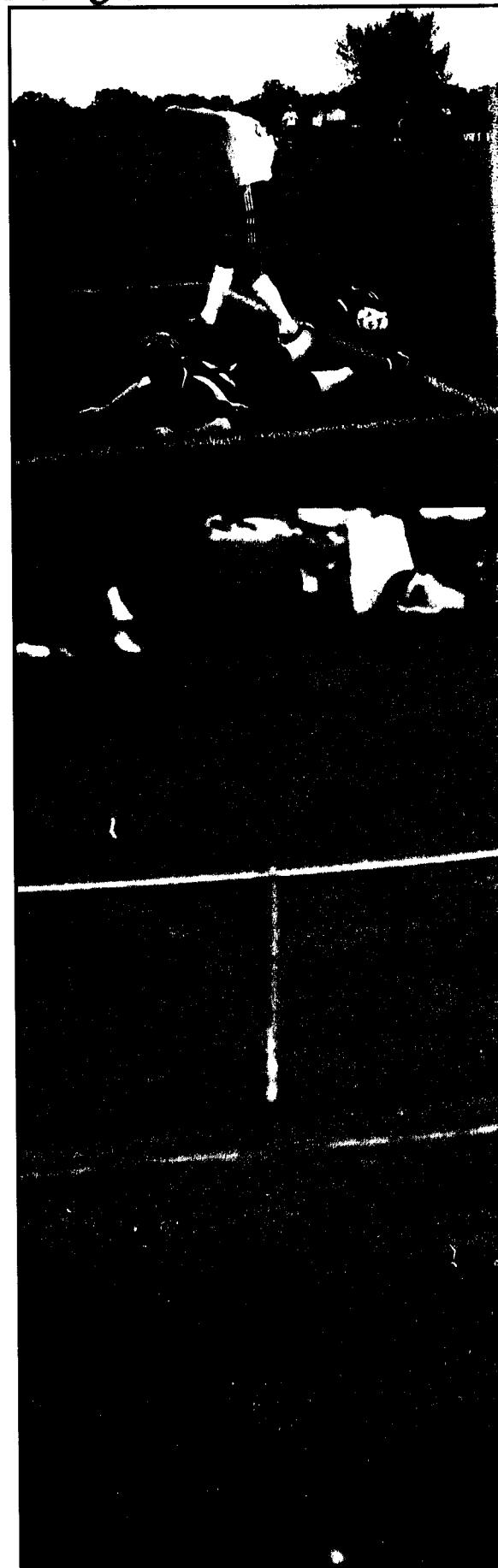

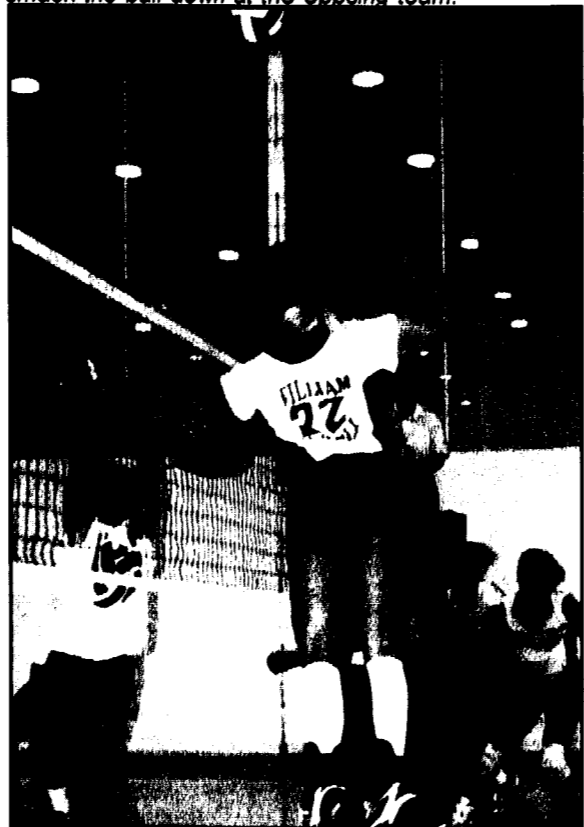

"Winning Regionals was a great way to end my final season in X-Country," said Sara Breedlove, senior.

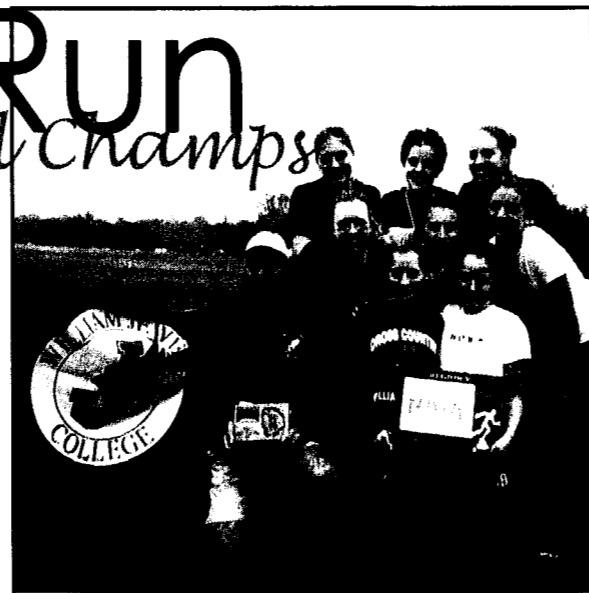

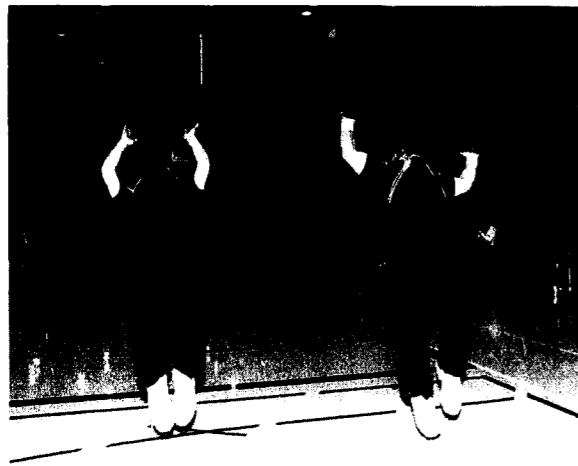

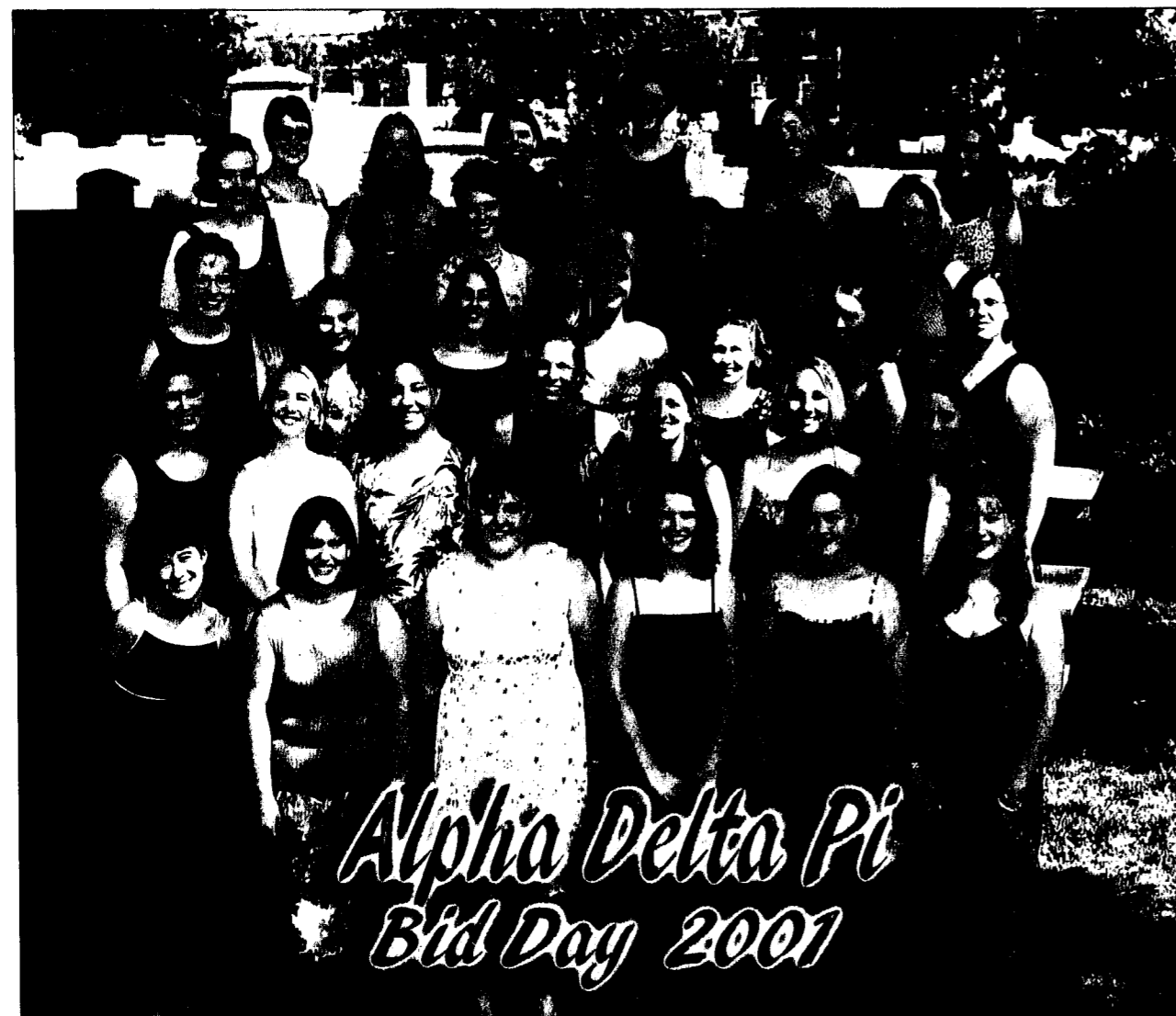
Campus sing was a major event that the participating members started preparing for 2

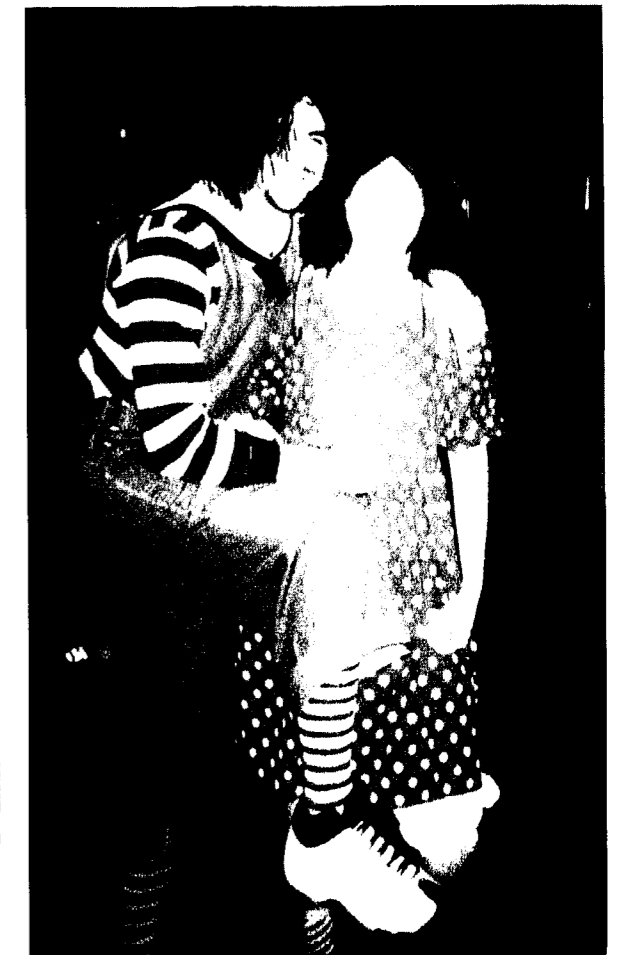

all the homecoming week events with their partners, the women of Zeta Tau Alpha.

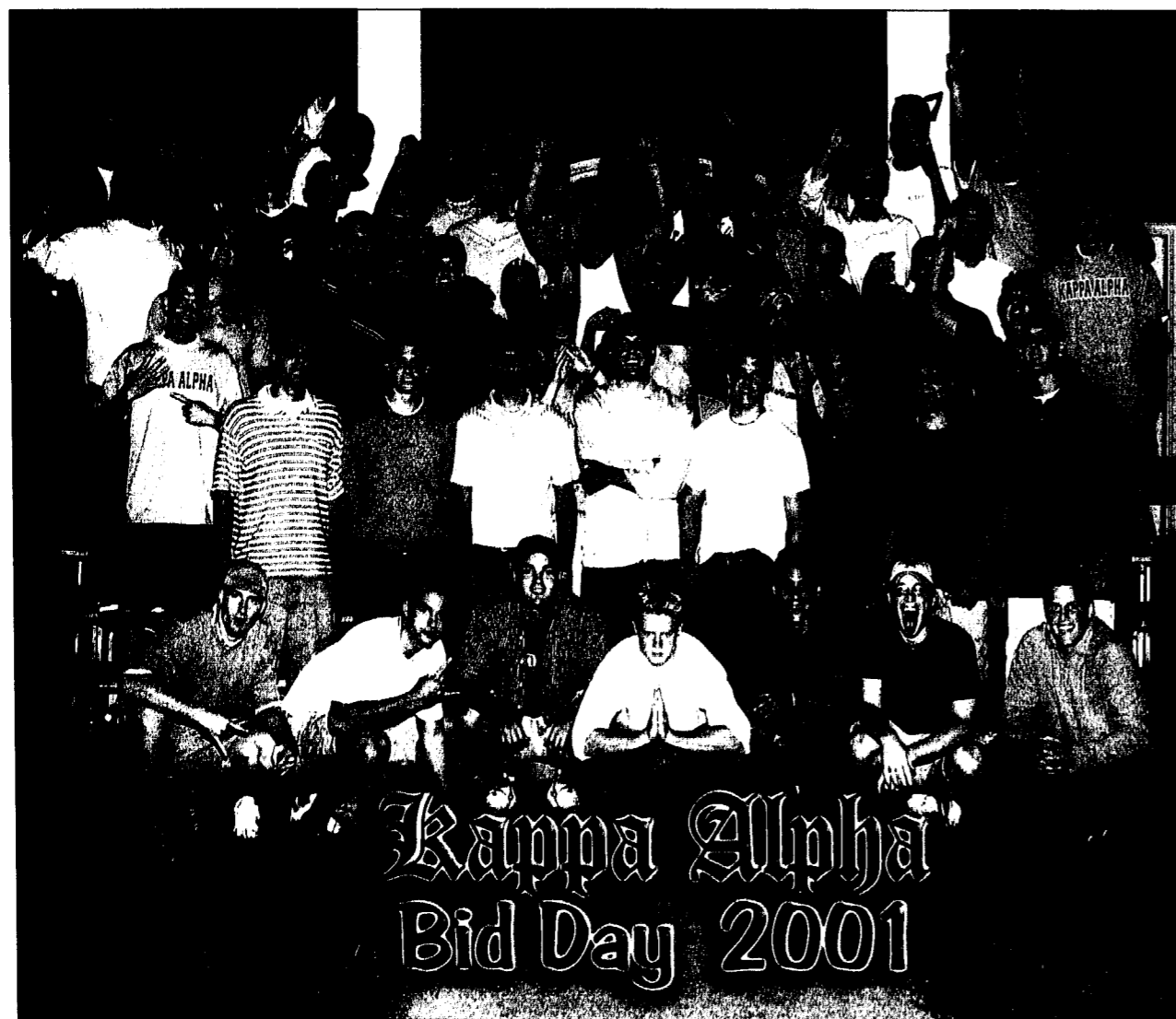

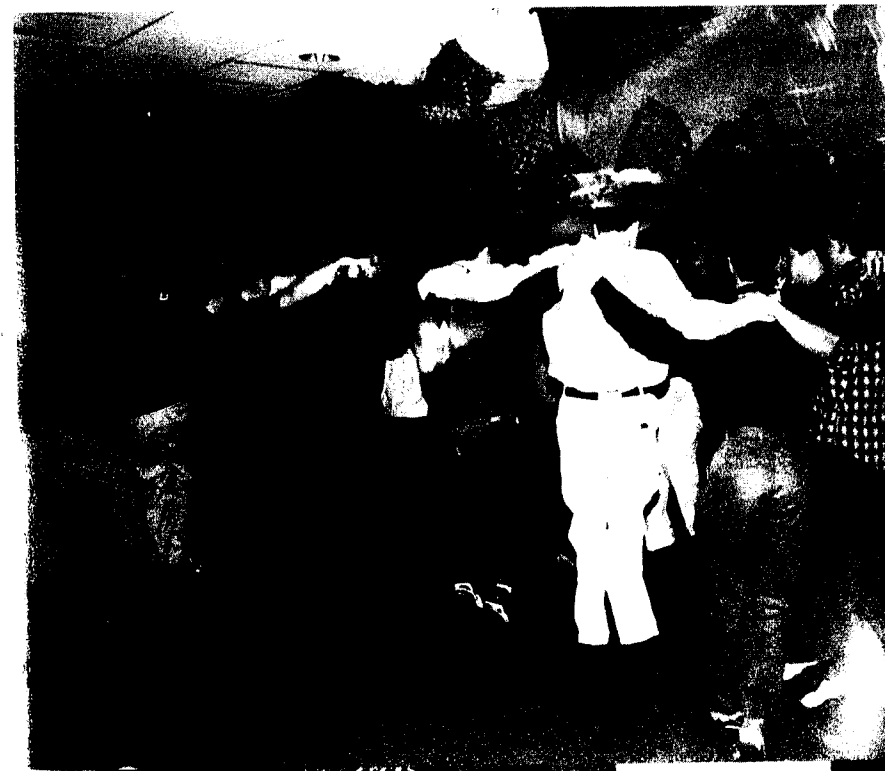
Lambda Chi Alpha

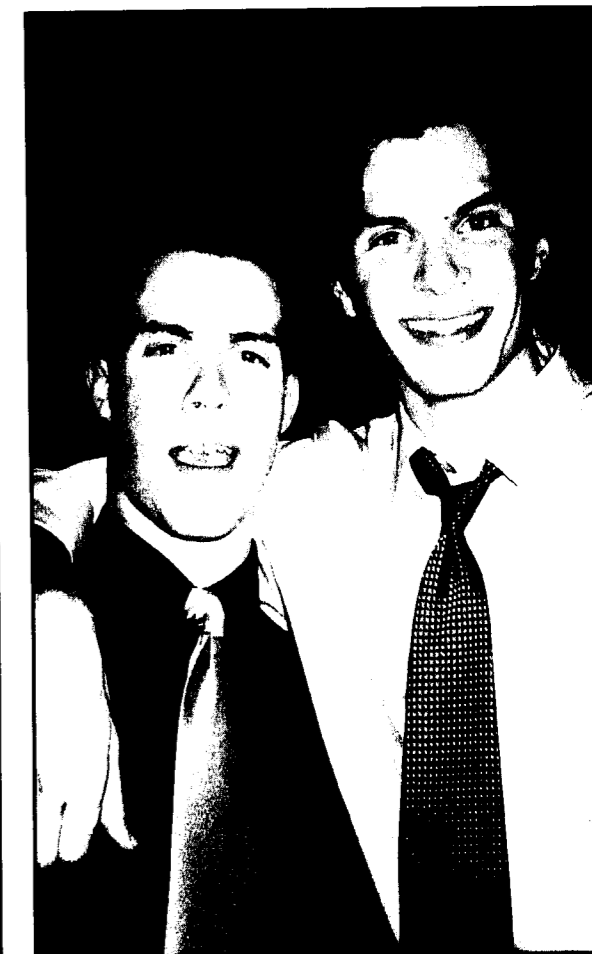


Phi Gamma Delta

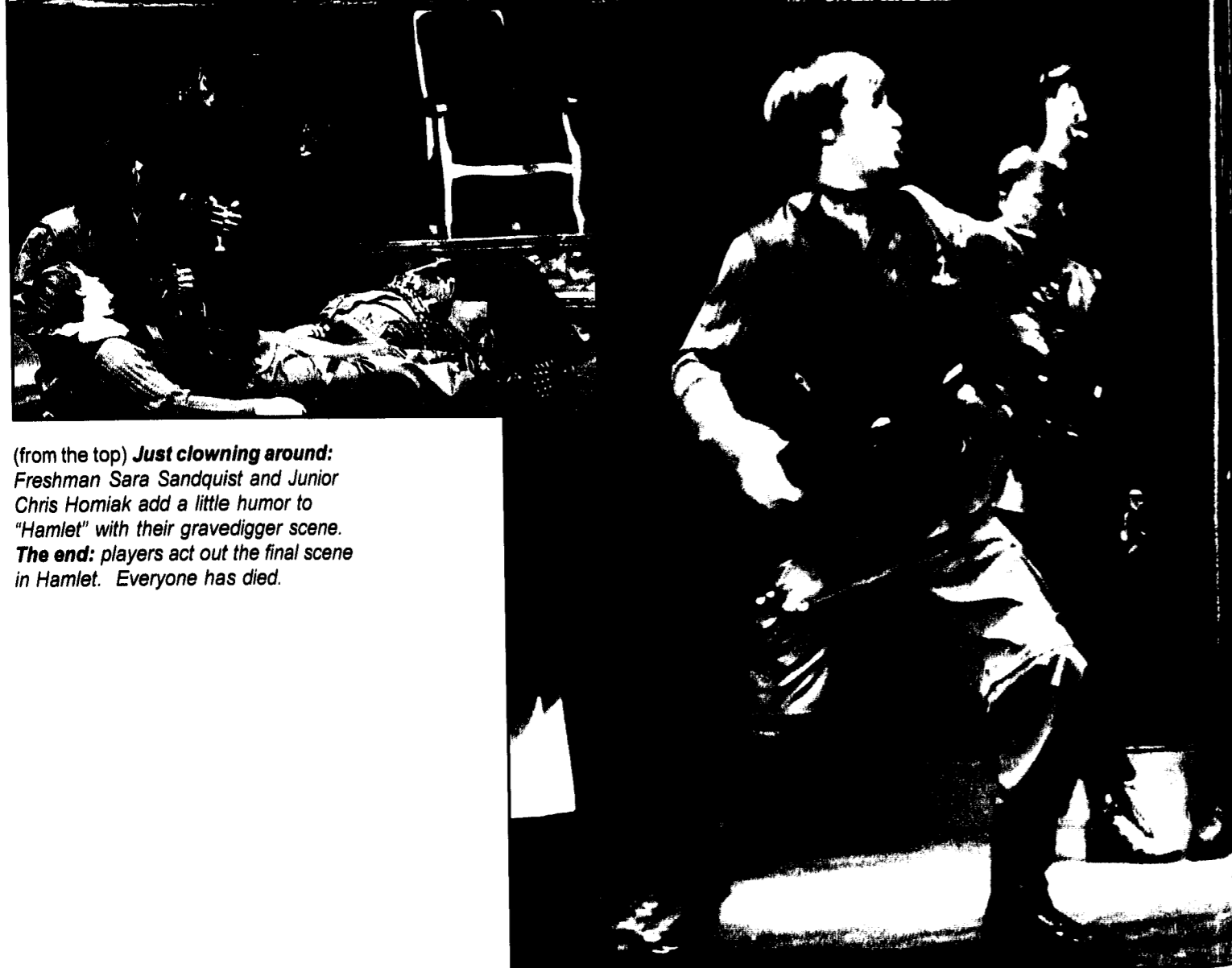

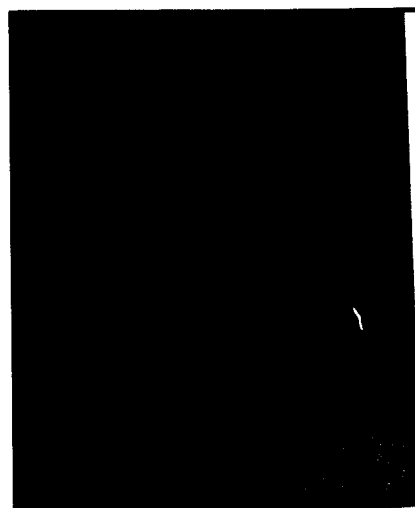
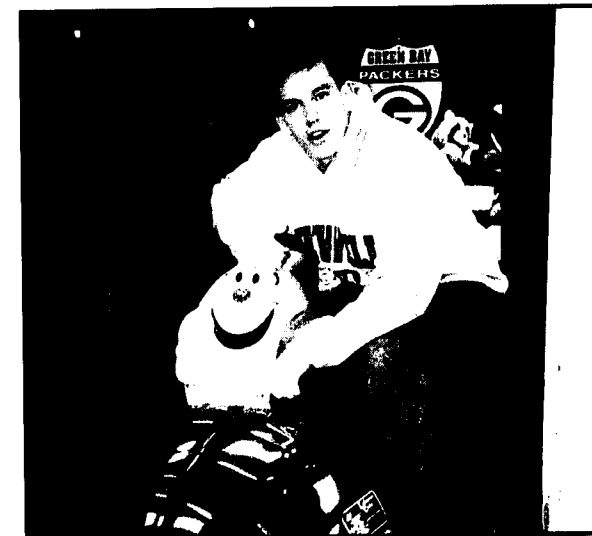
Who's the boss?

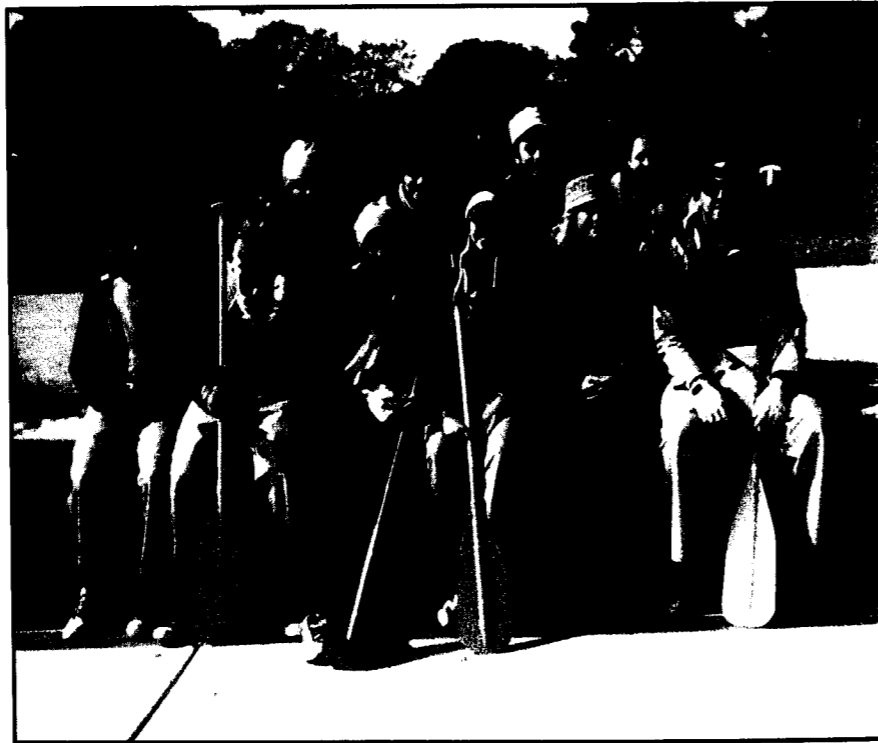

"I regard it as the foremost task of education to ensure survival of these qualities: an enterprising curiosity; an undefeatable spirit, tenacity in pursuit, readiness for sensible self-denial and above all, compassion." —Kurt Hahn, Founder of Outward Bound

These qualities are emphasized on Outward Bound, which is probably the most memorable element experienced as part of the Pryor Leadership Studies Program. Students begin the program with a semester-long class on leadership, in which they examine the meaning of leadership and the different types of leadership that exist. Then, on Outward Bound, they get to put into practice everything that they learned. They canoe through the Florida Everglades for two weeks and then perform a service project at the end, learning the importance of good leadership and teamwork in any and all situations, especially those that are unfamiliar. It is such a different experience than most

students are used to: one in which Gold Bond and bug nets become your most prized possessions, and the luxuries we are used to like showers and telephones and computers don't matter much when you are on the water trying to get through the Everglades in two weeks. The trip really helps students to take a step away from their everyday lives and see themselves as leaders with skills to develop and put into practice.

Once students return from Outward Bound, they complete two internships: a vocational internship related to their field of study and a volunteer internship. Then the final element of the program is the capstone, in which students come up with a legacy project that they will leave to the

community, raise the money for it, and complete the project. All of these elements combined serves to help students learn leadership skills and how to use them, so that once they leave Jewell, they will be effective and successful.

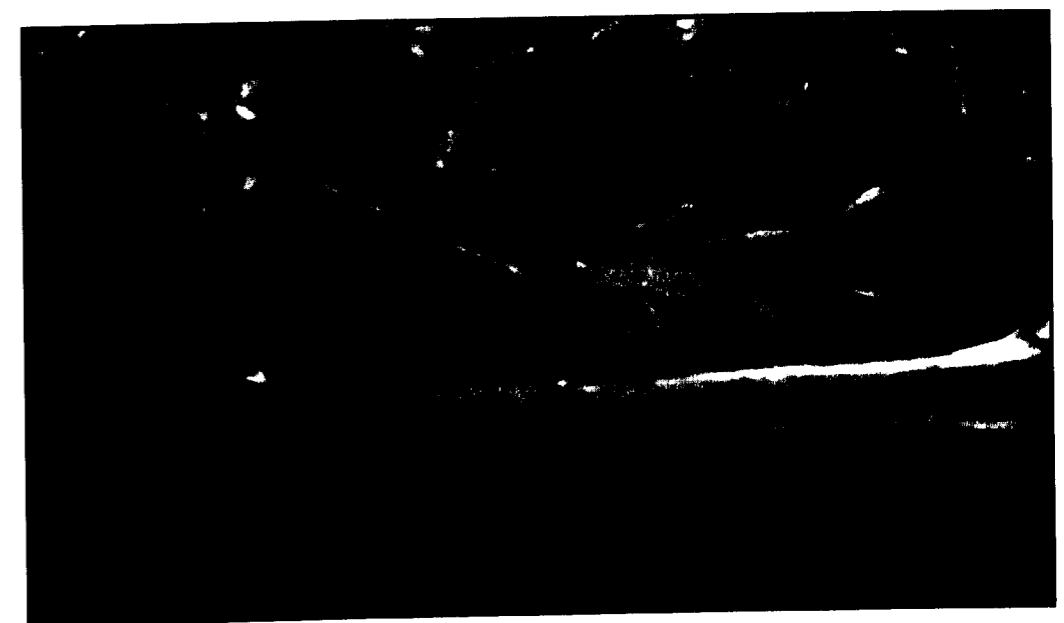

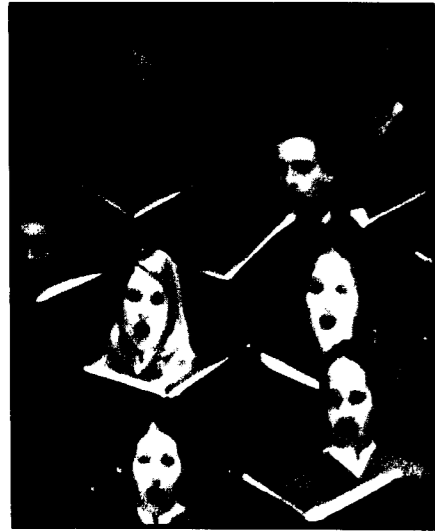

Concert Choir also provides music at many of the important events on and off campus such as the Achievement Day Dinner and special Chapel services.

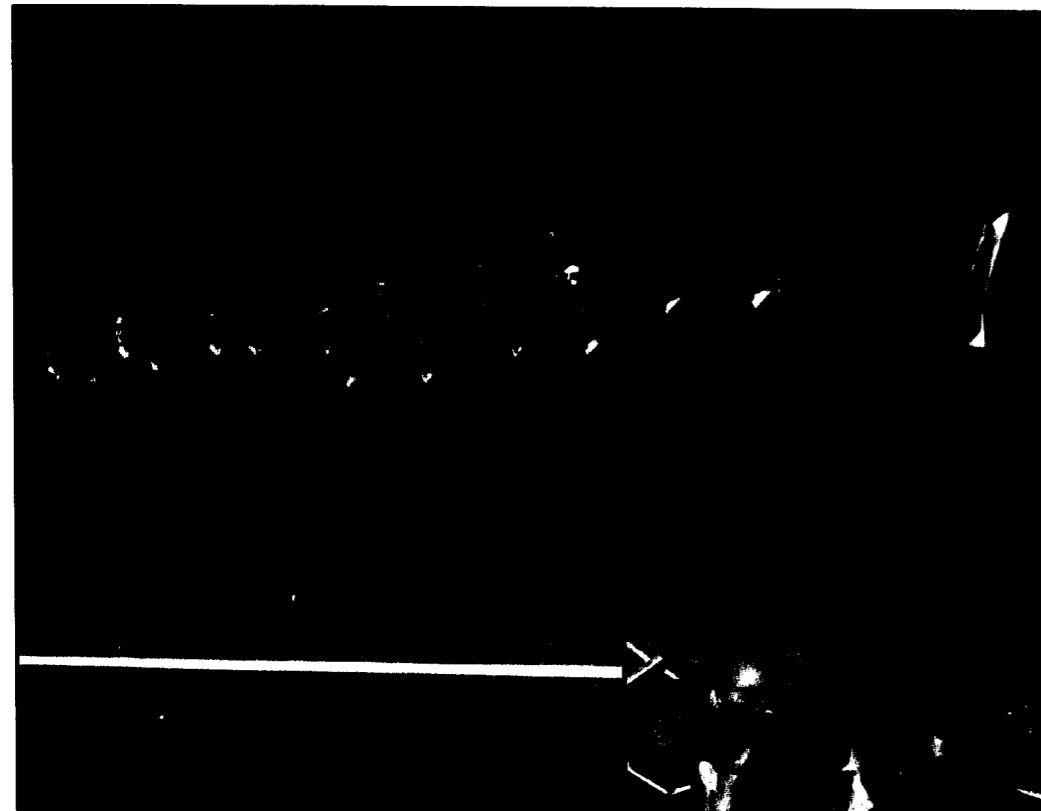
While many of the students involved in the music department are music majors there are a large number of non music major students who participate in the music organizations on campus.

William Jewell's music department gives students an opportunity to express themselves through music and share with fellow students and the world the talents which with they have been blessed.

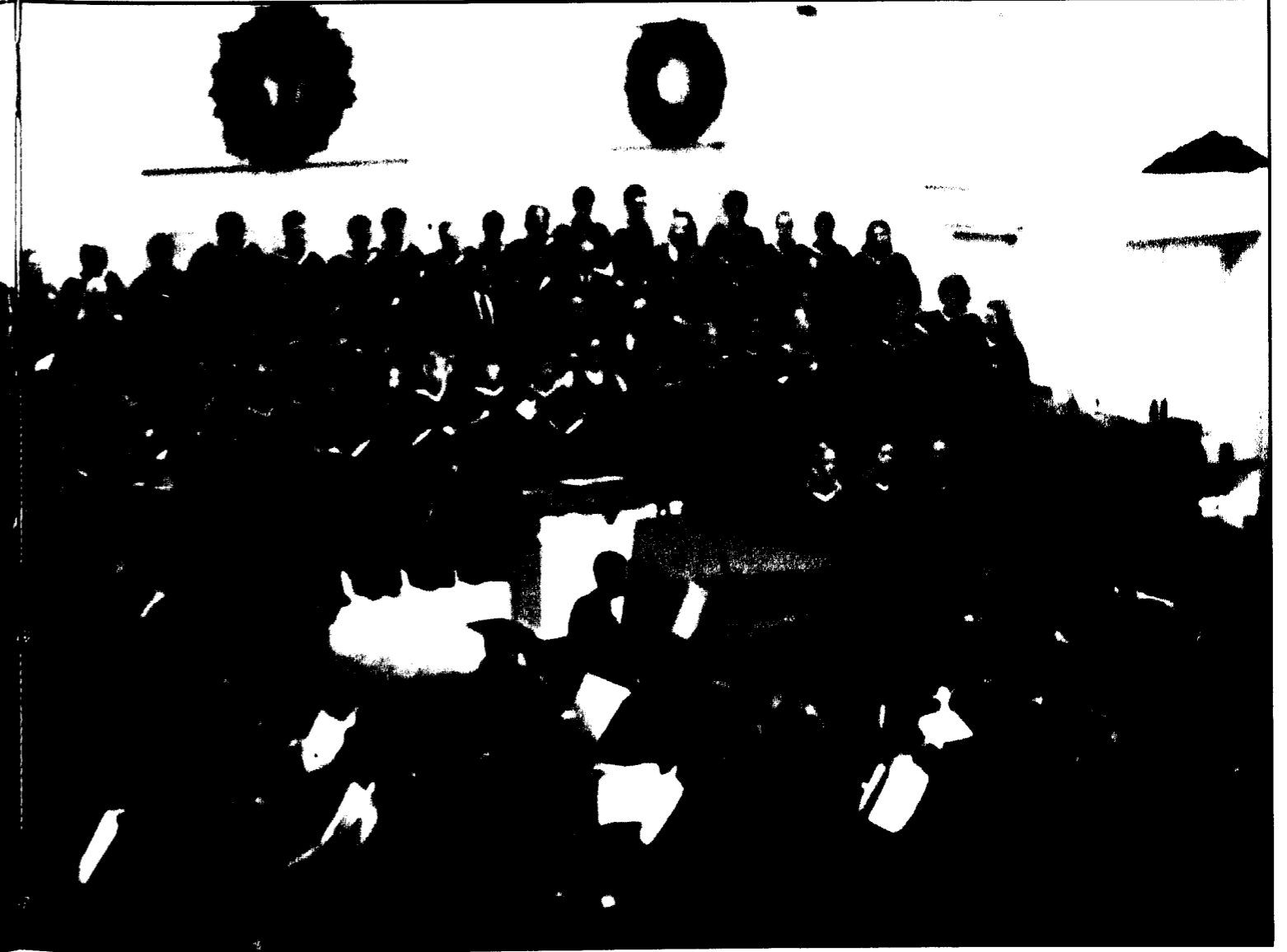
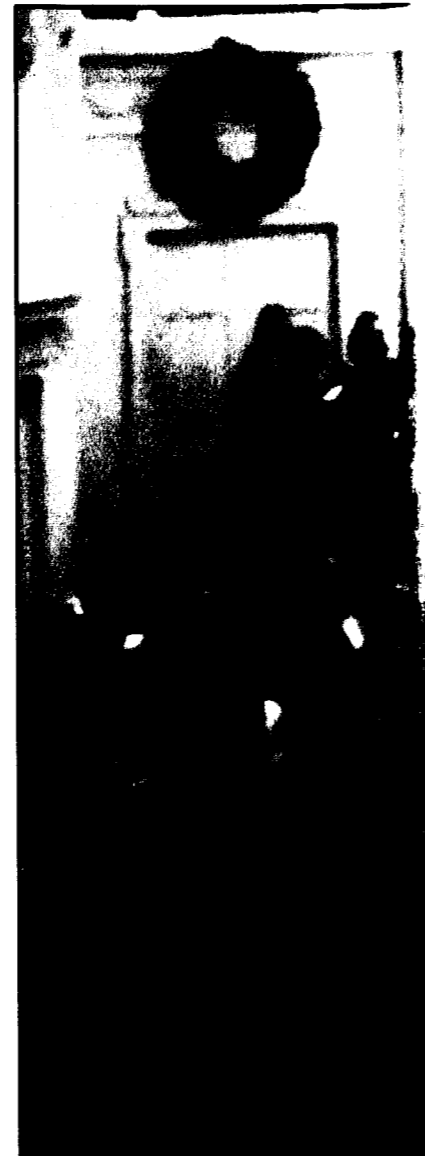

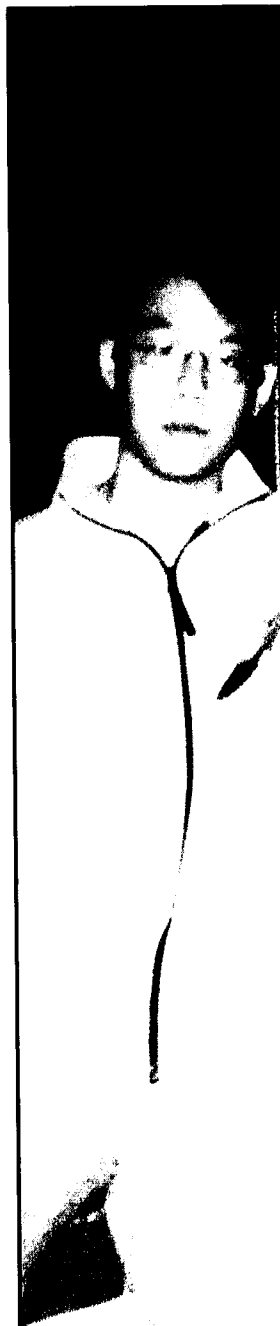
"Whaaat? Visitation policy? Whaaat? Matriculation? And what is that weird looking construction with ladders and ropes doing outside the dorm?"

Mid August, Lake of the Ozarks, Senate Encampment... That was where this all started. Senators spoke with select faculty and staff about the upcoming year: the changes, the ups, the downs and ideas for the campus. One topic struck me as VERY important: the TATLER. Why didn't we have one anymore? Was it possible to have one again? And then I spoke those three little words: "I'd do it!" And so it began: how to fundraise, where to begin and who to talk to.

Well, the money didn't really come in, the office didn't exist, and a staff was hard to come by. But there I was, signing a contract with Herff Jones to publish a TATLER for 2001-2002. I recruited a few photographers, got myself a faculty advisor and set to work with amazing intentions: half of which flopped MAJORLY.

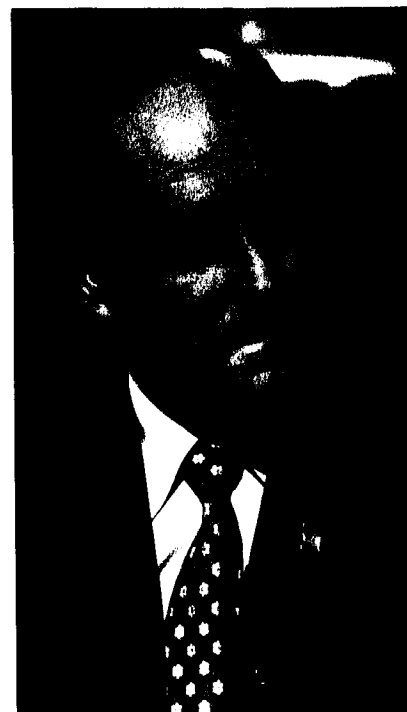
enduring FREEDOM

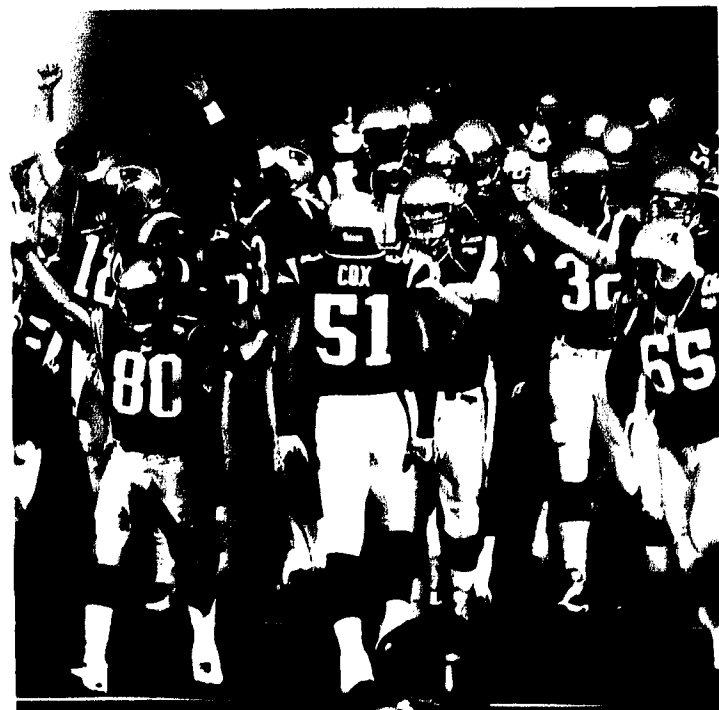
